#### Developing an Emergency Plan

Meet with family members to develop an emergency plan, and regularly conduct drills to practice your plan.

- > Become aware of emergency situations that can occur in your area.
- > Learn your community evacuation plan
- > Determine safe rooms to use for shelter
- > Post emergency phone numbers by the phone. During an emergency only use the phone if someone needs immediate assistance
- > Teach children their address and phone number.
- > Note special assistance needed by people with disabilities.
- Prepare for family health needs (medication, medical supplies, etc.)
- ➤ Plan not to leave pets behind. Locate a local shelter. Remember farm animals too.
- Learn basic CPR and First Aid
- Establish a meeting place if family is separated in an emergency.
- Find out school/daycares emergency procedures during severe weather.

#### Flooding

- > Tune into local radio stations
- > Stay away from flood waters,

## DO NOT attempt to walk, drive or swim through floodwaters.

- > If flood waters are high allow them to flow freely into basement.
- > Do not stack sandbags against house. This adds pressure and can cause damage.
- > Do not drink tap water.
- Move valuables to higher floors.




#### **Severe Weather** (Tornados)

Tornado **Watch**: A tornado watch or severe thunderstorm watch is issued whenever conditions exist for severe weather to develop. This is time for you to prepare. Tune into local radio or television for updates.

Tornado **Warning:** A tornado or severe thunderstorm warning is issued when a tornado or severe thunderstorm has been sighted or strongly indicated by radar. This is the time to take proper cover.

- Tune radio to local radio stations
- Stay indoors
- > Seek shelter in basement or in an interior room.
- > Stay away from windows, door, and outside walls.




#### **Winter Storms**

- > Tune radio into local radio station
- Stay indoors
- > Watch for signs of frostbite or hypothermia.
- > **DO NOT** over exert yourself while shoveling.
- > Do not leave home unless absolutely necessary.
- > Wear loose fitting clothes and layer them as needed.
- > If travel is absolutely necessary be sure to have an emergency car care kit with you
- > Do not use barbeques and kerosene laterns for indoor heating.

#### **Chemical Accidents**

The possibility of train derailment or transport truck accidents with the potential of chemical spills are a possible emergency in ( ); as well as the potential for factory fires.



#### If you are outside:

- > Stay upstream, uphill, and up wind hazardous materials can be quickly transported by water and wind
- Move so the wind is blowing left to right, not at your back or face.
- > Try to get at least a half mile from danger area.
- > Follow the instructions of local authorities.

#### If you are inside:

- > Tune your radio into local radio stations and be prepared to follow all instructions given by emergency staff.
- > To reduce the possibility of toxic fumes entering your home, seal all entry routes as efficiently as possible.
- -Close and lock all door, seal gaps under doorways with wet towels and duct tape,
- -Close all fireplace dampers, and turn off ventilations systems. (air, vents, and furnaces)
- Stay inside
- ➤ If you suspect vapors have entered your home, take shallow breaths
