By-law 2009-62

A By-law to authorize the execution of an Agreement for an Infrastructure Stimulus Fund Contribution Agreement

WHEREAS the Government of Canada has established a \$4 billion Infrastructure Stimulus Fund (ISF) under Canada's Economic Plan to mitigate against the impacts of the global economic recession by increasing the total amount of construction activity to projects that can start and be substantially completed in fiscal years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Ontario also recognizes the impacts of the global economic recession on the Province of Ontario and is actively mitigating against those impacts by increasing the total amount of construction activity to projects that can start and be substantially completed in fiscal years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011;

AND WHEREAS the purpose of the Infrastructure Stimulus Fund Contribution Agreement is directed at capital projects that involve moveable or non-moveable assets, constructed, rehabilitated, or improved, in whole or part;

AND WHEREAS the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Ontario, as represented by the Minister of Energy and Infrastructure and the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs wish to enter into an Infrastructure Stimulus Fund Contribution Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF AMHERSTBURG HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- An Agreement between the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Ontario, as represented by the Minister of Energy and Infrastructure and the Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs is attached hereto and is hereby approved and the Mayor and Chief Administrative Officer are hereby authorized to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Municipality.
- 2) This By-law shall come into force and take effect immediately upon the final passing thereof.
