The Mayor thanked Mr. Domagala for his dedication and wished him a long and healthy retirement. Mr. Domagala thanked the Mayor and Council for the opportunity to have worked for the Town and went on to say that he always had the interest of the Taxpayer in mind when performing the function of the Treasurer.

Also, Roberta (Bonnie) Gauthier was presented a certificate for being chosen as "The Shooting Federation of Canada's 1997 Official of the Year".

Mayor Hurst explained that the Certificates were a small token of appreciation from the residents of the Town. The accomplishments of these individuals speaks well both for their Association and the Community.

Mr. Rob Lovell Jr. of Web-Tech made a presentation to Council on the benefits of allowing his company to develop a Web Site for the Town. He explained that a Web Site was a great way to showcase the town and would have a positive impact on tourism. The cost of the service would depend on the content that is desired by the Town. Council thanked Mr. Lovell for the presentation.

Joan, Corrie & Shawna Fryer addressed Council on the Dog Control By-law. They maintained that to be under control, a dog should be leashed. They requested that the by-law be changed to require that dogs be leashed when off the property of their owner. Corrie Fryer related an incident in 1993 where she was attacked by a dog. Her life and the lives of those around her changed significantly because of her injuries. Also a petition in support of leashing dogs, with 571 signatures was left with the Council. Mayor Hurst thanked the Fryers for their presentation and stated that it was his desire that people act responsibly.

Frank & Sandy DiPasquale addressed Council with regard to the possibility of leasing the former Anderdon Municipal Building for the purpose of operating a daycare center. The programs that would be offered would complement the existing daycare center. Council thanked Mr. & Mrs. DiPasquale for their presentation.

Debby Pajot addressed Council with regard to the parking situation in the Downtown area. The Navy Yard and Gordon House development have eliminated parking spaces that have never been replaced. The previous Council had planned to form a Committee to study the situation but this did not happen. Mrs. Pajot finds that potential business is being discouraged because of the lack of parking. She also referred to the section of the Strategic Plan that recommended various possible solutions to alleviate the parking problem. Council was invited to take whatever time they had available to view the situation first hand by visiting the area. She asked that Council be part of the parking solution. Council thanked Mrs. Pajot for her presentation.




