Remo DiPaola of the Canadian Cancer Walkathon, to be held on October 12 from 12 noon to 4 p.m., gave Council a number of pledge cards for the walk. He urged everyone to participate in the walk. This area has a very high incidence of cancer and it is very important to raise money to combat the disease.

Mayor Hurst thanked Mr. DiPaolo for his attendance and urged all to get involved.

Debbie Meloche - Regarding a Dog Complaint

Mr. Meloche informed Council that Debbie no longer lived at his home and that the problems that existed between the neighbours have now been resolved.

Mayor Hurst stated that this matter has been brought to a close.

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Harold Kwasnicki - Regarding Malden Sewage Project. (There were approximately 100 residents present.

Mr. Kwasnicki spoke on behalf of the residents. He stated that there was a lack of information which then led to investigation by residents which was followed by rumours and innuendos. From the information that he was given a resident with a 60' lot would get a bill in the area of \$13,000 to \$16,000 and a 120' lot would be in the area of \$21,000 - \$26,485, and for a 150' lot the cost would range from \$25,268 to \$31,585. Some people cannot afford these amounts and will be forced to sell their home. Other municipalities seem to have received high grants on such projects.

Mayor Hurst explained that Council was waiting for an announcement on funding and has not made any commitments regarding the commencement of this project.

Mr. Kwasnicki then handed out a copy of his presentation. There were questions included in this text that he felt needed to be answered. Council felt that the announcement of the funding was necessary to come first and a public meeting would be held after that. Mayor Hurst explained to the people that we must look at a solution in cleaning the environment, however, Council was not here to bring hardship to anyone.
