Report from Bill King regarding adoption of Official Plan.

**PETITIONS & DEPUTATIONS:**

Lois Fiddy and Debra Anderson individually addressed Council on the meter reader hiring process.

Ms. Fiddy stated that she felt women and those having no relation to members of the selection committee were not given any consideration for the meter reader positions. She questioned if the selection committee was satisfied with the process. What were the criteria used and what was the roll of the Department Heads. How does heavy equipment operation meet with the requirements of the job. She felt that the competition was unjust.

Mrs. Anderson questioned why a person with 9 years experience in meter reading would not have been chosen for an interview. Also why was heavy equipment experience relative to the job. She felt something was wrong with the process. Why was the procedure for short listing changed from the recent Labourer-Operator hiring procedure. She indicated that she had spoken to a lawyer and the Human Rights Commission on the matter.

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Councillor Pillon stated that he did not discriminate in the process. The criteria used was residence in the Amherstburg area, education and qualifications. He questioned Ms. Anderson on her previous part time employment with the Township of Anderdon.

Charles and Wayne Crawford asked Council to review a bill that had been sent to them by the Public Works Department regarding a watermain that was recently installed to serve their property.

Carl Gibb, President of the Chamber of Commerce addressed Council regarding the H.M.S. Detroit being chosen for the Kaplan Award. Mr. Gibb gave a brief history of the award. The Kaplan Fund distributes the award to a group or organization deemed to have done the most to benefit the Great Lakes through improvements or preservation of natural, historical or recreational amenities. This is the first time an organization outside of the U.S. has won the award. An invitation was extended to the Mayor and members of Council to a reception at the Grosse Pointe Yacht Club on March 21, 1999. The invitation is also open to anyone in the community.


