Presentation #4 - Bellevue

Mr. John McDonald, Chairman of the Amherstburg Heritage Committee, made a presentation to Council regarding Bellevue. Mr. McDonald raised concerns with the security and maintenance of this historic building as well as the long term future and sustainability of the property. Mr. McDonald requested that Council consider appointing a Task Force to assist the property owners with securing funding from upper levels of government and support from the public for restoration of the property.

Presentation #1 - Smart Meters

Mr. Kevin Atkinson, Sewer and Watermain Superintendent made a presentation to Council regarding the Smart Meters Program. Mr. Atkinson expressed concern with respect to accessing customer data and indicated that the current arrangement with Essex Power is very cumbersome and inhibits timely reply to customer complaints. Mr. Atkinson indicated that an estimated \$1.3 million in capital assets would be required as a result of legislative changes.

That Council approve the Amherstburg Water Department to begin installation of Sensus Radio Frequency reading devices on all water meters with a legislated completion date prior to December 31st, 2010, enabling all water meters to be read without contracting or hiring of additional labour;

And further that Council direct Administration to report back on the feasibility of performing in-house the Billing and Collection of Water and Sewage.

Discussion:

Council asked for clarification regarding the legislative changes that will take place. Mr Atkinson explained that the province has mandated that Smart Metering take effect for electricity and this would impact our Water Meter Reading arrangements currently in place with Essex Power. Mr. Atkinson stated that once the new legislation is phased in, Amherstburg would be required to arrange for alternate arrangements with respect to Reading of Water Meters and incur additional expense. Mr. Atkinson suggested that this initiative could be a joint one with the Roads Department allowing for both budgets to share the expense. Council expressed concern regarding the capital investments required

as a result of this legislation and will address this under New Business. Council commended Mr. Atkinson on his pro-active approach to this issue and thanked him for this well researched presentation.

Presentation #2 - KNYP Landscaping

Mr. Tony DeThomasis, Roads and Parks Superintendent and Ms. Annette Zahaluk, Horticulture Lead Hand, made a presentation to Council regarding Kings' Navy Yard Park Landscaping and outlined work completed to date as well as provided ideas for future development and marketing of Amherstburg Parks. Mr. DeThomasis provided Council with a copy of a letter received from AA&M Rhododendron Committee which is attached to and forms a part of these minutes.

Verbal Report Regarding Road Configuration on Murray Street

Mr. Grondin provided a verbal report and indicated that some deviation from the typical road cross section is required on Murray Street due to the narrow road way. The following option was recommended:

- Wolfe St between Richmond and Murray St will be constructed as per the typical cross section which includes an 8.0 meter wide pavement surface complete with 1.5 meter wide sidewalks on each side of the street
- Wolfe St. from Murray St. to Gore St. will be constructed with an 8 meter wide asphalt surface complete with a 1.5 meter sidewalk on the east side of the road only
- Gore St. from Wolfe to Brock constructed with asphalt surface will be 8.0 meters at Wolfe St and taper to 7.0 meters at Brock Street
- The 1.5 meter wide sidewalk will be located on the south side of Gore
- The 1.5 meter sidewalk will be constructed on the north side from Brock Street to the St. John the Baptiste Church Parking Lot
- Murray Street from Wolfe to Victoria will be constructed with a 6.0 meter wide asphalt surface and a 1.5 meter wide sidewalk located on the north side only

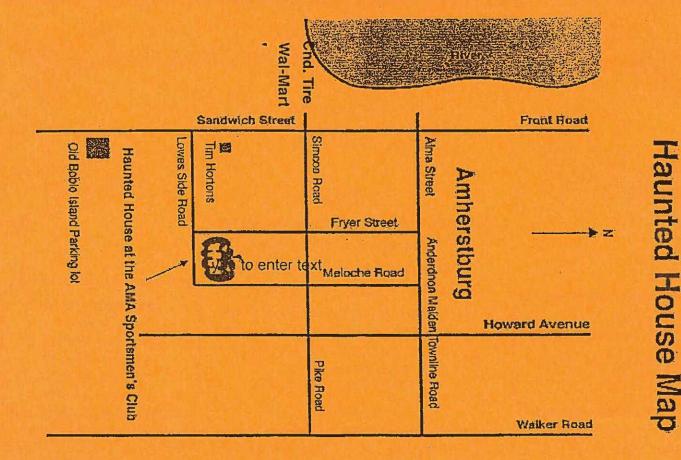
