REPORT:

The Town is in receipt of an application for Building Permit from Amico Design Build (Boblo Developments Inc.) for the construction of a single detached dwelling on Part 6 of Plan 12R-23659.

The Comprehensive Development Agreement Section 12(a) provides the following regarding the issuance of building permits:

"12. (a) Building Permits

The Developer covenants and agrees, on behalf of itself and its successors in title to any lot, not to apply for any building permit for the construction of any building on any lots covered by this Agreement until:

- (i) all of the Services relating to the lot for which a permit is being sought have been installed and initially accepted by the Town with the exception of the final asphalt surface course of the roadway;
- (ii) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Town's Development Manual which permits a maximum of four model homes or ten percent of the total dwelling units, whichever is lesser, the Developer will be allowed to construct a maximum of 10 model homes of various styles subject to meeting all other requirements of the Development Manual."

The services to the lot have not yet been completed, however the applicant would like to commence construction of the home in concert with the installation of services to take advantage of current weather conditions and timing.

The drawings have been reviewed, deemed complete and approved for issuance of the building permit subject to Council approval.


The Developer is also requesting approval of the street name for the development being River Walk Crescent.

Gravel Road Upgrading Program

Dear Sir:

As requested, we have carried out an investigation of the road base composition of the Town's remaining gravel roads and have prepared recommendations for upgrading the gravel roads including prime and double surface bituminous treatment. Our report follows.

Field Investigations

Golder Associates were retained to identify the composition and soil stratigraphy along the lengths of the existing gravel roads. Test pits were excavated with the Town's backhoe to permit the stratigraphy to be identified and samples of the granular basecourse materials were obtained at each test pit for laboratory testing. The Golder report, dated November 14, 2007 presents the results of their field and laboratory testing. A copy of the Golder report is appended to this report as Appendix A.

The test pits generally indicated granular thicknesses varying from 190mm to 725mm. the laboratory testing of the granular materials was based on the Ontario Provincial Standard Specification Form 1010 for Granular 'A' Materials. The laboratory work indicated that the samples were generally "finer" than permitted within this specification and therefore did not meet this standard.

Recommended Program

Based on the results of the geotechnical investigations, we have prepared a summary table (Table 1) which identifies the recommended depth for additional granular material before the prime and double surface treatment can be completed.

In general, where existing granular thicknesses are near or exceed 300mm, we are recommending an additional 100mm "topping" prior to surfacing. Where granular thicknesses are 200mm or less, we are recommending a minimum 150mm "topping" prior to surfacing. The "topping" should be granular material which meets the requirements of OPSS Form 1010. This properly graded material will improve subbase drainage and add to the structural carrying capacity of the roadway.

Using local construction costs, we estimate that the Town will have to spend \$2,553,625.00 (excl. GST) to upgrade all their gravel roads to prime and double surface treatment.
