The presentation is attached to and forms a part of these minutes. Ms. Croucher introduced the Administration and Board of the United Communities Credit Union. President and CAO John made a presentation to Council regarding United Communities Credit Union. The presentation is attached to and forms a part of these minutes. Mr. Michael Lavoie, Executive VP and CFO, made a presentation to Council regarding United Communities Credit Union's Commitment to the region and look forward to seeing the United Communities Credit Union name on the Recreation Complex.

Mayor Hurst thanked Mr. and Mr. Lavoie for their presentation and commitment in support of this project. Mayor Hurst stated that the United Communities Credit Union is known for "giving back' to the communities that the branches serve – their involvement and 2010 award from the United Way is just one example.

Mayor Hurst also provided Council and those in attendance with the following information:

- This complex project would not be possible without the perseverance and dedication of the Stakeholder Groups, Ratepayers and Council and the support of our Provincial and Federal partners. Our thanks go out to Bruce Crozier, MPP and Jeff Watson, MP.
- The provincial, federal and municipal contributions each amount to \$7.86 million and the Town's contribution will be offset by our Fundraising efforts.
- Ontario Premier Dalton McGuinty and Federal Minister John Baird were in Amherstburg in February 2009 to make the funding announcement and since that time a tremendous effort has been made to bring this Community a first class facility that will serve generations.
- United Communities Credit Union has met the price tag the Town was seeking for the "Naming" Opportunity and the \$500,000 donation payable in one lump sum up front will provide the United Communities Credit Union for 40 years of Naming. This "Naming" Opportunity will serve to promote both United Communities and the Facility for 40 years to come.

# 6.1 Delegation # 1

Mr. Sam Sleiman addressed Council regarding the construction on Dalhousie Street. Mr. Sleiman stated that the newly created sidewalk is that all wires on Dalhousie Street would have them all be underground. There are only certain hydro poles from Bellevue House to Pickering will be removed. Mr. Sleiman provided Council with a petition and pictures of the sidewalk and poles in the middle of the sidewalk for their review.

Lou Zarlenga stated that the comments by Mr. Sleiman are 100% accurate. Mr. Zarlenga advised all that the entire project is on schedule. On August 13, 2010 a report was provided to Council to hire a contractor and the costs for relocation Hydro One wires at a cost of \$400,000 plus. Underground ducts have been provided for all utilities to relocate and Hydro One has not provided the Town's enough detail to ease the Town's comfort but have not provided us with the schedule of removing 5 poles and an application has been placed before Hydro One for a relocation study and they have not provided us with details to date. Hydro One persists in requesting that they update poles with new poles and the Town has stated that that will not be acceptable.

Mayor Hurst asked that Mr. Sleiman provide the petition to Hydro One.

Councillor Fryer asked when the last communication occurred between Hydro One and Mr. Zarlenga. Mr. Zarlenga stated that he is in contact with Hydro One every other day.

Councillor Wark moved, Councillor Sutton seconded:

That Council direct Administration to contact Hydro One in order to set up a meeting with Council.

Councillor White thanked Mr. Grimaldi and Ms. Durocher for their comments and work on the Parade.

Councillor Pillon thanked the volunteers and the individuals that work directly with the Windsor Parade Corporation that have made this event a success.

Mayor Hurst thanked the Windsor Parade Corporation for their efforts and stated that we wait with great expectation for another wonderful parade.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

That Council receive the report from Lou Zarlenga regarding the request to supply concrete curb and gutter constructed in 2010 to the proposed new entrance off Meloche Rd. to the Recreation Complex.

And further that funds of \$18,000.00 be pre-approved for a 2011 project to construct the Arena entrance road off Meloche Rd.

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

This report deals with a follow up to the verbal report to Council made by Lou Zarlenga at the October 21, 2010 Special Council Meeting with the intent of adding concrete curb and gutter to the original motion of Council from the October 21, 2010 Special Meeting "And further that Council pre-approve the expenditure of \$20,000 for placement of base asphalt for phase 2, being the easterly arena entrance road off of Meloche Road, from the 2011 Capital Roads Budget"

### **REPORT:**

At the October 21, 2010 Special Council Meeting the undersigned explained the need to reconstruct Meloche Rd. to accommodate the anticipated traffic flow to and from the new Arena Complex. It was further explained that a dedicated entrance road into the Arena site from Meloche Rd. would be necessary to control vehicular traffic in an East/West direction. It was further explained that PWD would be proposing a 3 phase construction project for 2011 & 2012 consisting of the following:

- A) Phase 1 Reconstruct Meloche Rd. from Simcoe St. to the South limit of the original Larry Bauer Complex, being 630 meters in length. The estimated cost of this work was reported to be approximately \$1,110,000.00.
- B) Phase 2 Construct new entrance road to Arena from Meloche Rd. approximately 265 meters in length consisting of existing stone base, new asphalt surface, concrete curb and gutters, storm drainage with catch waterbasins and connections to existing storm drain on North side of existing entrance road, boulevard restoration and decorative street lighting. The estimated cost of this work was reported to be approximately \$390,000.00.
- C) Phase 3 Reconstruct Meloche Rd. from South limit of Larry Bauer Complex to Lowes Side Road, being 660 meters in length. The estimated cost of this work was reported to be approximately \$1,190,000.00.

At the October 21, 2010 Special Council Meeting, approval was received for \$20,000.00 for placement of base course asphalt.

Recently, Administration at the Parks and Recreation Dept. requested the undersigned to review the potential and cost of installing curbs and gutters this year to facilitate traffic flow and boulevard restoration. Accordingly, PWD has obtained from a Contractor presently working the Town's Infrastructure and finds the cost of accommodating this request to be approximately \$18,000.00. The undersigned agrees with the Parks and Rec Administration the early replacement of curbs and gutters would enhance the traffic control as well as safety and enhance vehicle containment.

Further it is intended that the existing granular base course for the entrance road be augmented with additional stone with an approximate cost of \$12,000.00 which would be funded from the existing 2010 stone budget (\$135,000 budgeted and currently \$79,000 utilized). Further it is intended to provide street lighting on the new Arena entrance road and on Meloche Rd. from Simcoe St. to south limits of previous Larry Bauer Complex with an approximate cost of \$70,000.00 which would be financed from a \$79,000.00 fund for entrance lighting provided by Max DeAngelis.
