10.4 OVEL Football Tenant at the United Communities Credit Union Complex

Dean Colver, Glen Mills and Joe Milnarc, Essex County Ravens Football Club addressed Council with regard to entering into an agreement with the Town.

In response to a question of Council, it was noted that Administration would provide Council with a plan on how to finance the \$50,000 grandstand.

Councilor Pilton moved, Councilor Sutton seconded:

That the report submitted by Dean Colver dated December 21, 2012 regarding the Essex County Ravens Football Club seeking to come to Amherstburg be received;

That Council approve a 10-year agreement with the Essex County Ravens Football Club subject to this document being reviewed by the Town's legal counsel;

That Council approve the proposed annual fee of \$20,000 per year for each year of a 10-year contract and covering use of the indoor turf field (approximately 171 hours per year) and the outdoor turf field (approximately 212 hours per year) for practice, player development and games;

That Council approve the installation of the Essex County Ravens Football Club as a tenant of the United Communities Credit Union Complex including dressing room, training area, therapy room and storage for the details outlined in this report;

That Council approve the construction of a 1000-seat grandstand overlooking the outdoor turf field, subject to the successful execution of the aforementioned 10-year agreement, and turf fees from the first 5 years of the agreement being directed to offsetting the expense of building the grandstand;

That Council approve the balance of funds required to build the 1000-seat grandstand, to a maximum cost of \$50,000;

That Council recognize the need for additional upgrades to the outdoor turf field in the form of hash marks, two 35-yard lines and two 45-yard lines, such expense not to exceed \$10,000;

And further that Council authorize Administration to continue discussions regarding the installation of Cogeco broadcast amenities at the United Community Credit Union Complex and bring a report back to Council regarding same.
