The Chief Administrative Officer advised that it is the developer's responsibility to ensure the roads are bring cleaned to the Town's standards and a letter is currently being drafted to all builders with respect to the cleanliness of the roads, and further, that their indemnity deposit will be used if necessary.

The Director of Engineering and Public Works advised that Texas Road is considered a collector road and trucks are permitted to use it as it designed for tuck use.

6. Councillor Courtney advised of a new business, Amherstburg Cannabis Company, and asked if here was anything in place to protect Amherstburg's name and how it's used.

The Chief Administrative Officer advised that he will investigate and get back to Council via email.
