

Amherstburg Town Council, and Administration must be recognized, commended, and thanked for leading our community, for making tough sound decisions, and for moving Amherstburg forward. It was through Orland's dedication and leadership that resulted in the construction of the Verdi Club on land donated by Mr. Dan Rosati.

Armand went on to become our first lawyer, and I will always remember how he was met with rejection, being told by his piers he did not belong! Rather than folding Armand became one of the leading lawyers of Windsor Essex County, and among other accomplishments, a contributing factor to the creation of the Amherstburg Black Historical Museum. It is only fitting that a park be named DeLuca Park to honour these men and their families with their sister Betty, and Orland's grandson Mikey professional goal tender for the Vancouver Canucks. (I'm sure Betty and Mike have some words to share ⓒ) I am also asking for council's blessing to erect a statue in Navy Yard Park funded privately depicting a father walking with suitcase in hand, his child clinging on his pants begging him to stay. The father will head to the new world to work until he has enough money to send for his family.

#### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

1. The report from the Treasurer and the Director of Corporate Services dated March 23, 2021 regarding 2020 Budget - PSAB Compliant (O. Reg. 284/09) **BE ADOPTED.** 

#### 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

Ontario municipalities are required to present the annual financial statements on the basis compliant with Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) principles for full accrual accounting, including disclosure of a PSAB compliant budget. This report outlines conversion of the Town's cash based budget, used to derive the municipal tax levy, to a PSAB compliant budget for disclosure in the financial statements.

The municipality is not required to include the following in its annual cash based budget:

- amortization of capital assets,
- post-employment benefits and
- solid waste landfill closure and post-closure costs.

Section 2(1) O. Reg.284/09 states that the municipality shall prepare and adopt a report about the excluded expenses before adopting a budget for the year.

Each year Council considers a budget that has been prepared on a cash basis including the amount required to purchase or construct capital assets and to make annual payments on long term debt. The O. Reg.284/09 requires that a reconciliation be done between the cash based budget and the PSAB compliant budget disclosed in the municipal financial statements.

In the past the Town of Amherstburg has not disclosed budget figures on the financial statements, but has instead made the following financial statement note disclosure.

#### "Budgeted figures:

Budgeted figures have been excluded on the consolidated statement of financial activities as they may not be directly comparable to the actual figures due to the requirement to accrue certain expenses in accordance with PSAB reporting requirements. The Town does not, in many cases, include these amounts in the annual budget as they do not require immediate funding. Additionally, budgets relating to tangible capital asset purchases have been excluded on the consolidated statement of financial activities, as they may not be comparable to actual results."

#### 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

Starting with the year end December 31, 2020 budget figures will be disclosed in the Town's financial statements. To facilitate that disclosure, this report recommends adoption of the report to support the adjustments to derive the PSAB compliant budget for 2020 the budget year. A report on the 2021 PSAB compliant budget will also be presented for Council's adoption at a future meeting

Going forward, starting for the 2022 budget year, Administration will present a PSAB compliant budget to Council at the time the Town's budget is considered for final adoption, following budget deliberations each year.

The attached schedule outlines the differences required from rates (taxation, water and wastewater) if the cash based budget were converted to a PSAB compliant basis for 2020. Under this conversion, no reserve, capital or principal on long-term debt amounts are included; however, amortization of capital assets and interest on long-term debt are included.

The converted 2020 budget shows net surpluses for water and wastewater rate funded areas, while a net deficit results for the converted tax rate funded budget.

The calculated surpluses/deficits in the PSAB based budgets do not mean that the tax and user rates are too high or too low, as the PSAB based budgets do not reflect the actual cash the Town needs to pay for capital expenditures and debt payments. The Town is obligated under the Municipal Act to adopt a balanced budget, the cash based budget, which includes collecting enough cash each year to fund its expenditures.

#### Amortization

Amortization represents the using up of assets over their estimated useful life. Each year the historical value of the Town's tangible capital assets is reported in the Annual Financial Statements, less amortization to date. Throughout the asset's useful life amortization increases to the point that the amortization equals the historical cost of the asset, which is at the end of its useful life. Amortization does not represent the replacement cost of tangible capital assets and does not take into consideration inflation, changes in legislative requirements, service delivery standards, market prices, etc.

The Town does not include amortization expense in the cash based budget, but it does include amounts for reserves (such as asset lifecycle reserves) and capital costs for replacement of the assets. To achieve a fully funded asset replacement lifecycle model, annual cash based budgets would include lifecycle reserve transfers to replace assets at their estimated replacement value. Currently, the amounts raised for lifecycle and other direct capital purchases do not fully provide for the replacement cost of existing assets.

#### **Post-Employment Benefits**

Only the current year's estimated expense for post-employment (retiree) benefit expense (\$421,570 for 2020) is included in the 2020 cash based budget.

The estimated total liability for post-employment benefits at the end of December 31, 2019 was approximately \$17,621,700. A post-employment benefits valuation adjustment of \$262,500 was made in 2019 and is the basis for the estimated amounts in the reconciliation for 2020.

There is currently no reserve fund for post employment benefits. If Council's intention is to fully fund the estimated cost of post-employment benefits and to use this reserve fund to do so, then future budgets should include transfers a reserve fund for this purpose. At a minimum, the current year expected payment for existing retiree benefits plus an estimate of the increase in liability is included in annual budgets. The 2020 cash based budget includes the estimated expense for current retiree benefits, but makes no provision to create a reserve fund for future liability.

#### Solid Waste Landfill and Post-Closure Costs

Solid waste landfill closure costs deal with the ongoing costs of maintaining the closed landfill. There is no legislated authority requiring a Municipality to fully fund these costs. The Town of Amherstburg does not have such a site within its municipal boundaries. And as such has made not provision in the cash based budget.

### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

1. **By-law 2021-026** being a by-law authorizing the execution of the Agreement between the Town of Amherstburg and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Ontario as represented by the Minister of Community Safety and Correctional Services be taken as having been read three times, and finally passed and the Mayor and Clerk **BE AUTHORIZED** to sign same.

## 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

The current agreement under the Court Security and Prisoner Transportation Program expired on the December 31, 2020. On March 31, 2021 Administration received confirmation that the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services (Ministry) will be continuing this important initiative.

In their correspondence, the Province of Ontario advises that they:

"...We are pleased to inform you that we will be proceeding with the Court Security and Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) Program for 2021, providing a maximum total of \$125M to assist municipalities in offsetting their CSPT costs."

Similar to previous years, an expenditure-based model is used to determine the amount of 2021 Funding advances, which are allocated based on each municipality's relative share of the total 2019 CSPT costs across the province. For example, if a municipality's CSPT cost represents 1% of the total provincial CSPT cost, then it will be allocated 1% of the available funding.

# 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

Prior to 2019, the Court Security Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) Program Grant Agreement was between the Ministry and the Police Services Board. However, starting in 2019 the Agreement has been between the Ministry and the Municipality; therefore, approval is now requested from Council to execute the Agreement.

The Agreement term is January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 and provides maximum funding of \$55,699 which will be remitted to the Town in four installments. Services required under the Agreement are as follows:

"The Recipient is responsible for the costs of providing security for court premises during hours of court operations and security of persons attending court, and/or the costs of transporting prisoners and custodial minors (i.e. persons between twelve and seventeen years of age) between correctional institutions, custodial facilities and court locations for the purposes of court attendance."

The delivery of the services under the Agreement is the responsibility of the Town and the Town purchases those services under contract from the Windsor Police Service (WPS).

As part of the service agreement, WPS will deliver and track the services and they will provide the required information on those services to the Town in order to facilitate the Town's reporting requirements under the Agreement; which must be filed prior to April 15, 2022.

These grant funds are part of the contract with Windsor Police and part of the annual grant statements reconciliation in Article 8 of the Agreement with Windsor Police Services as outlined below:

### Article 8 - Revenue from Service

8.1 The parties acknowledge that the Intermunicipal Court Services Agreement will continue to govern the cost and revenue sharing matters more particularly described in the Intermunicipal Court Services Agreement and nothing in this Agreement is intended to amend or otherwise affect the Town's rights and obligations under the Intermunicipal Court Services Agreement.

8.2 All grant monies received by the Police Service to be used in conjunction with the Amherstburg Detachment of the Police Service shall be delineated in an annual grant statement issued to the Town. Each party shall act cooperatively to apply for any applicable grants that may benefit the Amherstburg Detachment of the Police Service.

Further to which the WPS will provide information required for the 2021 annual filing requirements, as outlined in the agreement, prior to April 15, 2022.

# 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

There is potential financial risk if the municipality does not enter into the agreement as provincial grant funding forms part of the contract with Windsor Police Services.

# 5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

The 2021 CSPT funding will be a maximum of \$55,698.84 and will be paid to the Town in four instalments. Under the Agreement, funding is to be held in an interest bearing account; both funding and interest thereon may be repayable to the Province of Ontario subject to demonstrating use of the funding and, for any interest earned, at their request. The funds will be retained in an interest bearing obligatory reserve fund until they are dispersed to WPS based on the cost of eligible services provided.

Under the WPS agreement, this funding will be payable to WPS from the Town for services rendered. As the CSPT funding was not announced for 2021 at the time of 2021 Budget development, the Town's 2021 Budget does not include revenue from this funding program nor an expense for remittance of the funds to WPS. The transfer payment funding will be reflected as revenue of the Town, fully offset by the expense for payment of the funds to WPS for provision of the related services. There is no net impact on the Town's finances as a result of these transactions.

# 6. <u>CONSULTATIONS</u>:

None.

# 7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>:

It is recommended that the Ontario Transfer Payment Agreement be executed for CSPT Program Funding for the period January 1 through December 31, 2021.

We are pleased to inform you that we will be proceeding with the Court Security and Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) Program for 2021, providing a maximum total of \$125M to assist municipalities in offsetting their CSPT costs.

As you may know, in September 2020, the Ministry of the Solicitor General (ministry) hired an independent consultant, Goss Gilroy Inc., to conduct a review of court security and prisoner transportation in Ontario, including the design of the CSPT Program. This review is part of the ministry's ongoing work to reduce court delays, leverage technology and improve public safety to build a more responsive and efficient justice system. Municipalities, police services and other justice sector partners were engaged during the review process. The ministry will be reviewing findings and recommendations in the final report which is expected soon. Please note that no changes were made to the 2021 CSPT Program as a result of the review.

Similar to previous years, an expenditure-based model is used to determine allocation for 2021. Funding is allocated based on each municipality's relative share of the total 2019 CSPT cost across the province. For example, if a municipality's CSPT cost represents one per cent of the total provincial CSPT cost, then it will be allocated one per cent of the available funding. With that, subject to the enclosed agreement being finalized, your allocation for 2021 is **\$55,698.84**. The payment schedule is outlined under Schedule D of the enclosed agreement.

### By-law authorizing the execution of an agreement between the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Ontario as represented by the Solicitor General with respect to Court Security and Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) Program Funding

**WHEREAS** under Section 8 of the Municipal Act 2001, S.O., 2001, c. 25, as amended, a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under this or any other Act;

**AND WHEREAS** under Section 9(1) (a) and (b) of the Municipal Act 2001, S.O., 2001, c. 25, as amended, Section 8 shall be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on municipalities to enable them to govern their affairs as they consider appropriate and to enhance their ability to respond to municipal issues;

**AND WHEREAS** the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg deems it expedient to enter into an agreement between the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Ontario as represented by the Solicitor General with respect to Court Security and Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) Program Funding;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg enacts as follows:

- 1. That the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg agrees to enter into the agreement as attached hereto as Schedule "A" to this By-law.
- 2. That the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign and seal said agreement on behalf of The Corporation of Town of Amherstburg.
- 3. This By-law shall come into force and take effect immediately upon the final passing thereof.

### **ONTARIO TRANSFER PAYMENT AGREEMENT**

THE AGREEMENT is effective as of the 1st day of January, 2021

### BETWEEN:

Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario as represented by the Solicitor General

(the "Province")

- and -

Town of Amherstburg

(the "Recipient")

### BACKGROUND

- A. The Province implemented the Court Security and Prisoner Transportation (CSPT) Program (the "Program") in 2012 to assist municipalities in offsetting their costs of providing CSPT services in their jurisdictions;
- B. The Province will upload CSPT costs from municipalities to a maximum of \$125 million in 2021;
- C. The Recipient is a municipality which is responsible for the costs of providing security for court premises during hours of court operations and security of persons attending court; and/or the costs of transporting prisoners and custodial minors (i.e., persons between twelve and seventeen years of age) between correctional institutions, custodial facilities and court locations for the purposes of court attendance;
- D. The Recipient has provided its 2019 CSPT costs, as confirmed in the 2019 Annual Financial Report submitted by the Recipient;
- E. Funding is allocated based on the Recipient's relative share of the total 2019 provincial CSPT cost.

### CONSIDERATION

In consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this Agreement and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are expressly acknowledged, the Province and the Recipient agree as follows:

### 1.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

1.1 The agreement, together with:

Schedule "A" -	General Terms and Conditions	
Schedule "B" -	Project Specific Information and Additional Provisions	
Schedule "C" -	Project	
Schedule "D" -	Payment Plan and Reporting Schedules	
Schedule "E" -	Court Security and Prisoner Transportation Services and

Schedule "F" -	Template for Annual Financial Report, and	
any amending agreement entered into as provided for in section 3.1,		

constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter contained in the Agreement and supersedes all prior oral or written representations and agreements.

### 2.0 CONFLICT OR INCONSISTENCY

- 2.1 **Conflict or Inconsistency.** In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between the Additional Provisions and the provisions in Schedule "A", the following rules will apply:
  - (a) the Parties will interpret any Additional Provisions in so far as possible, in a way that preserves the intention of the Parties as expressed in Schedule "A"; and
  - (b) where it is not possible to interpret the Additional Provisions in a way that is consistent with the provisions in Schedule "A", the Additional Provisions will prevail over the provisions in Schedule "A" to the extent of the inconsistency.

### 3.0 AMENDING THE AGREEMENT

3.1 The Agreement may only be amended by a written agreement duly executed by the Parties.

### 4.0 ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

- 4.1 The Recipient acknowledges that:
  - (a) by receiving Funds it may become subject to legislation applicable to

organizations that receive funding from the Government of Ontario, including the *Broader Public Sector Accountability Act, 2010* (Ontario), the *Public Sector Salary Disclosure Act, 1996* (Ontario), and the *Auditor General Act* (Ontario);

- (b) Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario has issued expenses, perquisites, and procurement directives and guidelines pursuant to the *Broader Public Sector Accountability Act, 2010* (Ontario);
- (c) the Funds are:
  - to assist the Recipient to carry out the Project and not to provide goods or services to the Province;
  - (ii) funding for the purposes of the *Public Sector Salary Disclosure Act, 1996* (Ontario);
- (d) the Province is not responsible for carrying out the Project; and
- (e) the Province is bound by the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (Ontario) and that any information provided to the Province in connection with the Project or otherwise in connection with the Agreement may be subject to disclosure in accordance with that Act.
- 4.2 The Province acknowledges that the Recipient is bound by the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (Ontario) and that any information provided to the Recipient in connection with the Project or otherwise in connection with the Agreement may be subject to disclosure in accordance with that Act.

### SCHEDULE "A" GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### A1.0 INTERPRETATION AND DEFINITIONS

- A1.1 **Interpretation.** For the purposes of interpretation:
  - (a) words in the singular include the plural and vice-versa;
  - (b) words in one gender include all genders;
  - (c) the headings do not form part of the Agreement; they are for reference only and will not affect the interpretation of the Agreement;
  - (d) any reference to dollars or currency will be in Canadian dollars and currency; and
  - (e) "include", "includes" and "including" denote that the subsequent list is not exhaustive.
- A1.2 **Definitions.** In the Agreement, the following terms will have the following meanings:

**"Additional Provisions"** means the terms and conditions set out in Schedule "B".

"Agreement" means this agreement entered into between the Province and the Recipient, all of the schedules listed in section 1.1, and any amending agreement entered into pursuant to section 3.1.

"Business Day" means any working day, Monday to Friday inclusive, excluding statutory and other holidays, namely: New Year's Day; Family Day; Good Friday; Easter Monday; Victoria Day; Canada Day; Civic Holiday; Labour Day; Thanksgiving Day; Remembrance Day; Christmas Day; Boxing Day and any other day on which the Province has elected to be closed for business.

"Court Security and Prisoner Transportation Services" means the services and activities eligible for funding, as set out in Schedule "E".

"Effective Date" means the date set out at the top of the Agreement.

"Event of Default" has the meaning ascribed to it in section A13.1.

"Expiry Date" means the expiry date set out in Schedule "B".

"Funding Year" means:

(a) in the case of the first Funding Year, the period commencing on the

Effective Date and ending on the following December 31; and

(b) in the case of Funding Years subsequent to the first Funding Year, the period commencing on January 1 following the end of the previous Funding Year and ending on the following December 31.

"**Funds**" means the money the Province provides to the Recipient pursuant to the Agreement.

"Indemnified Parties" means Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario, Her ministers, agents, appointees, and employees.

"Maximum Funds" means the maximum Funds set out in Schedule "B".

"**Notice**" means any communication given or required to be given pursuant to the Agreement.

"Notice Period" means the period of time within which the Recipient is required to remedy an Event of Default pursuant to section A13.3(b), and includes any such period or periods of time by which the Province extends that time in accordance with section A13.4.

"Parties" means the Province and the Recipient.

"Party" means either the Province or the Recipient.

"Project" means the undertaking described in Schedule "C".

"Reports" means the reports described in Schedule "F".

### A2.0 REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, AND COVENANTS

- A2.1 **General.** The Recipient represents, warrants, and covenants that:
  - (a) it is, and will continue to be, a validly existing legal entity with full power to fulfill its obligations under the Agreement;
  - (b) it has, and will continue to have, the experience and expertise necessary to carry out the Project;
  - (c) it is in compliance with, and will continue to comply with, all federal and provincial laws and regulations, all municipal by-laws, and any other orders, rules, and by-laws related to any aspect of the Project, the Funds, or both; and
  - (d) unless otherwise provided for in the Agreement, any information the Recipient provided to the Province in support of its request for funds (including information relating to any eligibility requirements) was true

and complete at the time the Recipient provided it and will continue to be true and complete.

- A2.2 **Execution of Agreement.** The Recipient represents and warrants that it has:
  - (a) the full power and authority to enter into the Agreement; and
  - (b) taken all necessary actions to authorize the execution of the Agreement.
- A2.3 **Governance.** The Recipient represents, warrants, and covenants that it has, will maintain in writing, and will follow:
  - (a) a code of conduct and ethical responsibilities for all persons at all levels of the Recipient's organization;
  - (b) procedures to enable the Recipient's ongoing effective functioning;
  - (c) decision-making mechanisms for the Recipient;
  - (d) procedures to enable the Recipient to manage Funds prudently and effectively;
  - (e) procedures to enable the Recipient to complete the Project successfully;
  - (f) procedures to enable the Recipient to identify risks to the completion of the Project and strategies to address the identified risks, all in a timely manner;
  - (g) procedures to enable the preparation and submission of all Reports required pursuant to Article A7.0; and
  - (h) procedures to enable the Recipient to address such other matters as the Recipient considers necessary to enable the Recipient to carry out its obligations under the Agreement.
- A2.4 **Supporting Proof.** Upon the request of the Province, the Recipient will provide the Province with proof of the matters referred to in Article A2.0.

### A3.0 TERM OF THE AGREEMENT

A3.1 **Term.** The term of the Agreement will commence on the Effective Date and will expire on the Expiry Date unless terminated earlier pursuant to Article A11.0, Article A12.0, or Article A13.0.

### A4.0 FUNDS AND CARRYING OUT THE PROJECT

A4.1 **Funds Provided.** The Province will:

- (a) provide the Recipient up to the Maximum Funds for the purpose of carrying out the Project;
- (b) provide the Funds to the Recipient in accordance with Schedule "D"; and
- (c) deposit the Funds into an account designated by the Recipient provided that the account:
  - (i) resides at a Canadian financial institution; and
  - (ii) is in the name of the Recipient.

### A4.2 Limitation on Payment of Funds. Despite section A4.1:

- (a) the Province is not obligated to provide any Funds to the Recipient until the Recipient provides the certificates of insurance or other proof as the Province may request pursuant to section A10.2;
- (b) the Province is not obligated to provide instalments of Funds until it is satisfied with the progress of the Project;
- (c) the Province may adjust the amount of Funds it provides to the Recipient in any Funding Year based upon the Province's assessment of the information the Recipient provides to the Province pursuant to section A7.1; or
- (d) if, pursuant to the *Financial Administration Act* (Ontario), the Province does not receive the necessary appropriation from the Ontario Legislature for payment under the Agreement, the Province is not obligated to make any such payment, and, as a consequence, the Province may:
  - (i) reduce the amount of Funds and, in consultation with the Recipient, change the Project; or
  - (ii) terminate the Agreement pursuant to section A12.1.
- A4.3 **Use of Funds and Carry Out the Project.** The Recipient will do all of the following:
  - (a) carry out the Project in accordance with the Agreement;
  - (b) use the Funds only for the purpose of carrying out the Project;
  - (c) use the Funds only on activities and services eligible for funding as set out in Schedule "E"; and
  - (d) not use the Funds to cover any cost that has or will be funded or reimbursed by one or more of any third party, ministry, agency, or

organization of the Government of Ontario.

- A4.4 **Interest Bearing Account.** If the Province provides Funds before the Recipient's immediate need for the Funds, the Recipient will place the Funds in an interest bearing account in the name of the Recipient at a Canadian financial institution.
- A4.5 **Interest.** If the Recipient earns any interest on the Funds, the Province may:
  - (a) deduct an amount equal to the interest from any further instalments of Funds; or
  - (b) demand from the Recipient the payment of an amount equal to the interest.
- A4.6 **Rebates, Credits, and Refunds.** The Ministry will calculate Funds based on the actual costs to the Recipient to carry out the Project, less any costs (including taxes) for which the Recipient has received, will receive, or is eligible to receive, a rebate, credit, or refund.

### A5.0 RECIPIENT'S ACQUISITION OF GOODS OR SERVICES, AND DISPOSAL OF ASSETS

- A5.1 **Acquisition.** If the Recipient acquires goods, services, or both with the Funds, it will:
  - (a) do so through a process that promotes the best value for money; and
  - (b) comply with the *Broader Public Sector Accountability Act, 2010* (Ontario), including any procurement directive issued thereunder, to the extent applicable.
- A5.2 **Disposal.** The Recipient shall sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any asset purchased with the Funds or for which Funds were provided only in accordance with its asset disposal policies and procedures, unless the Province agrees otherwise.

## A6.0 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A6.1 **No Conflict of Interest.** The Recipient will carry out the Project and use the Funds without an actual, potential, or perceived conflict of interest.
- A6.2 **Conflict of Interest Includes.** For the purposes of Article A6.0, a conflict of interest includes any circumstances where:
  - (a) the Recipient; or
  - (b) any person who has the capacity to influence the Recipient's decisions,

has outside commitments, relationships, or financial interests that could, or could be seen to, interfere with the Recipient's objective, unbiased, and impartial judgment relating to the Project, the use of the Funds, or both.

### A6.3 **Disclosure to Province.** The Recipient will:

- (a) disclose to the Province, without delay, any situation that a reasonable person would interpret as an actual, potential, or perceived conflict of interest; and
- (b) comply with any terms and conditions that the Province may prescribe as a result of the disclosure.

# A7.0 REPORTS, ACCOUNTING, AND REVIEW

- A7.1 **Preparation and Submission.** The Recipient will:
  - submit to the Province at the address referred to in section A17.1, all Reports in accordance with the timelines and content requirements as provided for in Schedules "D" and "F", or in a form as specified by the Province from time to time;
  - (b) submit to the Province at the address referred to in section A17.1, any other reports as may be requested by the Province in accordance with the timelines and content requirements specified by the Province;
  - (c) ensure that all Reports and other reports are completed to the satisfaction of the Province; and
  - (d) ensure that all Reports and other reports are signed on behalf of the Recipient by an authorized signing officer.
- A7.2 **Record Maintenance.** The Recipient will keep and maintain:
  - (a) all financial records (including invoices) relating to the Funds or otherwise to the Project in a manner consistent with generally accepted accounting principles; and
  - (b) all non-financial documents and records relating to the Funds or otherwise to the Project.
- A7.3 **Inspection.** The Province, any authorized representative, or any independent auditor identified by the Province may, at the Province's expense, upon twenty-four hours' Notice to the Recipient and during normal business hours, enter upon the Recipient's premises to review the progress of the Project and the Recipient's allocation and expenditure of the Funds and, for these purposes,

the Province, any authorized representative, or any independent auditor identified by the Province may take one or more of the following actions:

- (a) inspect and copy the records and documents referred to in section A7.2;
- (b) remove any copies made pursuant to section A7.3(a) from the Recipient's premises; and
- (c) conduct an audit or investigation of the Recipient in respect of the expenditure of the Funds, the Project, or both.
- A7.4 **Disclosure.** To assist in respect of the rights provided for in section A7.3, the Recipient will disclose any information requested by the Province, any authorized representatives, or any independent auditor identified by the Province, and will do so in the form requested by the Province, any authorized representative, or any independent auditor identified by the Province, as the case may be.
- A7.5 **No Control of Records.** No provision of the Agreement will be construed so as to give the Province any control whatsoever over the Recipient's records.
- A7.6 **Auditor General.** The Province's rights under Article A7.0 are in addition to any rights provided to the Auditor General pursuant to section 9.2 of the *Auditor General Act* (Ontario).

### A8.0 COMMUNICATIONS REQUIREMENTS

- A8.1 **Acknowledge Support.** Unless otherwise directed by the Province, the Recipient will:
  - (a) acknowledge the support of the Province for the Project; and
  - (b) ensure that the acknowledgement referred to in section A8.1(a) is in a form and manner as directed by the Province.
- A8.2 **Publication.** The Recipient will indicate, in any of its Project-related publications, whether written, oral, or visual, that the views expressed in the publication are the views of the Recipient and do not necessarily reflect those of the Province.

### A9.0 INDEMNITY

A9.1 **Indemnification.** The Recipient will indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnified Parties from and against any and all liability, loss, costs, damages, and expenses (including legal, expert and consultant fees), causes of action, actions, claims, demands, lawsuits, or other proceedings, by whomever made, sustained, incurred, brought, or prosecuted, in any way arising out of or in connection with the Project or otherwise in connection with the Agreement, unless solely caused by the negligence or wilful misconduct of the Indemnified Parties.

### A10.0 INSURANCE

- A10.1 **Recipient's Insurance.** The Recipient represents, warrants, and covenants that it has, and will maintain, at its own cost and expense, with insurers having a secure A.M. Best rating of B+ or greater, or the equivalent, all the necessary and appropriate insurance that a prudent person carrying out a project similar to the Project would maintain, including commercial general liability insurance on an occurrence basis for third party bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage, to an inclusive limit of not less than the amount provided for in Schedule "B" per occurrence. The insurance policy will include the following:
  - (a) the Indemnified Parties as additional insureds with respect to liability arising in the course of performance of the Recipient's obligations under, or otherwise in connection with, the Agreement;
  - (b) a cross-liability clause;
  - (c) contractual liability coverage; and
  - (d) a 30-day written notice of cancellation.

### A10.2 **Proof of Insurance.** The Recipient will:

- (a) provide to the Province, either:
  - (i) certificates of insurance that confirm the insurance coverage as provided for in section A10.1; or
  - (ii) other proof that confirms the insurance coverage as provided for in section A10.1; and
- (b) upon the request of the Province, provide to the Province a copy of any insurance policy.

## A11.0 TERMINATION ON NOTICE

- A11.1 **Termination on Notice.** The Province may terminate the Agreement at any time without liability, penalty, or costs upon giving at least 30 days' Notice to the Recipient.
- A11.2 **Consequences of Termination on Notice by the Province.** If the Province terminates the Agreement pursuant to section A11.1, the Province may take one or more of the following actions:
  - (a) cancel further instalments of Funds;

- (b) demand from the Recipient the payment of any Funds remaining in the possession or under the control of the Recipient; and
- (c) determine the reasonable costs for the Recipient to wind down the Project, and do either or both of the following:
  - (i) permit the Recipient to offset such costs against the amount the Recipient owes pursuant to section A11.2(b); and
  - (ii) subject to section A4.1(a), provide Funds to the Recipient to cover such costs.

## A12.0 TERMINATION WHERE NO APPROPRIATION

- A12.1 **Termination Where No Appropriation.** If, as provided for in section A4.2(d), the Province does not receive the necessary appropriation from the Ontario Legislature for any payment the Province is to make pursuant to the Agreement, the Province may terminate the Agreement immediately without liability, penalty, or costs by giving Notice to the Recipient.
- A12.2 **Consequences of Termination Where No Appropriation.** If the Province terminates the Agreement pursuant to section A12.1, the Province may take one or more of the following actions:
  - (a) cancel further instalments of Funds;
  - (b) demand from the Recipient the payment of any Funds remaining in the possession or under the control of the Recipient; and
  - (c) determine the reasonable costs for the Recipient to wind down the Project and permit the Recipient to offset such costs against the amount owing pursuant to section A12.2(b).
- A12.3 **No Additional Funds.** If, pursuant to section A12.2(c), the Province determines that the costs to wind down the Project exceed the Funds remaining in the possession or under the control of the Recipient, the Province will not provide additional Funds to the Recipient.

# A13.0 EVENT OF DEFAULT, CORRECTIVE ACTION, AND TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

- A13.1 **Events of Default.** Each of the following events will constitute an Event of Default:
  - (a) in the opinion of the Province, the Recipient breaches any representation, warranty, covenant, or other material term of the Agreement, including failing to do any of the following in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Agreement:

- (i) carry out the Project;
- (ii) use or spend Funds; or
- (iii) provide, in accordance with section A7.1, Reports or such other reports as may have been requested pursuant to section A7.1(b);
- (b) the Recipient's operations, its financial condition, or its organizational structure, changes such that it no longer meets one or more of the eligibility requirements of the program under which the Province provides the Funds;
- (c) the Recipient makes an assignment, proposal, compromise, or arrangement for the benefit of creditors, or a creditor makes an application for an order adjudging the Recipient bankrupt, or applies for the appointment of a receiver; or
- (d) the Recipient ceases to operate.
- A13.2 **Consequences of Events of Default and Corrective Action.** If an Event of Default occurs, the Province may, at any time, take one or more of the following actions:
  - (a) initiate any action the Province considers necessary in order to facilitate the successful continuation or completion of the Project;
  - (b) provide the Recipient with an opportunity to remedy the Event of Default;
  - (c) suspend the payment of Funds for such period as the Province determines appropriate;
  - (d) reduce the amount of the Funds;
  - (e) cancel further instalments of Funds;
  - (f) demand from the Recipient the payment of any Funds remaining in the possession or under the control of the Recipient;
  - (g) demand from the Recipient the payment of an amount equal to any Funds the Recipient used, but did not use in accordance with the Agreement;
  - (h) demand from the Recipient the payment of an amount equal to any Funds the Province provided to the Recipient; and
  - (i) terminate the Agreement at any time, including immediately, without liability, penalty or costs to the Province upon giving Notice to the

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Recipient.

- A13.3 **Opportunity to Remedy.** If, in accordance with section A13.2(b), the Province provides the Recipient with an opportunity to remedy the Event of Default, the Province will give Notice to the Recipient of:
  - (a) the particulars of the Event of Default; and
  - (b) the Notice Period.
- A13.4 **Recipient not Remedying.** If the Province provided the Recipient with an opportunity to remedy the Event of Default pursuant to section A13.2(b), and:
  - the Recipient does not remedy the Event of Default within the Notice Period;
  - (b) it becomes apparent to the Province that the Recipient cannot completely remedy the Event of Default within the Notice Period; or
  - (c) the Recipient is not proceeding to remedy the Event of Default in a way that is satisfactory to the Province,

the Province may extend the Notice Period, or initiate any one or more of the actions provided for in sections A13.2(a), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), and (i).

A13.5 **When Termination Effective.** Termination under Article will take effect as provided for in the Notice.

## A14.0 FUNDS AT THE END OF A FUNDING YEAR

- A14.1 **Funds at the End of a Funding Year.** Without limiting any rights of the Province under Article A13.0, if the Recipient has not spent all of the Funds allocated for the Funding Year, the Province may take one or both of the following actions:
  - (a) demand from the Recipient payment of the unspent Funds; and
  - (b) adjust the amount of any further instalments of Funds accordingly.

### A15.0 FUNDS UPON EXPIRY

A15.1 **Funds Upon Expiry.** The Recipient will, upon expiry of the Agreement, pay to the Province any Funds remaining in its possession or under its control.

### A16.0 DEBT DUE AND PAYMENT

A16.1 **Payment of Overpayment.** If at any time the Province provides Funds in excess of the amount to which the Recipient is entitled under the Agreement,

the Province may:

- (a) deduct an amount equal to the excess Funds from any further instalments of Funds; or
- (b) demand that the Recipient pay an amount equal to the excess Funds to the Province.
- A16.2 **Debt Due.** If, pursuant to the Agreement:
  - (a) the Province demands from the Recipient the payment of any Funds or an amount equal to any Funds; or
  - (b) the Recipient owes any Funds or an amount equal to any Funds to the Province, whether or not the Province has demanded their payment,

such Funds or other amount will be deemed to be a debt due and owing to the Province by the Recipient, and the Recipient will pay the amount to the Province immediately, unless the Province directs otherwise.

- A16.3 **Interest Rate.** The Province may charge the Recipient interest on any money owing by the Recipient at the then current interest rate charged by the Province of Ontario on accounts receivable.
- A16.4 **Payment of Money to Province.** The Recipient will pay any money owing to the Province by cheque payable to the "Ontario Minister of Finance" and delivered to the Province as provided for in Schedule "B".
- A16.5 **Fails to Pay.** Without limiting the application of section 43 of the *Financial Administration Act* (Ontario), if the Recipient fails to pay any amount owing under the Agreement, Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario may deduct any unpaid amount from any money payable to the Recipient by Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario.

## A17.0 NOTICE

- A17.1 **Notice in Writing and Addressed.** Notice will be in writing and will be delivered by email, postage-prepaid mail, personal delivery, or fax, and will be addressed to the Province and the Recipient respectively as provided for Schedule "B", or as either Party later designates to the other by Notice.
- A17.2 **Notice Given.** Notice will be deemed to have been given:
  - (a) in the case of postage-prepaid mail, five Business Days after the Notice is mailed; or
  - (b) in the case of email, personal delivery, or fax, one Business Day after the Notice is delivered.

- A17.3 **Postal Disruption.** Despite section A17.2(a), in the event of a postal disruption:
  - (a) Notice by postage-prepaid mail will not be deemed to be given; and
  - (b) the Party giving Notice will give Notice by email, personal delivery, or fax.

### A18.0 CONSENT BY PROVINCE AND COMPLIANCE BY RECIPIENT

A18.1 **Consent.** When the Province provides its consent pursuant to the Agreement, it may impose any terms and conditions on such consent and the Recipient will comply with such terms and conditions.

### A19.0 SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS

A19.1 **Invalidity or Unenforceability of Any Provision.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of the Agreement will not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provision of the Agreement. Any invalid or unenforceable provision will be deemed to be severed.

### A20.0 WAIVER

- A20.1 **Waiver Request.** Either Party may, in accordance with the Notice provision set out in Article A17.0, ask the other Party to waive an obligation under the Agreement.
- A20.2 **Waiver Applies.** Any waiver a Party grants in response to a request made pursuant to section A20.1 will:
  - (a) be valid only if the Party granting the waiver provides it in writing; and
  - (b) apply only to the specific obligation referred to in the waiver.

## A21.0 INDEPENDENT PARTIES

A21.1 **Parties Independent.** The Recipient is not an agent, joint venturer, partner, or employee of the Province, and the Recipient will not represent itself in any way that might be taken by a reasonable person to suggest that it is, or take any actions that could establish or imply such a relationship.

## A22.0 ASSIGNMENT OF AGREEMENT OR FUNDS

- A22.1 **No Assignment.** The Recipient will not, without the prior written consent of the Province, assign any of its rights or obligations under the Agreement.
- A22.2 Agreement Binding. All rights and obligations contained in the Agreement will

extend to and be binding on the Parties' respective heirs, executors, administrators, successors, and permitted assigns.

### A23.0 GOVERNING LAW

A23.1 **Governing Law.** The Agreement and the rights, obligations, and relations of the Parties will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Province of Ontario and the applicable federal laws of Canada. Any actions or proceedings arising in connection with the Agreement will be conducted in the courts of Ontario, which will have exclusive jurisdiction over such proceedings.

# A24.0 FURTHER ASSURANCES

A24.1 **Agreement into Effect.** The Recipient will provide such further assurances as the Province may request from time to time with respect to any matter to which the Agreement pertains, and will otherwise do or cause to be done all acts or things necessary to implement and carry into effect the terms and conditions of the Agreement to their full extent.

### A25.0 JOINT AND SEVERAL LIABILITY

A25.1 **Joint and Several Liability.** Where the Recipient is comprised of more than one entity, all such entities will be jointly and severally liable to the Province for the fulfillment of the obligations of the Recipient under the Agreement.

## A26.0 RIGHTS AND REMEDIES CUMULATIVE

A26.1 **Rights and Remedies Cumulative.** The rights and remedies of the Province under the Agreement are cumulative and are in addition to, and not in substitution for, any of its rights and remedies provided by law or in equity.

## A27.0 FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH OTHER AGREEMENTS

- A27.1 Other Agreements. If the Recipient:
  - has failed to comply with any term, condition, or obligation under any other agreement with Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario or one of Her agencies (a "Failure");
  - (b) has been provided with notice of such Failure in accordance with the requirements of such other agreement;
  - (c) has, if applicable, failed to rectify such Failure in accordance with the requirements of such other agreement; and

(d) such Failure is continuing,

the Province may suspend the payment of Funds for such period as the Province determines appropriate.

### A28.0 SURVIVAL

A28.1 **Survival.** The following Articles and sections, and all applicable crossreferenced sections and schedules, will continue in full force and effect for a period of seven years from the date of expiry or termination of the Agreement: Article 1.0, Article 3.0, Article A1.0 and any other applicable definitions, section A2.1(a), sections A4.2(d), A4.5, section A5.2, section A7.1 (to the extent that the Recipient has not provided the Reports or other reports as may have been requested to the satisfaction of the Province), sections A7.2, A7.3, A7.4, A7.5, A7.6, Article A8.0, Article A9.0, section A11.2, sections A12.2, A12.3, sections A13.1, A13.2(d), (e), (f), (g) and (h), Article A15.0, Article A16.0, Article A17.0, Article A19.0, section A22.2, Article A23.0, Article A25.0, Article A26.0, Article A27.0 and Article A28.0.

# Additional Provisions:

None

The Province implemented the Program in 2012 to assist municipalities in offsetting their costs of providing CSPT services in their jurisdictions.

The Province will upload CSPT costs from municipalities to a maximum of \$125 million in 2021.

The Recipient is responsible for the costs of providing security for court premises during hours of court operations and security of persons attending court, and/or the costs of transporting prisoners and custodial minors (i.e., persons between twelve and seventeen years of age) between correctional institutions, custodial facilities and court locations for the purposes of court attendance.

The Funds in the amount of **\$55,698.84** will be provided to the Recipient according to the following schedule:

- A. First instalment: **\$13,924.71** will be paid to the Recipient once the Recipient has signed the Agreement, provided adequate proof of insurance to the Province in accordance with section A10.2 of the Agreement, and the Agreement has then been signed by the Province.
- B. Second Instalment: **\$13,924.71** will be paid to the Recipient, following the Province's receipt and approval of the 2020 Annual Financial Report (due April 15, 2021). Subsequent payments will not be released until the Province has received and approved the 2020 Annual Financial Report.
- C. Third Instalment: **\$13,924.71** will be paid to the Recipient by the end of September 2021.
- D. Final instalment: **\$13,924.71** will be paid to the Recipient by the end of December 2021.
- E. The Recipient must submit the 2021 Annual Financial Report to the Province by April 15, 2022.

# SCHEDULE "E" COURT SECURITY AND PRISONER TRANSPORTATION SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES ELIGIBLE FOR FUNDING

### A. COURT SECURITY includes:

### **1. Facility Perimeter Security**

Costs associated with external and/or internal presence of police or other security personnel during regular or non-regular hours to secure the perimeter of the facility, to respond to a specific threat or for high-profile matters.

### 2. Courtroom Security

Costs associated with the presence of police or other security personnel in the courtroom to ensure the safety and security of the proceedings and attendees.

### 3. General Courthouse Security Presence

Costs associated with the use of screening stations to screen all public visitors to the courthouse, including the use of magnetometers and x-ray machines, and police or other security personnel assigned to perform roving patrols of the court facility.

### 4. Prisoner Movement in Courthouse

Costs associated with monitoring the movement of prisoners between holding cells and other areas within the courthouse.

### 5. Prisoner Guarding in Holding Cells

Costs associated with guarding and monitoring of prisoners brought to court and held in courthouse holding cells (where applicable).

### 6. Prisoner Feeding

Costs associated with the provision of meals to prisoners required while in the custody of local police services for the purpose of attending court.

### **B. PRISONER TRANSPORTATION includes:**

### **1. Prisoner Transport**

Costs associated with the movement of prisoners between correctional institutions and court locations for the purposes of attending court.

### 2. Prisoner Transport - Youth

Costs associated with the movement of custodial minors (i.e. 12-17 years old) between correctional and/or custodial facilities and court locations for the purposes of attending court.

\*PRISONER includes: Persons being held in custody as a result of provincial or federal offence proceedings, including persons under immigration detention.

# C. TRAINING, EQUIPMENT AND RECRUITING includes:

- 1. Costs associated with training that is relevant to court security and prisoner transportation only.
- 2. Cost associated with equipment that is unique to the provision of court security and prisoner transportation and does not include equipment that would be utilized for other purposes.
- 3. Costs associated with recruiting that is relevant to the staffing of court security and prisoner transportation only. Costs may include advertising for applicants, physical fitness and/or psychological testing, applicant screening, interviews or any other related human resources expense.

# COURT SECURITY AND PRISONER TRANSPORTATION do NOT include:

### **Court Administration**

Costs associated with performing court administrative duties including the scheduling of staff for daily deployment, the service of legal documents, the preparation/maintenance of Crown Brief materials, the entry of data into court information systems, preparing or swearing/affirming legal documentation, scheduling of court appearances or other duties of a related nature.

Subject: Final Tax Rate By-Law 2021-010

### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

1. **By-law 2021-010** being a by-law to set and levy the rates of taxation for the year 2021, be taken as having been read three times and finally passed and the Mayor and Clerk **BE AUTHORIZED** to sign same.

## 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

On December 18, 2020, Council adopted the 2021 Budget and approved the 2021 total own purposes tax levy of \$25,362,156, including \$24,059,492 general levy and \$1,302,664 special capital levy. Administration was then to report back with a Final Tax Rate By-law for adoption of the 2021 tax rates, based on the approved 2021 own purposes tax levy, following receipt of the returned assessment roll for 2021.

The growth forecast used for 2021 Budget development, based on the best information available at the time, was 2.48%. Council approved the 2021 Budget and related levy amounts, and was advised that based on the estimated assessment change the estimated municipal tax impact for a residential property from the levy change would be 2.03%.

It was noted in the December 18, 2020 report for approval of the 2021 Budget that the actual 2021 tax rates and tax rate impacts would be determined based on the approved tax levy applied to the returned Assessment Roll for 2021 taxation purposes, and would be included in a further report to Council recommending approval of a Final Tax Rate Bylaw. And it was further noted that if assessment in the returned roll was higher than estimated at the time of budget development, then the own purposes (Town) tax rate impact would be lower than estimated, and vice versa.

Subsequent to preparation of the 2021 Budget, the tax roll for 2021 taxation purposes was returned by MPAC and the final weighted assessment total for the Town of Amherstburg was confirmed by the County of Essex at \$2,524,482,655. This represents an increase of \$49,788,251 or 2.01% over the Town's prior year weighted assessment.

On February 17, 2021, County Council passed the following By-laws:

• By-law 2021-6 to establish tax ratios for the year 2021 for the Corporation of the County of Essex and its constituent lower tier municipalities.

The Province of Ontario has also established 2021 Education tax rates.

The Town collects taxes on behalf of both School Board and County of Essex taxes as part of the tax notices issued to local ratepayers.

#### 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

As noted above, Council approved the 2021 Budget and related tax levy amounts required to fund municipal services for the year, including special capital levies in December 2020 and that the actual returned roll for 2021 taxation purposes was received following development of the final budget.

Based on the actual returned roll, the Town's weighted assessment increased by 2.01% over the prior year. This increase is lower than the increase of 2.48% estimated at the time of 2020 Budget development.

The tax rates for the Town are a function of the levy amount (dollars to be collected) over the weighted assessment (current market value of properties), with the latter determined by MPAC through the returned roll, adjusted for tax ratios and policy determined by the County of Essex for its lower tier municipalities.

The **estimated** impact of the Town's 2021 levy demands, based on the 2021 Budget approved by Council, was an increase of 2.03% on residential taxes, or an additional \$20 per \$100,000 in residential assessment. However, the residential tax impact based on the approved levy applied to the **actual** weighted assessment is an **increase** in residential taxes of 2.36%, or \$23 **increase** per \$100,000 in residential assessment.

The estimated tax rate impact is provided to Council with the budget to give some context to the dollar impact to a residential property with average assessment, based on the tax levy and estimated assessment for the taxation year. However, the actual tax rate is a function of factors outside the control of Council and cannot be fully known at the time of budget development where the assessment roll has not be returned for the taxation year the budget relates to nor have the tax ratio adjustments been approved by the upper tier municipality (County of Essex).

It is important to note that the Town's efforts to build reserves, provide for asset renewals and ensure adequate resources are in place for service delivery are critical to achieving a sustainable financial model and acceptable risk profile for the Town. To that end the focus in the annual budget document and presentation to Council is on the dollars required to fund the Town's operations and capital program for the fiscal year (the levy demand) based on strategic, legislated and service level requirements.

As such, Council is encouraged to focus on ensuring that the dollars needed to deliver required and desired municipal services are raised through the levy, rather than to target a definitive tax rate impact through adjustments to the budget and related levy demand, which may or may not result in the desired tax rate impact once the final roll is returned.

# 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

The tax rating By-law must be adopted in order to levy final taxes for the year and to meet the Town's financial obligations.

# 5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

On a home with an assessment of \$250,000, the municipal portion of taxes including capital reserve and capital replacement levies for 2021 will be \$2,512 compared to \$2,454 in 2020, which represents a total municipal portion tax increase of \$58 or a 2.36% increase from the prior year.

The actual 2021 tax rates outlined above do not affect the levy approved at the time of 2021 Budget adoption. The levy is the amount of money required to fund the Town's 2021 operating and capital demands in the approved budget, which will be collected through taxation.

# 6. <u>CONSULTATIONS</u>:

The Supervisor of Revenue assisted in development of this report and the related By-law.

MPAC provided the returned roll for 2021 taxation purposes and the County of Essex provided the tax ratios for the 2021 taxation year.

# 7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>:

By-law 2021-010 is before Council for adoption to set and levy taxes for the 2021 year.

#### THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF AMHERSTBURG

#### BY-LAW 2021-010

#### A By-law to Set and Levy the Rates of Taxation for the Year 2021

**WHEREAS** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg has, in accordance with the Municipal Act, 2001, c25, s312(2) considered the estimates of the Municipality for the year 2021;

And whereas it is necessary for the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg (the Corporation), pursuant to the Municipal Act, to levy on the whole rateable property, according to the last revised assessment roll for the Corporation, the sums set forth for the various purposes in Schedule "A" hereto attached for the current year;

And whereas all property assessment rolls on which the 2021 taxes are to be levied have been returned and revised pursuant to the provisions of the Assessment Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.A.31 as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Assessment Act") subject to appeals at present before the Assessment Review Board, the Ontario Municipal Board and the District Court;

And whereas Section 312 of The Municipal Act, 2001 as amended, provides the Council of a local municipality shall, after the adoption of the estimates for the year pass a By-Law to levy a separate tax rate on the assessment in each property sub class;

And whereas Section 312 of The Municipal Act, 2001 as amended, requires tax rates to be established in the same proportion to tax ratio;

And whereas the estimates for the estimates for 2021 as set forth in Schedule "A" attached to this by-law; have been adopted requiring the 2021 levy for general municipal purposes of \$24,059,492 and the 2021 levy for the special capital purposes of \$1,302,664 for a total 2021 levy of \$25,362,156;

**Now therefore,** The Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. For the year 2021, the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg shall levy upon the whole of the rateable assessment (Schedule "B") the rates of taxation, per current value assessment (Schedule "C").
- 2. (a) The final taxes for each property shall be the total of all levies imposed under this By-law reduced by the amount of the interim levy for 2021.
  - (b) Final taxes for the year 2021 shall be payable in two installments, the first of such installments shall become due and payable on the 30th day of July, and the second installment shall become due on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of October. The Treasurer may have cause and has been delegated authority to change the dates as listed should any unforeseen delay occur.
  - (c) The due dates for Supplementary Tax Levies, resulting from amended assessment values being received from the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation under Sections 32,33, and 34 of the Assessment Act, shall be established by the Treasurer as required.
  - (c) Non-payment of the amount on the dates stated in accordance with this section shall constitute default.

- 3. That a penalty charge of one and one quarter percent (1 ¼%) on the first day in which default occurs shall be imposed for non-payment of taxes.
- 4. That a late payment charge of one and one quarter percent (1 ¼%) on the first day of each calendar month thereafter on the outstanding taxes due (taxes in default) shall be imposed for non-payment of taxes.
- 5. That penalties and interest added on taxes in default shall become due and payable and shall be collected forthwith.
- 6. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to accept part payment from time to time on account of any taxes due and to give a receipt for such a part payment provided that acceptance of any such part payment shall not affect the collection of any percentage charge imposed and collectable in respect of non-payment of the taxes or any installment thereof.
- 7. The Treasurer is hereby authorized to accept (12) monthly payments on account of taxes due on a pre-authorized payment plan. The first six (6) monthly payments shall be calculated based on the prior year taxes divided over 6 months. The last six payments shall be the actual final levy amount less the previous monthly payments received divided into six (6) equal payments. Each of the monthly payments due is on the last business day of the month. Penalty charges shall be added if payments are in default.
- 8. The Treasurer will mail or cause the same to be mailed to the address of such person indicated on the last revised assessment roll, every tax notice specifying the amount of taxes payable.
- 9. Failure to receive notice does not relieve the ratepayer of obligation to pay or exempt the property owner from charges for interest and penalties imposed on taxes in default.
- 10. If any section, portion or schedule of this bylaw is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, it is the intent of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg that all remaining sections, portions and schedules of this by-law continue in force and effect.
- 11. That this By-law takes effect January 1, 2021.

Read a first, second and third time and finally passed this 26<sup>th</sup> day of April 2021.

Subject: 2021 Public Event Approvals

#### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

- 1. Administration be **DELEGATED AUTHORITY to APPROVE** any new or recurring Public Events for the remainder of 2021, in accordance with the Public Events Policy for non-Town events and for Town events within the approved 2021 Budget;
- Administration be DELEGATED AUTHORITY to CONSIDER and APPROVE any exemptions to Municipal By-laws and Road Closure Requests for Public Events occurring in 2021;
- 3. Administration be **DELEGATED AUTHORITY to CONSIDER and APPROVE** any Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario requirements for Public Events occurring in 2021; and,
- 4. A 2021 cost in the Non-Departmental budget centre, waiver of fees expense, not to exceed \$5,000 **BE APPROVED** for waiver of fees up to \$1,000 per event for approved non-Town events.

## 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

At their October 5, 2015 Special Meeting, Council approved the Public Events Policy. As per Council's direction, Section 7.3 of the policy states:

#### *"7.3. Council has the authority and responsibility to:*

7.3.1 Consider any exemptions to Municipal By-laws for Public Events.

7.3.2. Consider and approve any new events presented by the Public Events Committee.

7.3.3. Consider and approve all recurring events presented by the Public Events Committee."

The Public Events Committee (PEC) is comprised of Administration from the following areas:

Tourism Fire Services Windsor Police – Amherstburg Detachment Recreation Services Roads Building Risk Management Licensing and Enforcement

When an event organizer is considering an event they are required to follow the Public Events Manual, fill out the required forms and submit to the PEC. The PEC reviews each application in detail and informs each event organizer of every requirement that must be met to allow their event to proceed. This includes ensuring the event conforms to all Town By-laws, Town insurance requirements and Provincial laws.

# **Current Status of COVID -19**

On April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021, Ontario implemented a province wide emergency brake effective April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021. As a result, the COVID-19 response framework is paused and all public health unit regions must follow temporary restrictions. Effective, April 8, 2021 Ontario declared a third provincial emergency and enacted a province wide Stay-at-Home Order, that was anticipated to remain in effect for at least 28 days. Effective April 17, 2021 Ontario strengthened and extended the Stay-at-Home Order until May 20, 2021. It is unknown when the Essex County region will return to the provincial colour coded response framework.

## 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

The tourism industry, because of its service nature through the interaction of people, has been the most fragile and exposed sector of the Canadian economy. Many of the local and provincial health guidelines implemented to limit the transmission of COVID-19 have had a negative effect to this sector.

Due to the impacts of COVID-19 on the Ontario tourism industry, the Ontario government has established an Ontario Tourism Economic Recovery Task Force, the mandate of this Committee will to provide strategies and advice that will position Ontario and its local communities as destinations of choice for travel. In addition, the Federal government tabled its budget on April 19, 2021 and included \$1Billion to support tourism for festivals and events.

As mentioned in a previous report to Council, on March 4, 2021, the Town of Amherstburg was recently approved for the "Safe Travel Stamp" by TIAO. The specially designed

stamp will allow travellers to recognize governments and companies around the world, which have adopted health and hygiene global standardised protocols so that consumers can experience "Safe Travels" when they visit our community. This approval acknowledges that the Town has taken the measures adopted by the World Health Organization and the Centres for Disease Control and implemented those practices. The stamp confirms to travellers that the Town has taken the necessary measures to ensure public safety. The Town will proudly begin to use the designation in our marketing and (Information found signage 2021. about TIAO can be in at: https://www.tiaontario.ca/cpages/safetravelsstamp)

Administration continues to look at innovative ways to hold events and to promote tourism in a safe and responsible manner.

#### Current Status of Public Events

Over the past year, numerous Public Events have been cancelled due to COVID-19. Despite the cancellations, event organizers and community groups have expressed their desire to continue the planning of their events for when safe reopening occurs, understanding that elements planned or contained within the delivery of an event, will be subject to regulatory compliance in accordance with legislation, municipal requirements, and event management best practices.

Due to the ever-changing status of the COVID-19 regulations and of the region's level under the pandemic response framework, this has been a very difficult task for organizers and community groups. They must be flexible to change or pivot plans within a moment's notice. This strategy is critical to support the return and recovery in moving forward for special events.

The current COVID-19 limitations on planning events include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Outdoor organized public events and social gathering limits
- Physical distancing requirements
- Safety Plans

In addition, each event organizer must have a cleaning and disinfection protocol in place for infection prevention and control.

Event organizers, who plan an event regardless of their purpose or size, have a responsibility to assess the risks associated with their event and to ensure they have the ability to mitigate these risks. The organizers are responsible for implementing measures to reduce the spread of the virus for all those who attend.

Administration has received three event applications to date for 2021; each application will be reviewed by the PEC. Due to the uncertainties surrounding the pandemic, the review of the event must wait until closer to the proposed event date. This will allow Administration to ensure the event may proceed in strict adherence to the COVID-19 regulations in effect at the time of the event.

#### Delegated Authority

Decisions made by Council are expressed through By-law or resolution. The efficient management of the municipality and the need to respond to issues in a timely manner require Council to entrust certain powers and duties to Administration while at the same time maintaining accountability. This can be accomplished through the delegation of legislative and administrative functions.

In guiding the event recovery efforts, Administration recommends that the CAO be delegated authority to approve all new and recurring events for the remainder of 2021, in consultation with the Public Events Committee. The CAO would be responsible to consider and approve all road closure and municipal By-law exemptions associated to the event for the remainder of 2021.

Administration will work closely with the event organizers and assist them in any last minute changes that may be required to their event format due to impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. The delegated authority will ease time restraints that may present themselves due to last minutes changes, as it relates to the Council meeting schedule that will be impacted by the summer schedule.

Due to the organized event gathering limit restrictions in the provincial colour coded framework, it is anticipated that only small-scale events will proceed for the remainder of 2021, pending any regulation changes. That said, and for Council's information, the Windsor Parade Corporation has indicated that they intend to proceed with a Santa Claus Parade for 2021, however, at this time the full details are unknown until a formal application is submitted. Information regarding the 2021 Santa Claus Parade format will be brought to Council in the third quarter.

#### Road Closures

At the January 25, 2016 Council meeting, Council passed the following motions:

"That:

1. The use of the Downtown Core for Festivals and Events subject to the criteria established in the Town's Festival and Events Policy BE APPROVED; and,

2. Road closures NOT BE PERMITTED prior to 5:00 pm without Council consent."

It is not anticipated that events occurring in 2021 will require road closures, however, Administration recommends that if a proposed event requires road closures in the Downtown core, Administration be delegated authority to consider and approve the road closure request. From May 21<sup>st</sup> – May 24<sup>th</sup> to September 25<sup>th</sup> - 26<sup>th</sup> Council has approved road closures for the Open Air Weekend program. No additional road closures in the downtown core will be approved by Administration during those dates.

Administration is also recommending approval of an allowance for the waiver of fees associated with approved events for the remainder of 2021. The event organizer will still be required to submit the \$250 deposit to cover any potential damages to Town property through the course of the event. The waiver of fees would support event organizers in an

endeavor to return events to Amherstburg, while adhering to all Town By-laws and provincial restrictions.

The Delegation of Powers and Duties Policy authorizes the CAO to waive fees (within the approved budget) as follows:

6.2.15. Authority granted to the Chief Administrative Officer to consider and approve of requests for waiver of fees as noted in the Town's User Fee By-law limited to fees not exceeding \$1,000 per request.

# 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

The Clerk identifies the Town's insurance requirements and relays the information to each Event Organizer. Special events on Town property are not able to proceed until the Clerk is satisfied the insurance requirements are met. A member of Administration from the PEC will be in attendance and on call for each event to ensure the event is operating in accordance with all Town policies, rules and regulations. Administration also ensures that all provincial legislation and COVID-19 related health guidance and recommendations are adhered to in the event plans; the responsibility for adherence to legislation in operation of the event rests with the event operator.

The recommendation and approach in this report will provide valuable opportunities to strengthen the resilience of individual organizations and event recovery to refine as necessary given the evolving status of COVID-19 regulations.

# 5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

Each event application requires a \$250 deposit. This deposit is returned to the event organizer after the event pending a post inspection of the event area by Administration. Any damages to Town equipment or property are recoverable from the event organizer.

The event organizers are responsible to pay for equipment rentals, facility rentals and all other costs associated with their event as per the Town's User Fee By-law, as amended. The cost to set up the rented equipment by Town staff is accommodated within the Town's budget under the Parks budget centre.

The impact associated with waiving fees for 2021 Public Events is not anticipated to exceed \$5,000, due to the fact most events have already been cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This report recommends approval of an allowance not to exceed \$5,000 in total, at up to \$1,000 per event, to reflect the opportunity cost of waived fees in 2021 for approved non-Town events. The offsetting foregone revenue will be reflected in the Licensing and Enforcement budget centre.

Subject: Suitability for Development on Private Septic System on one Severed Lot on Front Road N

#### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

1. The development of a lot on Front Road North, severed off 1459 Front Road N, on a private septic system, as outlined in the March 22, 2021 report from the Manager of Planning Services, **BE APPROVED**.

## 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

A request has been submitted by John and Angela Riolo for Council's approval to develop one new lot on a private septic system. The Town of Amherstburg Official Plan requires that development of 5 or less lots/units, may take place on private individual on-site septic systems and in areas where public systems are not intended or are not readily available, only after Council approval has been granted.

John and Angela Riolo obtained approval from the Committee of Adjustment on January 26, 2021, File No. B/18/20, for the creation of a new residential building lot.

The applicant has severed a parcel of land being 48.15 m (158 ft.) frontage by an irregular depth with an area of approximately 0.756 hectares (1.87 acres) for purposes of creating a new residential building lot. The remaining parcel being 30.48 m (100 ft.) frontage by an irregular depth with an area of 2228.28 square metres (23,985 sq. ft.) contains one single detached dwelling and a detached garage. The subject lands are zoned Agricultural (A) Zone in the Zoning By-law 1999-52 and designated Low Density Residential in the Town of Amherstburg Official Plan.

Condition (11) of the Consent Approval requires that the developer obtain permission of Council for the development of the lot on a private individual septic system, as follows:

11. That Council approve the development of the newly created lot on private individual septic systems after the soil analysis and septic design for the proposed lot is completed. This requirement shall be fulfilled prior to the stamping of deeds.

## 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

The subject lands affected by the requested approval are severed off 1459 Front Road North.

Section 2.6.3 of the Official Plan states the following:

"[D]evelopment of 5 or less lots/units, if permitted by the Land Use Policies of this Plan, may take place on private individual on-site sewage disposal systems and/or private wells in areas where public and private communal systems are not intended or are not readily available.

Within a Settlement Area, Council approval will be required before any development is permitted on private individual sewage disposal and/or water systems. Approval may be conditional on proof of a potable water supply and soil suitable for septic tanks for the long term. Connection to public systems, should they become available, will be mandatory."

Although it is preferable to have all development connected to the municipal sanitary sewers, in this case it would not be financially feasible. Further, for Council's reference, all existing lots on Front Road North in this area with new or existing homes are serviced by private septic systems.

The design of the septic system will have to be satisfactory to all approval authorities, and approved by the applicable municipal department(s).

#### 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

The recommendation in this report presents little to no risk to the municipality. The subject lot was created through the consent process.

#### 5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

All costs associated with the application are the responsibility of the applicant.

The future development of the lot would result in additional assessment to the Town's property tax base, as well as an additional user to the water system to help create revenue through growth.

It would also attract development charges and building permit fees when development occurs.

# 6. <u>CONSULTATIONS</u>:

The Essex Region Conservation Authority (ERCA) and the Town of Amherstburg Drainage Superintendent/Engineering Coordinator were consulted during the consent process to provide feedback and comments regarding this property.

The Building Services Division identified no concerns with the proposed lot size or the ability for the home and private septic system to be constructed. The property owners would have the ability to utilize conventional or tertiary septic designs.

# 7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>:

Administration recommends the approval for the development of one lot on Front Road North on a private septic system.



#### 6. Order of Business

# 6.1 Application B/18/20 – John & Angela Riolo – 1459 Front Rd N (Roll No. 3729-460-000-10500)

Public in Attendance: John and Angela Riolo, Mike Collavino

**B/18/20:** The applicant is proposing to sever a parcel being 48.15 m (158 ft.) frontage by an irregular depth with an area of approximately 0.756 hectares (1.87 acres) for purposes

of creating a new residential building lot. The remaining parcel being 30.48 m (100 ft.) frontage by an irregular depth with an area of 2228.28 square metres (23,985 sq. ft.) contains one single detached dwelling and a detached garage. The subject property is Zoned Agriculture and designated Low Density Residential in the Town's Official Plan.

The following correspondence was received from the various agencies and residents circulated:

i) Letter dated January 19, 2021 from the Essex Region Conservation Authority stating:

The above noted lands are subject to our Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alteration to Shorelines and Watercourses Regulation under the Conservation Authorities Act (Ontario Regulation No. 158/06). The parcel falls within the regulated area of the Rosario Bezaire Drain, Sancrainte Drain and Lake St. Clair. The property owner will be required to obtain a Permit and/or Clearance from the Essex Region Conservation Authority prior to any future

construction or site alteration or other activities affected by Section 28 of the Conservation Authorities Act.

Our office has reviewed the proposal and has no concerns relating to stormwater management.

Our information indicates that the subject property may support habitat of endangered species and threatened species. As per Section 2.1.7 of the PPS, 2020 – "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted in habitat of endangered species and threatened species, except in accordance with provincial and federal requirements". All species listed as endangered or threatened (aquatic species, plants, mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, etc.) as well as their related habitats, are protected under the Ontario Endangered Species Act. Prior to initiating any proposed works on this property, it is the proponent's responsibility to contact the Species at Risk Branch of the Ontario Ministry of Environment, Conservation & Parks (MECP) to ensure all issues related to the Endangered Species Act are addressed. All inquiries regarding the Endangered Species Act should be made with Permissions and Compliance Section of the MECP (e-mail address: <u>SAROntario@ontario.ca</u>).

With the review of background information and aerial photograph, ERCA has no objection to this application for consent.

- ii) Email dated January 15, 2021 from the Public Works Department identifying the following comments:
  - Drainage Apportionment required for the Sancrainte Drain.
  - Individual water service connection required for new lot.
  - No Sanitary sewers, septic field required for new lot. Additionally, the applicant should be aware that, in the future, should a sanitary sewer collection system be constructed along Front Road North, each of the lots described under this application will be required to connect and be serviced by said sanitary sewer.
  - Based on the proposal, the new severed lot will require a separate driveway accesses from County Road 20 (Front Road North). This will require necessary review and approvals from the County of Essex.
  - The applicant should be made aware of the existence of Sancriante Drain, a municipal drain which extends along the northern and eastern boundary limits of the property at 1459 Front Road N. Any future structures planned for the existing or proposed severed lot will be subject to set-back requirements from the drain.
- iii) Email dated January 18, 2021 from the Windsor Police Department indicating: The Windsor Police Service has no concerns or objections with the proposed severance being sought to create a residential lot. The outcome from this will not result in difficulties for police to access the property in an emergency or for a call for service in any way.
- iv) Email dated January 11, 2021 from the Fire Department indicating no comments.
- v) Email dated January 18, 2021 from the County of Essex stating:

Please be advised that the County of Essex has reviewed the aforementioned application and the comments provided are engineering related only. This application has not been reviewed from a planning perspective. This road was formerly King's Highway 18 until it was downloaded to the County of Essex.

The minimum setback for any proposed structures on this property must be 85 feet from the center of the original ROW of County Road No. 20 for a proposed residential building or 105 feet from the centre of the right of way for a proposed commercial structure.

Permits are necessary for any changes to existing entrances and structures, or the construction of new entrances and structures. The County of Essex requires the access to the severed parcel be located adjacent to retained parcel.

We are requesting a copy of the Decision of the aforementioned application. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation in this matter.

vi) Planning Report dated January 18, 2021 from Frank Garardo, Secretary Treasurer and Sarah French, Planner.

Committee Discussion:

The Chair introduced the application and asked if there were any members of the public present for this application. There were none. The Planner, Frank Garardo read the purpose of the application. John and Angelo Riolo discussed the concept of the application with the members of the Committee. The Riolos stated that they had applied for the consent originally in 2015 and the consent was approved at that time. The consent lapsed due to renovations on the house taking longer than expected. The Riolos explained that they would like to use the property as a hobby farm containing chickens, ducks, 6-10 colonies of bees and potentially future uses such as greenhouses and a roadside farm stand. They stated that they do not wish to rezone the property to residential as this would hinder the use of the property as a hobby farm. A discussion occurred debating the merits of rezoning the property. It was decided that a severance would not be permitted under the agricultural zoning and therefore a rezoning to residential is considered the appropriate approval process. The applicants will be able to ask Council for additional permission to house livestock on the lands. Planning outlined that livestock may not be supportable due to Provincial Policies, further discussion on whether Livestock would be supportable on the lands would have to be considered as part of a Zoning by-law amendment process. The applicants outlined that the lands are abutting agriculture and any livestock would be minimal in scale. The applicants also stated that they are planning to keep the property in their name. It was noted that under the Planning Act, the applicants have one years from the stamping of the deeds to transfer the property or the consent is no longer valid. The severed property will need to be registered in a different name than the retained property. Frank Garardo read the conditions of the consent and the applicants acknowledged understanding.

The following resolution was put forth:

That application B/18/20 be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That a Reference Plan of the subject property satisfactory to the municipality be deposited in the Registry Office; an electronic and paper copy to be provided to the municipality.
- 2. The applicant to submit to the municipality the deed, in triplicate, acceptable for registration in order that consent may be attached to the original and duplicate and a copy be provided to the municipality.
- 3. That all property taxes be paid in full.
- 4. That the requirements of the County of Essex in accordance with their correspondence dated January 18, 2021 regarding the requirement to provide accesses that are located adjacent to one another be shown on the registered plan and include these in the deeds for the properties be complied with.

- 5. That one driveway access be constructed to the severed property, adjacent to the existing driveway, where one does not exist. That an access permit be obtained for the driveway from the County of Essex and any other requirements to their satisfaction, prior to the stamping of deeds. The access shall be provided to the satisfaction of the municipality.
- 6. That the subject lot be serviced with an appropriate storm drainage system to be developed under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Town Drainage Superintendent.
- 7. That the severed parcel be serviced with municipal water in accordance with and under the supervision of the municipality at the applicant's expense, prior to the stamping of deeds.
- 8. That the developer be required to undertake lot grading plans for the severed and retained lots to the satisfaction of the Building Department.
- 9. That the applicant obtain a report from a certified designer/installer that the existing private septic system serving the existing dwelling does not cross the property lines, that the system is in working order and that its operation will not be affected by the severance, to the satisfaction of the Building Department.
- 10. That an assessment apportionment for any and all drains affected by the severance be completed in accordance with the provisions of the Drainage Act and that all costs associated with said apportionment be paid by the applicant.
- 11. That Council approve the development of the severed lot on private individual septic systems after the soil analysis and septic design for the proposed lot is completed. This requirement shall be fulfilled prior to the stamping of deeds.
- 12. That a parkland fee be paid to the Town of Amherstburg prior to the stamping of the deeds in an amount of \$300 for the severed lot.
- 13. That both the severed and retained parcels be rezoned to Residential Type 1A (R1A) zone.
- 14. That the applicant enter into an Agreement with the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg requiring that the subject property be required to hook into sanitary sewers when they become available. The subject agreement shall be registered on the title of the property.
- 15. That the requirement for the land owners of the severed parcel to engage the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) at the building permit stage to ensure compliance with the Endangered Species Act be registered on title and included in the purchase and sale agreement of the severed lot.
- 16. This consent will be deemed to be refused in accordance with the Planning Act if the above noted conditions are not met within one year from the date of this notice.

# 6.2 Application B/02/21 & A/02/21 – Rick Laframboise – 5775 Concession 5 N (Roll No. 3729-480-000-00400)

Public in Attendance: Rick Laframboise

**B/02/21:** The applicant is proposing to sever a vacant parcel of land with 15.24 m (50 ft) frontage by 47.97 m (157.38 ft) depth and an area of 0.073 hectares(0.18 acres) for the purpose of a lot addition to merge with 5781 Concession 5 N. The proposed retained parcel being 239.37 m (778.78 ft) frontage by an irregular depth has an area of 11.78 hectares (29.11 acres), and is designated Agricultural and Natural Environment in the Town's Official Plan and is zoned Agricultural and Environmental Protection in the Zoning By-law.

**A/02/21:** The applicant is requesting relief from Zoning Bylaw 1999-52, as amended, Section 26(3)(a)(i) which requires a minimum lot area of 40 hectares in an Agricultural (A) Zone. Subsequent to a severance of 0.073 hectares (0.18 acres) from an existing 11.853 hectares (29.29 acres) parcel the retained farm parcel will have an area of 11.78 hectares (29.11 acres). Therefore, the amount of relief requested is 28.22 hectares (69.733 acres).

The following correspondence was received from the various agencies and residents circulated:

i) Letter dated January 18, 2021 from the Essex Region Conservation Authority stating:

The above noted lands are subject to our Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alteration to Shorelines and Watercourses Regulation under the Conservation Authorities Act (Ontario Regulation No. 158/06). The parcel falls within the regulated area of the Canard River. The property owner will be required to obtain a Permit and/or Clearance from the Essex Region Conservation Authority prior to any future construction or site alteration or other activities affected by Section 28 of the Conservation Authorities Act.

Our office has reviewed the proposal and has no concerns relating to stormwater management.

The subject property is within, and/or is adjacent to (within 120 metres of), a natural heritage feature that is identified as a significant wetland, significant woodland, significant valleyland, significant wildlife habitat under the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS).

Section 2.1.4 of the PPS, 2020 states - "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted in "significant wetlands..." and "significant coastal wetlands." Section 2.15 of the PPS states - Development and site alterations shall not be permitted in significant woodland... and significant valleyland... and significant wildlife habitat...unless it has been demonstrated that there will be no negative impacts on the natural features or on their ecological functions.

We note that the subject property is adjacent to (within 120 m of) a natural heritage feature that may meet the criteria for significance under the PPS. Section 2.1.8 of the PPS, 2020 states – "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted on adjacent lands to the natural heritage features and areas identified in policies 2.1.4, 2.1.5 and 2.1.6 unless the ecological function of the adjacent lands has been evaluated and it has been demonstrated that there will be no negative impacts on the natural features or on their ecological functions."

Our information indicates that the subject property may support habitat of endangered species and threatened species. As per Section 2.1.7 of the PPS, 2020 – "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted in habitat of endangered species and threatened species, except in accordance with

#### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

1. **By-law 2021-021** being a by-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 1999-52, to amend the zoning for the subject lands known 1459 Front Road North, be taken as having been read three times and finally passed and the Mayor and Clerk **BE AUTHORIZED** to sign same.

## 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

The Statutory Public Meeting was held at 5:00 p.m., April 12, 2021 to hear public comments on an application for a Zoning By-law Amendment for 1459 Front Road North (Conc 1, Pt Lot 27), Amherstburg. The Zoning By-law Amendment (ZBA) will change the zoning for the subject lands from the "Zone Change from A to R1A" and "Zone Change from A to R1A-10". The parcel was the subject of an application for consent (File B/18/20) to sever a residential building lot. The rezoning of the subject property to R1A is a condition of the consent decision.

#### 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

There were no public comments submitted to the Planning Department prior to the Statutory Public Meeting and there were no members of the public in attendance at the meeting. Questions and issues were raised by members of Council during the Statutory Public Meeting. The questions and issues are addressed in the following table.

Comment	Administration's Response
Location of lot - and Official Plan amendment	The subject lands are located on Front Road North and within the residential settlement area. An Official Plan amendment would not be supported under Provincial Policy to create an undersized agriculture lot. Furthermore, the lands are within the settlement area and consistent with the settlement area boundaries of the County of Essex Official Plan.
Agricultural parcels- Hobby farms	Provincial Policy does not support the creation of any new vacant undersized agricultural parcels. A severance was not supported by the Committee of Adjustment (COA), unless the condition of rezoning the lands to Residential was fulfilled.
	Provincial policy does not support any further vacant lot creation in agricultural designated lands whether for retirement or for hobby purposes. In this instance the lands are located within the settlement area and are intended for residential purposes in the Town of Amherstburg Official Plan.
	The COA imposed a condition that the lands are designated too residential prior to creation of a new legally conveyable lot.
	If the lands remain in the agriculture designation, then they would be in contravention of the Town of Amherstburg Official Plan and within contravention of Provincial Policy for creating vacant undersized Agricultural lots.
Livestock	The by-law amendment would only permit a housing area/stall area of 20 square meters. Furthermore, the by-law would require that the housing area (e.g. stalls, coops) would have to be located no closer than 100 meters from the adjacent dwelling.
	The Ontario Ministry of Agriculture Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) provides local municipalities with Planning tools including Minimum Distance Separation (MDS) guidelines and nutrient management protocols for livestock owners.
	Municipalities are responsible for ensuring that MDS setbacks are met when reviewing land use planning applications (e.g. lot creation applications) or building

	permits. The MDS guidelines provide municipalities with appropriate setbacks required for each type of proposed livestock facility. Furthermore, there is certain thresholds for requiring nutrient management plans and manure storage plans.
Environmental- hedgerow	The proposal would create a new building lot. The applicants have consulted with MECP and are capable of moving forward with building and structures without contravention. The applicants will be required to further contact MECP during any construction phases. The Planning Division circulates all Planning Act applications to the local conservation board for comments and furthermore directs all applicants to consult with MECP in regards to Ministry legislation.
R1A-10	The zoning includes a special exemption for the continuation of the existing livestock.
Registration of the parcels	Council made comment on the registration of the same name. This was referred in the COA minutes because the applicant outlined they will be maintaining ownership of the severed parcel.
OP designations of environmental areas	A comment was made on the OP update of environmental areas. The OP update will incorporate some significant areas which meet the criteria of Provincial legislation.

## 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

The recommendation presents little to no risk to the municipality. Should Council not approve the proposed application for ZBA, the consent which has been approved by the Committee of Adjustment could not be finalized. The residential building lot could then not be severed and transferred.

## 5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

All costs associated with the application are the responsibility of the applicant.

## 6. <u>CONSULTATIONS</u>:

No further consultations are required on this application. All statutory notice requirements and consultations were met through the planning process.

# 7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>:

Administration recommends that Zoning By-law 2021-021 be approved by Council, given three readings and finally passed and the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to sign same.

The parcel is designated Low Density Residential in the Town's Official Plan. The lands described above are subject to an application for consent (File B/18/20) to sever a residential building lot. The severed residential building lot will be rezoned to R1A-10 and the retained lot will be rezoned to R1A.

**THE EFFECT OF THE ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT** will be to allow for general residential uses on the subject properties. The amendment will bring the zoning of both the severed and retained parcels in line with the Official Plan designation of Low Density Residential. 






# 6.1 Application B/18/20 – John & Angela Riolo – 1459 Front Rd N (Roll No. 3729-460-000-10500)

Public in Attendance: John and Angela Riolo, Mike Collavino

**B/18/20:** The applicant is proposing to sever a parcel being 48.15 m (158 ft.) frontage by an irregular depth with an area of approximately 0.756 hectares (1.87 acres) for purposes

of creating a new residential building lot. The remaining parcel being 30.48 m (100 ft.) frontage by an irregular depth with an area of 2228.28 square metres (23,985 sq. ft.) contains one single detached dwelling and a detached garage. The subject property is Zoned Agriculture and designated Low Density Residential in the Town's Official Plan.

The following correspondence was received from the various agencies and residents circulated:

i) Letter dated January 19, 2021 from the Essex Region Conservation Authority stating:

The above noted lands are subject to our Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alteration to Shorelines and Watercourses Regulation under the Conservation Authorities Act (Ontario Regulation No. 158/06). The parcel falls within the regulated area of the Rosario Bezaire Drain, Sancrainte Drain and Lake St. Clair. The property owner will be required to obtain a Permit and/or Clearance from the Essex Region Conservation Authority prior to any future

construction or site alteration or other activities affected by Section 28 of the Conservation Authorities Act.

Our office has reviewed the proposal and has no concerns relating to stormwater management.

Our information indicates that the subject property may support habitat of endangered species and threatened species. As per Section 2.1.7 of the PPS, 2020 – "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted in habitat of endangered species and threatened species, except in accordance with provincial and federal requirements". All species listed as endangered or threatened (aquatic species, plants, mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians, etc.) as well as their related habitats, are protected under the Ontario Endangered Species Act. Prior to initiating any proposed works on this property, it is the proponent's responsibility to contact the Species at Risk Branch of the Ontario Ministry of Environment, Conservation & Parks (MECP) to ensure all issues related to the Endangered Species Act are addressed. All inquiries regarding the Endangered Species Act should be made with Permissions and Compliance Section of the MECP (e-mail address: <u>SAROntario@ontario.ca</u>).

With the review of background information and aerial photograph, ERCA has no objection to this application for consent.

  - Drainage Apportionment required for the Sancrainte Drain.
  - Individual water service connection required for new lot.
  - No Sanitary sewers, septic field required for new lot. Additionally, the applicant should be aware that, in the future, should a sanitary sewer collection system be constructed along Front Road North, each of the lots described under this application will be required to connect and be serviced by said sanitary sewer.
  - Based on the proposal, the new severed lot will require a separate driveway accesses from County Road 20 (Front Road North). This will require necessary review and approvals from the County of Essex.

The minimum setback for any proposed structures on this property must be 85 feet from the center of the original ROW of County Road No. 20 for a proposed residential building or 105 feet from the centre of the right of way for a proposed commercial structure.

Permits are necessary for any changes to existing entrances and structures, or the construction of new entrances and structures. The County of Essex requires the access to the severed parcel be located adjacent to retained parcel.

We are requesting a copy of the Decision of the aforementioned application. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation in this matter.

vi) Planning Report dated January 18, 2021 from Frank Garardo, Secretary Treasurer and Sarah French, Planner.

Committee Discussion:

The Chair introduced the application and asked if there were any members of the public present for this application. There were none. The Planner, Frank Garardo read the purpose of the application. John and Angelo Riolo discussed the concept of the application with the members of the Committee. The Riolos stated that they had applied for the consent originally in 2015 and the consent was approved at that time. The consent lapsed due to renovations on the house taking longer than expected. The Riolos explained that they would like to use the property as a hobby farm containing chickens, ducks, 6-10 colonies of bees and potentially future uses such as greenhouses and a roadside farm stand. They stated that they do not wish to rezone the property to residential as this would hinder the use of the property as a hobby farm. A discussion occurred debating the merits of rezoning the property. It was decided that a severance would not be permitted under the agricultural zoning and therefore a rezoning to residential is considered the appropriate approval process. The applicants will be able to ask Council for additional permission to house livestock on the lands. Planning outlined that livestock may not be supportable due to Provincial Policies, further discussion on whether Livestock would be supportable on the lands would have to be considered as part of a Zoning by-law amendment process. Our office has reviewed the proposal and has no concerns relating to stormwater management.

The subject property is within, and/or is adjacent to (within 120 metres of), a natural heritage feature that is identified as a significant wetland, significant woodland, significant valleyland, significant wildlife habitat under the Provincial Policy Statement (PPS).

Section 2.1.4 of the PPS, 2020 states - "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted in "significant wetlands..." and "significant coastal wetlands." Section 2.15 of the PPS states - Development and site alterations shall not be permitted in significant woodland... and significant valleyland... and significant wildlife habitat...unless it has been demonstrated that there will be no negative impacts on the natural features or on their ecological functions.

We note that the subject property is adjacent to (within 120 m of) a natural heritage feature that may meet the criteria for significance under the PPS. Section 2.1.8 of the PPS, 2020 states – "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted on adjacent lands to the natural heritage features and areas identified in policies 2.1.4, 2.1.5 and 2.1.6 unless the ecological function of the adjacent lands has been evaluated and it has been demonstrated that there will be no negative impacts on the natural features or on their ecological functions."

#### PLANNING ADVISORY SERVICE TO PLANNING AUTHORITIES - NATURAL HERITAGE POLICIES OF THE PPS, 2020

The following comments are provided from our perspective as an advisory service provider to the Planning Authority on matters related to natural heritage and natural heritage systems as outlined in Section 2.1 of the Provincial Policy Statement of the *Planning Act*. The comments in this section do not necessarily represent the provincial position and are advisory in nature for the consideration of the Planning Authority.

<u>RE: Severance and Residential Development – 1459 Front Road N, Amherstburg and the Endangered Species Act, 2007</u>

The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) Species at Risk Branch (SARB) has reviewed the information provided regarding the proposed severance and residential development at 1459 Front Road North in the Town of Amherstburg.

Based on the information that has been provided, MECP understands that the currently proposal is a lot severance to allow for a future residential development (e.g. single house, driveway, barn) and that your request for species at risk information is to assist in discussions with the municipality regarding building permits. The *Endangered Species Act, 2007* (ESA 2007) provides for the protection of endangered and threatened species listed on the Species at Risk in Ontario (SARO) List. The Committee on the Status of Species at Risk in Ontario (COSSARO) meets regularly to evaluate species for listing and/or re-evaluate species already listed. As a result, species designations may change that could in turn change the level of protection they receive under the ESA 2007. Also, habitat protection provisions for a species may change over time. For this reason, MECP cannot provide responses giving clearance for conceptual site alterations or future projects with no definitive timeline.

However, MECP would like to provide the additional information for your discussions with the Town of Amherstburg. There are known occurrences of the following endangered and threatened species at risk (SAR) the general area of the proposed development:

- Butler's Gartersnake (endangered) receives species and general habitat protection
- Eastern Foxsnake Carolinian population (endangered) receives species and regulated habitat protection. The property falls within regulated habitat for this species.
- Queensnake (endangered) receives species and regulated habitat protection
- Spiny Softshell (endangered) receives species and general habitat protection
- Blanding's Turtle (threatened) receives species and general habitat protection

MECP understands the majority of the portion of property to be severed is manicured lawn (i.e. mowed weekly). If the proposed development is restricted to the mowed area of the property and no vegetation removal is proposed (i.e. the naturalized area on the northern, eastern and southern property boundary will not be impacted in any way by the development), it is likely that impacts to species at risk and protected habitat can be avoided with appropriate mitigation measures (e.g. exclusion fencing during construction). It is strongly recommended that MECP be contacted (<u>SAROntario@ontario.ca</u>) when the finalized building footprint and a timeline for construction are available in order for MECP to provide recommendations on mitigation measures. The position of SARB is based on the information that has been provided for this project. Please contact SARB as soon as possible (<u>SAROntario@ontario.ca</u>) to discuss next steps should any of the following situations arise:

- Information has not been made available and considered in MECP's review;
- New information comes to light that changes the conclusions; or,
- If on-site conditions and circumstances change so as to alter the basis for the conclusions.

#### By-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 1999-52 1459 Front Road North (Conc 1, Pt Lot 27), Amherstburg

**WHEREAS** By-law 1999-52, as amended, is a land use control by-law regulating the use of lands and the character, location and use of buildings and structures within the Town of Amherstburg;

**AND WHEREAS** the Council of the Town of Amherstburg deems it appropriate and in the best interest of proper planning to amend By-law 1999-52, as herein provided;

**AND WHEREAS** this By-law conforms to the Official Plan for the Town of Amherstburg;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg enacts as follows:

- Schedule "A", Map 10 of By-law 1999-52, as amended, is hereby amended by changing the zone symbol on those lands shown as "Zone Change from A to R1A" and "Zone Change from A to R1A-10" on Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming part of this By-law from "Agricultural (A) Zone" to "Residential Type 1A (R1A) Zone" and "Special Provision Residential Type 1A (R1A-10) Zone".
- 2. "Section 6(4)(i) R1A-10 (E/S Front Road North)

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this By-law to the contrary, within any area zoned R1A-10 on Schedule 'A' hereto, the zone requirements of Section 6 of this By-law shall apply with the exception of the following:

- (i) Uses Permitted
  - 1. Livestock for personal use may also be kept but must be housed no closer than 100 metres to the closest adjoining dwelling and must be contained in livestock facility no larger than twenty (20) square metres.
  - 2. Any use permitted in the R1A Zone."
- 4. THIS By-law shall take effect from the date of passage by Council and shall come into force in accordance with Sections 34 of the Planning Act, R.S.0. 1990, c.P. 13.



#### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

1. **By-law 2021-017** being a by-law to amend Zoning By-law No. 1999-52, to amend the zoning for the subject lands known as E/S Concession 7, be taken as having been read three times and finally passed and the Mayor and Clerk **BE AUTHORIZED** to sign same.

#### 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

The Statutory Public Meeting was held at 5:00 p.m., April 12, 2021 to hear public comments on an application for a Zoning By-law Amendment for the E/S Concession 7 (Conc 7, Pt Lots 80 and 81), Amherstburg. The Zoning By-law Amendment (ZBA) will change the zoning for the subject lands from the "Agricultural (A) Zone" to "Special Provision Agricultural (A-36) Zone". The parcel was the subject of an application for consent (File B/07/21) to sever a dwelling which is surplus to the needs of the farming operation. The rezoning of the subject property to A-36 is a condition of the consent decision.

#### 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

At the statutory public meeting there were no public comments. Administration outlined the Provincial requirement for prohibiting dwellings on the remnant farm parcel. Council raised the question on the location of the property, Concession 7 is only located south of Alma Street in the former Malden Township and is not further defined by north and south. The subject lands were severed from 7397 Concession 7.

As noted above, the applicant severed a parcel of land being 73.1 m (200 ft)  $\pm$  frontage by 117.35 m (385 ft)  $\pm$  depth with an area of 0.72 ha (1.77 acres)  $\pm$  which includes a single detached dwelling and one accessory structure which are surplus to the needs of the farming operation. The residence which was the subject of the severance is located at 7397 Concession 7, is not subject to this rezoning. At conclusion of the severance, the remaining farm parcel subject of the recommended ZBA will have a total area of 70.76 acres  $\pm$ .

The subject parcel is zoned Agriculture in the Zoning By-Law and Agriculture in the Town's Official Plan. The effect of the ZBA will allow for general agricultural uses on the subject property and prohibit any new dwelling units on the remnant land.

The application is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement, specifically Section 2.3.4.1(c) which provides for lot creation for a residence surplus to a farming operation as a result of farm consolidation provided that new residential dwellings are prohibited on any vacant remnant parcel created by the severance. The application is also in conformity with the Town's Official Plan specifically Section 3.2.2(14) which provides for surplus dwelling severances subject to the remnant parcel being rezoned to ensure no new dwelling units will be permitted. The proposed lot size as well as the intended land use for the subject parcel complies with the zone requirements for the Special Provision Agricultural Zone.

#### 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

The recommendation presents little to no risk to the municipality. Should Council not approve the proposed application for ZBA, the consent which has been approved by the Committee of Adjustment could not be finalized. The home which is surplus to the needs of the farming operation could then not be severed and transferred.

#### 5. <u>FINANCIAL MATTERS</u>:

All costs associated with the application are the responsibility of the applicant.

#### 6. <u>CONSULTATIONS</u>:

No further consultations are required on this application. All statutory notice requirements and consultations were met through the planning process.

#### 7. <u>CONCLUSION</u>:

Administration recommends that Zoning By-law 2021-017 be approved by Council, given three readings and finally passed and the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to sign same.

**TAKE NOTICE** that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg will hold a public meeting, by electronic means, on **Monday, April 12, 2021 commencing at 5:00 p.m.** in the Town of Amherstburg Council Chambers, 271 Sandwich Street South, Amherstburg, Ontario. The purpose of this meeting is to consider a proposed amendment to the Town of Amherstburg Zoning By-law 1999-52, under Section 34 of the Planning Act.

**THE SUBJECT LANDS** affected by the proposed amendment are described as Part of Lots 80 and 81, Concession 7, municipally known as the farm parcel severed from 7397 Concession 7. The property is vacant agricultural land and the total area subject to the rezoning is 28.64 hectares (70.76 acres). (see key map below)

**THE PURPOSE OF THE AMENDMENT TO ZONING BY-LAW No. 1999-52** is to change the zoning of the subject lands noted above from the **"Agricultural (A) Zone"** to **"Special Provision Agricultural (A-36) Zone"**. The parcel is designated Agricultural in the Town's Official Plan. The lands described above are subject to an application for consent (File B/07/21) to sever a dwelling which is surplus to the needs of a farming operation.

**THE EFFECT OF THE ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT** will be to allow for general agricultural use on the subject property and prohibit any new dwelling unit on the land. The "Special Provision Agricultural (A-36) Zone" is established as a site specific zone for the retained agricultural parcel created through consent, to prohibit new residential uses on these lands.



**A/05/21**: The applicant is requesting relief from Zoning By-law 1999-52, as amended, Section 26(3)(a)(i) which requires a minimum lot area of 40 hectares in an Agricultural (A) Zone. Subsequent to a severance of a 0.19 hectares (0.47 acres) ± lot addition and a 0.72 ha (1.77 acres) ± surplus dwelling from an existing 29.54 hectares (73 acres) parcel the retained farm parcel will have an area of 28.64 hectares (70.76 acres). Therefore, the amount of relief requested is 11.36 hectares (28.07 acres).

The following correspondence was received from the various agencies and residents circulated:

i) Letter dated February 16, 2021 from the Essex Region Conservation Authority stating:

The above noted lands are subject to our Development, Interference with Wetlands and Alteration to Shorelines and Watercourses Regulation under the Conservation Authorities Act (Ontario Regulation No. 158/06). The parcel falls within the regulated area of the 7th Concession Road Drain and Bailey Drain. The property owner will be required to obtain a Permit and/or Clearance from the Essex Region Conservation Authority prior to any future construction or site alteration or other activities affected by Section 28 of the Conservation Authorities Act.

Our office has reviewed the proposal and has no concerns relating to stormwater management.

With the review of background information and aerial photograph, ERCA has no objection to these applications for Minor Variance and Consent.

- ii) Email dated February 17, 2021 from the Windsor Police Department stating that: The Windsor Police Service has no objections with the proposed severances and minimum lot area. These changes will not impair police service delivery to the property.
- iii) Email dated February 10, 2021 from the Building division stating that both properties must:
  - Demonstrate location of septic system. Ensure existing septic system is in working order, provide documentation by a certified qualified septic contractor
- iv) Email dated February 9, 2021 from the Fire Department indicating no issues.
- v) Email dated February 16, 2021 from the Engineering & Public Works Department indicating the following:
  - Drainage Apportionment required for the 7th Concession Road Drain North and Long Marsh Drain
  - A new access culvert will be required over the 7th Concession Road Drain North to access the retained agricultural land. This will require an engineer's report under the Drainage Act. This process has already been started due to an existing bridge repair and improvement project on the 7th Concession Road Drain North. EPW has previously had discussions with the applicants relating to this condition.

- 7. That should access be required for the retained or severed lot, access be completed in accordance with the provisions of the Drainage Act if it is required to cross a Municipal Drain. If access is required to cross a roadside ditch, it will be completed according to the Town right-of-way policies or permitting policies from the County of Essex, should the ditch be within the County right-of-way. The

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access shall be provided to each lot to the satisfaction of the municipality.

The comments in this section do not necessarily represent the provincial position and are advisory in nature for the consideration of the Planning Authority.

We note that the subject property is adjacent to (within 120 m of) a natural heritage feature that may meet the criteria for significance under the PPS. Section 2.1.8 of the PPS, 2020 states – "Development and site alteration shall not be permitted on adjacent lands to the natural heritage features and areas identified in policies 2.1.4, 2.1.5 and 2.1.6 unless the ecological function of the adjacent lands has been evaluated and it has been demonstrated that there will be no negative impacts on the natural features or on their ecological functions."

The subject property is not within or adjacent to any natural heritage feature that may meet the criteria for significance as defined by the PPS. Based on our review, we have no objection to the application with respect to the natural heritage policies of the PPS.

#### FINAL RECOMMENDATION

With the review of background information and aerial photograph, ERCA has no objection to this application for Zoning By-Law amendment.



#### 1. <u>RECOMMENDATION:</u>

It is recommended that:

- 1. The Inclusive Community Program Advisory Steering Committee **BE STRUCK** to serve from April 26, 2021 to March 31, 2022 as outlined in the report of April 2, 2021 entitled, *Inclusive Community Program (ICP) Advisory Steering Committee*;
- 2. The ICP Advisory Steering Committee Terms of Reference **BE ADOPTED** as presented;
- 3. Members **BE APPOINTED** to the ICP Advisory Steering Committee as per the Terms of Reference:
  - a. William Whittall (current AAAC Chair);
  - b. Kathy DiBartolomeo (current SAC Chair);
  - c. Councillor Marc Renaud;
  - d. Christine Easterbrook, (current Member of AAAC)
  - e. Heather Vandenham, (current Member of the SAC)
  - f. The Director, President or Vice President of the Amherstburg Freedom Museum; and,
  - g. The Executive Director of the Essex County Nurse Practitioner Led Clinic;
- 4. An over-expenditure in the CAO's Office budget centre, professional fees expense account, not to exceed \$60,000 including net HST **BE APPROVED** to be funded by the Inclusive Community Grant Program; and,
- 5. The CAO **BE AUTHORIZED** to execute the one-time agreement with the Province of Ontario Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility in accordance with Section 6.2.18 of the Delegation of Powers and Duties Policy.

## 2. <u>BACKGROUND</u>:

Council continues to be advised on matters of accessibility, equality and inclusivity by the Amherstburg Accessibility Advisory Committee.

The Seniors Advisory Committee assists with establishing lines of communication for seniors, providing an opportunity for seniors to bring forth concerns and to make constructive suggestions and be involved in the solution, determine issues affecting seniors as a whole, provide a service and a voice for seniors, and provide a focus for ideas to make Amherstburg a welcome barrier-free place for seniors to live.

On November 9, 2020 the Ministry of Seniors and Accessibility (Ministry) news release "Ontario Supporting Inclusive Communities for All Ages and Abilities" proclaimed:

"Our government is committed to helping seniors and people with disabilities stay safe, active and socially connected, especially during COVID-19," said Raymond Cho, Minister for Seniors and Accessibility. "After hosting numerous consultations with Ontario's seniors and disability advocates, we have heard our older adults want services that will keep them engaged and have strong ties with their neighbours and communities. Our government's new Inclusive Community Grants program will support projects that allow Ontarians of all ages and abilities to participate in local programs across our great province."

Through the Inclusive Community Grant, municipalities and local organizations across Ontario can receive up to \$60,000 for projects that foster inclusive community involvement for older adults and people of all abilities, using the province's age-friendly community planning guide."

The funding guidelines indicate that priority has been given to projects that target small urban/rural communities; and/or support diverse populations of older adults or persons with disabilities (including but not limited to, indigenous, immigrant, Francophone, racialized, and 2SLGBTQI+ populations); and/or respond to the emerging needs of older adults, including those with disabilities, in a changing environment resulting from the global COVID-19 pandemic.

Inclusive communities align directly with the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility's "Advancing Accessibility in Ontario" framework which aims to make the province more inclusive and accessible for everyone by focusing on 4 key areas:

- Breaking down barriers in the built environment
- Government leading by example
- Increasing participation in the economy for people with disabilities
- Improving understanding and awareness about accessibility

Inclusive communities are also Age-Friendly Communities (AFC) – a World Health Organization endorsed a planning and evaluation framework that has been adopted in Canada. The AFC approach fosters local partnerships and provides a guide for local needs assessment and action planning. Older adults and people with disabilities are engaged through each step of the process. The World Health Organization (WHO) identified 8 domains of community life that overlap and intersect to affect an individual's personal well-being and their independent and active living in physical and social environments:

- Outdoor Spaces and City Buildings
- Transportation
- Housing
- Communication and Information
- Social, Recreational and Cultural Participation
- Civic Participation and Volunteering
- Community Support and Health Services
- Respect and Social Inclusion

In late 2020, Administration submitted an application for funding of up to \$60,000 under the Inclusive Community Grant Program (ICGP) over thirteen months to assess the needs of older adults and persons with disabilities and prepare an action plan that improves their well-being and promotes independence and active living.

On March 9, 2021 the Town of Amherstburg was advised by the Ministry of Seniors and Accessibility that the Town's ICGP application had been approved for funding up to \$60,000, pending finalization of an agreement between the Town and the Ministry. The grant funded initiative must be completed by March 31, 2022.

The Council adopted Local Boards/Committees – Terms of Reference allows for Ad-Hoc Committees to be created to perform a specific task and are dissolved when the task is completed. The establishment of this committee will meet that criteria .The Committee has no authority for decision making or independent actions.

#### 3. <u>DISCUSSION</u>:

The primary purpose of this initiative is to help Amherstburg to become an age-friendly community by ensuring that the needs of the residents of all ages and abilities are considered in every stage of community planning and development. The Town will engage a consultant to complete a Needs Assessment and Action Plan which will involve obtaining direct input from those most affected, seniors 55+, older adults 65+ and persons with disabilities and disenfranchised populations in the immediate region, community stakeholders, including municipal officials, local businesses, and providers in the recreational and health sectors.

As part of the initiative, Administration recommends the creation of a special purpose Adhoc Committee, the Inclusive Community Program (ICP) Advisory Steering Committee. The ICP Advisory Steering Committee would work closely with the project consultants to identify the opportunities and challenges of an aging population by creating physical and social environments that support independent and active living and enable older adults and people with disabilities to continue contributing to all aspects of community life.

The Terms of Reference for this Committee have been drafted to ensure a balance of both the Amherstburg Accessibility Advisory Committee (AAAC) and Seniors Advisory

Committee (SAC) membership. This avoids a majority of members from either body being appointed and therefore constituting a meeting of those bodies, while ensuring a diverse range of perspectives from Council's appointed advisory bodies most associated with this initiative. Additionally, Administration recommends that a member of the local health community from the Nurse Practitioner Led Clinic be appointed as a stakeholder. Finally, a further stakeholder member is recommended from the Amherstburg Freedom Museum Board of Directors. As Council is no doubt aware, historically the Town of Amherstburg was a chief entry point into Canada for those escaping slavery. The Amherstburg Freedom Museum preserves those histories and serves as a cultural touchstone for the community and abroad, preserving and promoting inclusivity, diversity and equality. Council representation on this committee is perhaps most appropriate for Councillor Marc Renaud, who serves as the Council representative for both the AAAC and SAC. His involvement with both committees will serve this Ad-hoc Committee by providing some historical knowledge of both AAAC and SAC undertakings. Additional further consultations with marginalized or identified populations, minorities and Indigenous persons will occur throughout the process, as this is the purpose of the grant.

The Needs Assessment and Action Plan developed under this initiative will be recommended to Council for adoption and will inform the Town's strategic plans moving forward.

#### Community Engagement

Over the past year Town operations have been substantially impacted by COVID-19. The pandemic has forced us to consider alternate ways of meeting with Council to ensure the business of the Town moves forward all while maintaining safe protocols to limit the spread of COVID-19 among staff, council and the community. Administration has had to change its way of thinking and come up with creative ways to ensure that it maintains accountability and transparency of operations and engage individuals in alternative ways.

They include, but are not limited to:

- Phone calls
- Mail outs
- Everbridge Mass Notification
- Use of community networks
- In-person gatherings (when COVID-19 permits, subject to provincial restrictions)
- Social media platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, etc.
- Town Website
- Webinar and meeting software such as Zoom for virtual real-time engagement
- Survey platforms such as Talk the Burg.
- Virtual Open Houses consisting of display boards and written information regarding the project and ways to provide feedback

When considering community engagement for this Ad-hoc Committee and other Town business, the tools above will be considered based on the type of engagement required.

## 4. <u>RISK ANALYSIS:</u>

The establishment of an ICP Advisory Steering Committee to assist in this initiative will ensure greater consultation and inclusivity, reducing the risk of failing to communicate with areas or represent divergent perspectives.

The proposed composition of the Committee balances these diverse perspectives while avoiding risks associated with a majority of members of any existing advisory committee meeting to discuss mandate items outside of a scheduled meeting of that body.

The pandemic emergency has stretched already limited Administrative resources beyond their capacity, requiring the reduction or deferral of service levels being offered. For some time, only the Committee of Adjustment and the Drainage Board have been meeting virtually to ensure the Town remains compliant with legislation. It is unknown when the current pandemic will be over and Town business must continue to move forward. In an effort to do so Administration is of the opinion that all advisory meetings should resume through the Town's zoom meeting platform. These meetings will provide the same public participation (through livestream) and delegation processes (through Zoom) as Council meetings. This same vehicle is available for many governments to move forward during the pandemic. Should Council wish not move forward with this engagement solution for advisory committees, it may result in political criticism. Advisory Committees are required to follow procedural rules and meetings will be conducted with a quorum of members which is the current practice. Should a member require an accommodation, those requests will be assessed by Administration and brought forward for Council approval where unbudgeted cost implications might occur.

#### 5. FINANCIAL MATTERS:

The Town has been awarded a grant in the sum of \$60,000 for the creation of an Inclusive Community Program. There are no associated expenses with the striking of a committee to provide advice on this grant. However, approval is requested for an over-expenditure in the CAO's Office budget centre professional fees expense account for up to \$60,000 including net HST to fund consulting services for development of the Needs Assessment and Action Plan; this cost would be funded by the ICGP.

Any costs associated with implementation of the ICP action plan would be brought forward for consideration in future budgets.

The creation of an Inclusive Community Program (ICP) Advisory Steering Committee will assist the Town in creating a plan which seeks input and perspectives from all.

# **TERMS OF REFERENCE**

## 1. COMMITTEE NAME

This committee shall be known as the Inclusive Community Program (ICP) Advisory Steering Committee.

## 2. MANDATE

- 2.1. The mandate of this body is to provide recommendations relative to the Inclusive Community Program Initiative to support the creation of age-friendly communities by ensuring that the needs of residents of Amherstburg of all ages and abilities are considered at every stage of community planning, engagement and report submission.
- 2.2. The ICP Advisory Steering Committee will provide recommendations to identify the opportunities and challenges of an aging population by creating physical and social environments that support independent and active living, enabling older adults and people with disabilities to achieve equal participation in all aspects of community life.

## 3. <u>SCOPE</u>

- 3.1. The term of the ICP Advisory Steering Committee will be from April 1, 2021 to March 31, 2022.
  - 3.1.1. The Terms of Reference for this body shall apply to appointed members for the duration of their appointment.
- 3.2. The Terms of Reference for this body may be reviewed, as required, at the discretion of Council, the CAO, or designate.

#### 4. DEFINITIONS

- 4.1. <u>Advisory Steering Committee</u> means an ad-hoc advisory committee of the Town of Amherstburg. The ICP Advisory Steering Committee is a special project committee.
- 4.2. <u>Age Friendly Communities (AFC)</u> refers to the World Health Organization (WHO) strategy to facilitate the inclusion of older persons to make the world more age-friendly. That is, to better adapt their structures and services to the needs of their ageing populations. An age-friendly world enables people of all ages to actively participate in community activities and treats everyone with respect, regardless of their age. It is a place that makes it easy for older people to stay connected to people that are important to them. And it helps people stay healthy and active even at the oldest ages and provides appropriate support to those who can no longer look after themselves. This planning and evaluation framework has been adopted for use by the senior levels of government.

- 4.3. Inclusive Community Program Initiative refers to the Town of Amherstburg grant submission to the Ministry of Seniors and Accessibility which prioritized projects that target small urban/rural communities and/or support diverse populations of older adults or persons with disabilities. Inclusive Communities are communities which work to meet the needs of underserved and underrepresented communities including, but not limited to, indigenous, immigrant, Francophone, racialized, and 2SLGBTQI+ populations.
- 4.4. <u>Terms of Reference</u> is a document outlining the mandate and local board or committee operational details, including, but not limited to; composition, activities, term, quorum, meeting schedule and staff roles. Terms of Reference are required to align with legislative responsibilities and Council adopted strategic priorities. Local board and committee terms of reference require Council adoption.
- 4.5. **World Health Organization (WHO)** refers to the global health organization established in1948 by the United Nations and inclusive of diplomats from all over the world.

Common definitions, acronyms, and terms are available in the Glossary located on the Town's webpage.

## 5. INTERPRETATIONS

Any reference in this document to any statute or any section of a statute shall, unless expressly stated, be deemed to be reference to the statute as amended, restated or re-enacted from time to time. Any references to a by-law or Town policy shall be deemed to be a reference to the most recent passed policy or by-law and any replacements thereto.

## 6. GENERAL CONDITIONS

#### 6.1. Mandate

- 6.1.1. The principles behind the creation of inclusive communities align directly with the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility's "Advancing Accessibility in Ontario Framework" which aims to make the province more inclusive and accessible for everyone by focusing on four key areas:
  - 6.1.1.1. Breaking down barriers in the built environment;
  - 6.1.1.2. Government leading by example;
  - 6.1.1.3. Increasing participation in the economy for people with disabilities;
  - 6.1.1.4. Improving understanding and awareness about accessibility.
- 6.1.2. Central to the development of inclusive communities is the planning and evaluation framework of the World Health Organization for the creation of Age-Friendly Communities (AFC). The AFC approach fosters local partnerships and provides a guide for local needs assessment and action planning. Older adults and people with disabilities are engaged through each step of the process. The World Health Organization (WHO) identified eight (8) domains of community life that overlap and intersect to affect an individual's personal well-being and their independent and active living in physical and social environments:
  - 6.1.2.1. Outdoor Spaces and Municipal Buildings;
  - 6.1.2.2. Transportation;
  - 6.1.2.3. Housing;

- 6.1.2.4. Communication and Information;
- 6.1.2.5. Social, Recreational and Cultural Participation;
- 6.1.2.6. Civic Participation and Volunteering;
- 6.1.2.7. Community Support and Health Services;
- 6.1.2.8. Respect and Social Inclusion
- 6.1.3. Key elements of this project will include a needs assessment, targeting older adults and persons with disabilities, in the context of the eight domains, with an action plan aimed at improving their well-being and promoting independence and active living.
- 6.1.4. The action plan will provide both a general overview of the needs and a more focused approach on key/priority areas outlining tactics/strategies for implementation and improvement along with measurable performance metrics tied to success. The action plan will advance prioritized short-term (within the next 12 months), medium (12 to 24 months) and longer-term (strategic up to 3 years) improvement recommendations that will better support older adults and persons with disabilities in Amherstburg.

## 6.2. Key Objectives of the ICP:

- 6.2.1. The key objectives of the ICP Advisory Steering Committee will be:
  - 6.2.1.1. Directly engaging older adults, persons with disabilities and including, but limited to: indigenous, immigrant, Francophone, racialized, 2SLGBTQI+ populations. This engagement will inform the creation, development and design of needs assessments and action plans for the creation of a more inclusive community. All population groups are critical to an inclusive vision for what the age-friendly community of the future should look like.
  - 6.2.1.2. Ensuring that the survey population of seniors is diverse and inclusive.
  - 6.2.1.3. Establishing a baseline (community profile) on the population to be served, current service offerings, identifying service gaps and potential solutions to address unmet needs.
  - 6.2.1.4. Advancing local prioritized short, medium, and longer-term improvement projects that will better support older adults, persons with disabilities and underserved populations in the Town of Amherstburg.
  - 6.2.1.5. Developing measurable performance metrics to assess future improvement.
  - 6.2.1.6. Ensure that this work results in the Town of Amherstburg becoming a community leader where older adults and persons with disabilities feel supported to live independently, leading healthy, active, safe and socially connected lives.
  - 6.2.1.7. Seek opportunities to share the inclusive community project key findings and lessons learned with the other lower tier communities with a broader aim of initiating this productive inclusive change across Essex County.

#### 6.3. Deliverables

- 6.3.1. The ICP Advisory Steering Committee shall provide advice and recommendations on the following deliverables of the Inclusive Community Program initiative:
  - 6.3.1.1. Project Work Plan;
  - 6.3.1.2. Needs Assessment;
  - 6.3.1.3. Community Profile;
  - 6.3.1.4. Background Review of Key Documents;
  - 6.3.1.5. Communications Key Messages; and,
  - 6.3.1.6. Action Plan.

#### 6.4. Composition

- 6.4.1. The ICP Advisory Steering Committee shall consist of seven members:
  - 6.4.1.1. The Chair of the Amherstburg Accessibility Advisory Committee;
  - 6.4.1.2. The Chair of the Seniors Advisory Committee;
  - 6.4.1.3. The Council Representative to the Seniors and Accessibility Advisory Committees;
  - 6.4.1.4. 2 members appointed to the Seniors and Accessibility Advisory Committees;
  - 6.4.1.5. 1 stakeholder member (Director, President or Vice President) of Amherstburg Freedom Museum;
  - 6.4.1.6. 1 stakeholder member (Executive Director) of the Essex County Nurse Practitioner Led Clinic.
- 6.4.2. The ICP shall be elect a Chair at its first meeting to serve for the duration.
- 6.4.3. The ICP shall elect a Vice Chair at its first meeting to serve for the duration.
- 6.4.4. The Chief Administrative Officer, or designate, shall serve as the Staff Liaison to the Committee.
- 6.4.5. A recording secretary shall be selected by the Clerk to provide administrative and procedural assistance to the committee, as required.

#### 6.5. Quorum

6.5.1. A quorum is a majority of the members constituting the body.

- 6.5.2. If there is no quorum present within 15 minutes of the appointed hour of the meeting, the meeting shall adjourn. The names of those members present shall be recorded in the minutes.
- 6.5.3. If a meeting starts with a quorum and members of the committee leave during the meeting, the meeting shall continue as long as two members of the body remain, however, no voting shall take place without quorum.

#### 6.6. Meeting Frequency

- 6.6.1. The body shall meet monthly to provide advice on the methodology, work plan and tool development (surveys, etc.) for the initiative. The body shall use meetings to provide input on the overall direction and results while monitoring progress.
  - 6.6.1.1. Additionally meetings may be requested by the Chair.
  - 6.6.1.2. Meetings may be held virtually, where it is advisable to do so based upon the determination of the Clerk and in accordance with local health protocols.

## 6.7. Rules of Order and Meeting Procedures

- 6.7.1. Meeting procedures shall be in accordance with the Town's Procedural By-law, and where the Procedural By-law is silent on a matter, follow Roberts Rules of Order.
- 6.7.2. Other information relative to procedural or administrative matters of Local Boards and Committees can be found in the *Guide to Local Boards and Committees*.

#### 7. <u>RESPONSIBILITIES</u>

- 7.1. **<u>Council</u>** has the authority and responsibility to:
  - 7.1.1. Strike the Inclusive Community Program Advisory Steering Committee.
  - 7.1.2. Approve the Terms of Reference for the ICP.
  - 7.1.3. Appoint Members to the ICP.
- 7.2. The **<u>CAO</u>** has the authority and responsibility to:
  - 7.2.1. Provide advice and recommendations with regards to staff and resource allocations available for Committee obligations.
  - 7.2.2. Provide advice and recommendations with regards to alignment of the committee Terms of Reference and Work Plan items with strategic priorities identified in Council adopted Corporate Planning and guiding documents.
- 7.3. The <u>**Clerk**</u> has the authority and responsibility to:
  - 7.3.1. Provide advice and recommendations with regards to legislative responsibilities, procedural matters and policy considerations of Committees and Local Boards.
  - 7.3.2. Provide advice and recommendations with regards to funding considerations for Committees and Local Boards.
  - 7.3.3. Provide or delegate the provision of recording secretary responsibilities and procedural support for the body.

- 7.4. The **<u>Recording Secretary</u>** has the authority and responsibility to:
  - 7.4.1. Record, without note or comment, all recommendations and other proceedings.
  - 7.4.2. Draft reports to Council, as appropriate, to detail findings of the Committee and relay recommendations.
- 7.5. <u>Members of the ICP Advisory Steering Committee</u> have the authority and responsibility to:
  - 7.5.1. Seek out and consult with representatives and populations, as identified in the ICP Terms of Reference, to ensure that underserved or underrepresented groups are able to provide a diversity of thought and perspective;
  - 7.5.2. Provide advice and recommendations with regards to accessibility and inclusivity in the design, development and future opportunities in age-friendly community initiatives.

At its Regular Council Meeting of April 6, 2021, Council of the Town of Essex discussed the serious and dire challenges facing our small businesses due to the Covid-19 restrictions currently imposed in our area.

**And that** the Town of Essex calls upon the Ontario Government and all local and Provincial health officials to recognize and alleviate the unfair impacts a province wide shutdown has on our local small businesses when there are many other regions in the Province that have significantly higher COVID-19 rates/cases than those of Windsor-Essex County; and that the Town further asks our local and Provincial health officials to continue to provide even more detailed local data in order to support and demonstrate the fact that the Windsor-Essex Region should not have the same level of restrictions imposed as in those other regions in the Province that have much higher case numbers.

**And further** the Town of Essex makes this call upon the Ontario Government and all local and provincial health officials in recognition of the fact that most importantly it is the individuals, the people behind our small businesses who together with others in our community, are suffering as a result of the current shutdown. While it is vitally important to take all reasonable measures to combat the spread of COVID-19 it is equally important to recognize and take steps to protect the mental health of all Ontarians who are suffering at this time and respectfully our small businesses in the Windsor-Essex region are suffering greatly and so we again call on the Ontario Government and all local and Provincial health officials to recognize and alleviate the unfair impacts a province wide shutdown is continuing to have on our local small businesses.

Please be advised the Council of the Municipality of Chatham-Kent at its regular meeting held on April 12, 2021 passed the following resolution:

Whereas a healthy, professional news media is essential for the proper functioning of civil society and democracy at the local, regional, federal and international levels; and

Whereas residents of 190 Canadian communities — lost 250 established news outlets because of closings or mergers between 2008 and 2018; and

Whereas the federal government allocated nearly \$600 million in aid for Canadian media over five years in its 2019 budget, including a 25-percent tax credit for newsroom salaries; a 15-percent tax credit for digital media subscribers; and charitable tax status for non-profit news outlets; and

Whereas Canadians have lost the essential services provided by nearly 500 journalists due to layoffs in the Canadian media since the COVID-19 pandemic began to mid-April of 2020 — a time it became clearer to the public how important it is for Canadians to receive factual information — and advertising revenues have plunged, prompting an emergency \$30-million advertising-buy by the federal government; and

Whereas the news media in Chatham-Kent have been instrumental during the COVID-19 pandemic, ensuring local citizens have timely and factual local information; and

Whereas periodic misinformation on social media sites hampers the ability to communicate factually with local citizens; and

Whereas a stronger local media would demonstrate the value of accurate information and provide a more balanced perspective for discussion of public issues, Be it Therefore Resolved that Chatham-Kent Council encourage other Municipal Councils within the province and across Canada

- to acknowledge that a robust news media is essential to the proper functioning of democracy in their jurisdictions,
- to endorse legislation and regulations to support and rejuvenate news outlets across Canada and
- to urge the Federal Government to move quickly to pass legislation to ensure an ecosystem for a healthy news media to serve all Canadians

And Further that this resolution be forwarded to area municipalities, local M.P.s and M.P.P.s, the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and Association of Municipalities of Ontario

And Further that Chatham-Kent Council encourage all residents to support local journalism.

At its regular meeting on April 7, 2021, Council of the Township of Springwater passed resolution C146C-2021 endorsing the following letter presented by the Township of Springwater's Agricultural Advisory Committee regarding the Clean Fuels Standard:

Dear Mr. Shipley,

The purpose of this letter is to discuss the Proposed Clean Fuels Standard that is being considered for legislation. As members of the Springwater Township Agricultural Advisory Committee, we have serious concerns with this proposal. This proposal in its current form, has the potential to be catastrophic to the Canadian farmer. The proposed rules and regulations for restrictions on land use are detrimental to the long-term viability of Canadian agriculture.

If this proposal goes ahead, Canadian farmers will be unable to make improvements to their land to make it more efficient for the use of crop production, thus making them unable to meet the needs of food supply needed for the ever-growing population. Making improvements to land for crop production is essential to the growing demand in food supply for our country and should not have restrictions placed upon it. Instilling restrictions in this manner is no different than telling a homeowner that any renovations made after a specific date disqualifies any future renovations.

The restrictions being imposed through the Clean Fuels Standard will make it so Canadian farmers are unable to recoup costs that they are spending in order to meet the needs of the growing population in Canada. Having these restrictions in place, will have buyers seeking products elsewhere, out of country. What will this do to Canada's economy?

The ideas proposed, 'setbacks from watercourses and woodlands,' would come at a tremendous cost to the Canadian farmers who have purchased, paid taxes, and cared for, for generations, are suddenly unable to use the land for renewable fuel purposes.

How will these costs be recovered if the farmer is unable to utilize this land for crop production? Is a farmer going to have to build separate grain storage to store products that are ineligible for renewable energy at a cost of hundreds of thousands of dollars? Isn't it important that the Canadian Government work with Canadian farmers, not impose unworkable rules and regulations that hinder crop production and create a competitive disadvantage with other countries?

The Canadian Government has shown little regard for Canadian farmers in some of their policies and proposed legislation in recent years. The Clean Fuels Standard combined with the recent Carbon Tax, has the potential to put many Canadian farmers out of business. We need our governments to work with Canadian farmers in order to provide for the growing need of food supply in our country.

#### RE: Road Management Action On Invasive Phragmites

**WHEREAS** Phragmites australis (Phragmites) is an invasive perennial grass that continues to cause severe damage to wetlands and beaches in areas around the Great Lakes including Georgian Bay; and

**WHEREAS** Phragmites australis grows and spreads rapidly, allowing the plant to invade new areas and grow into large monoculture stands in a short amount of time, and is an allelopathic plant that secretes toxins from its roots into the soil which impede the growth of neighboring plant species; and

**WHEREAS** Phragmites australis results in loss of biodiversity and species richness, loss of habitat, changes in hydrology due to its high metabolic rate, changes in nutrient cycling as it is slow to decompose, an increased fire hazard due to the combustibility of its dead stalks, and can have an adverse impact on agriculture, particularly in drainage ditches; and

**WHEREAS** invasive Phragmites has been identified as Canada's worst invasive plant species by Agriculture and Agrifood Canada; and

**WHEREAS** the Ontario government has made it illegal to import, deposit, release, breed/grow, buy, sell, lease or trade invasive Phragmites under the Invasive Species Act; and

**WHEREAS** Phragmites occupy over 4,800 hectares of land around Lake St. Clair alone, while 212 hectares of Phragmites occupy land along the St. Lawrence River. The Georgian Bay Area is particularly affected by Phragmites australis, with more than 700 stands along the shorelines and multiple visible stands on the highways and roads that threaten valuable infrastructure and wetland areas; and

**WHEREAS** volunteers, non-governmental organizations, and various municipalities have invested tens of thousands of dollars in investments and labour annually for more than eight years in executing managements plans to control invasive Phragmites on roads, coasts, shorelines and in wetlands; and

**WHEREAS** roads and highways where Phragmites that are left untreated become spread vectors that continually risk new and treated wetlands and coastal shoreline areas; and

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**WHEREAS** according to "Smart Practices for the Control of Invasive Phragmites along Ontario's Roads" by the Ontario Phragmites Working Group, best road management practices for Phragmites australis include early detection, herbicide application, and cutting; and

**WHEREAS** these best management practices are most effective when used in a multi-pronged approach as opposed to when used as stand-alone control measures; and

**WHEREAS** mother nature does not recognize political boundaries. Therefore, it is imperative that Municipalities, Districts, the Province, and the Federal government work together in collaboration to eradicate Canada's worst invasive plant species Phragmites australis;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago directs its staff to implement best management practices to promote early detection of invasive Phragmites, and to implement best management practices for invasive Phragmites, and to join the Ontario Phragmites Working Group to collaborate on the eradication of Phragmites in Ontario.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago directs staff to insert clean equipment protocols into tenders and that there is oversight that the protocols are followed; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago requests the Ontario Ministry of Transportation to map and treat invasive Phragmites annually on all its highways; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) communicates the strategy on mapping (detecting sites) and controlling invasive Phragmites on provincial highways, the specific highway management plans and results by each MTO region and each highway in the region and work in coordination with the Township of The Archipelago; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago directs its staff to send this resolution to all municipalities that are part of the Georgian Bay watershed, to all municipalities in the Great Lakes watershed, to the Minister of Transportation, Christopher Balasa the Manager, Maintenance Management Office, and MPP Norman Miller.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that Council for the Corporation of the Township of The Archipelago requests all levels of government to consider funding support to aid the Township of The Archipelago in managing invasive phragmites; and directs staff to send a copy of this resolution to the Ontario Minister of Environment, Conservation and Parks and the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada.

#### BY-LAW NO. 2021-031

# By-law to Confirm the Proceedings of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg

**WHEREAS** pursuant to Section 5(1) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25 as amended, the powers of a municipality shall be exercised by its Council;

**WHEREAS** pursuant to Section 5(3) of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.0. 2001, c.25 as amended, a municipal power, including a municipality's capacity rights, powers and privileges under Section 8 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25 as amended, shall be exercised by By-law unless the municipality is specifically authorized to do otherwise;

**WHEREAS** it is deemed expedient that a By-law be passed to authorize the execution of agreements and other documents and that the Proceedings of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg at its meeting be confirmed and adopted by By-law; and,

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg hereby enacts as follows:

- THAT the action(s) of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg in respect of all recommendations in reports and minutes of committees, all motions and resolutions and all actions passed and taken by the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg, documents and transactions entered into during the April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021, meetings of Council, are hereby adopted and confirmed, as if the same were expressly contained in this By-law;
- 2. THAT the Mayor and proper officials of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the action(s) of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg during the said meetings referred to in paragraph 1 of this By-law;
- 3. THAT the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute all documents necessary to the action taken by this Council as described in Section 1 of this By-law and to affix the Corporate Seal of the Corporation of the Town of Amherstburg to all documents referred to in said paragraph 1.
