

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Amherstburg Municipal Council held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building on Monday, June 22, 1998 at 7:00 p.m.

The Clerk opened the meeting with prayer.

DISCLOSURE OF PECUNIARY INTEREST:

There were no disclosures of pecuniary interest.

MINUTES:

Moved by R. Pillon, seconded by L. Fox that the Minutes of a meeting of the Amherstburg Municipal Council held on Monday, June 8, 1998, be adopted.

Mayor Hurst asked Lorraine Maurice of Bullock's Tavern to give a status report on the upcoming Blues Festival to be held in August. Ms. Maurice stated that plans were going well and thanked Council for their support of the event.

Remo DiPaolo, Chairman of the Canadian Cancer Society Amherstburg Walkathon, addressed Council on the walkathon to be held on October 4, 1998. Last year along over \$60,000 was raised. They have 10 major sponsors to date. With Essex County being the highest area for cancer cases in Ontario, it is extremely important that this event be supported. Council indicated their support and asked that pledge forms be sent to Council members when they are available. Mayor Hurst thanked Mr. DiPaolo for his work with the walkathon and for addressing Council.

Joe Beneteau, President of the AAM Ambulance, addressed Council on the Advanced Life Support Initiative that is being promoted for this area. It is their intention to obtain the best pre-hospital medicare for our community that is available. Part of this initiative involves the tiered response system which would include the use of defibrillators by Police or Fire. Mr. Beneteau asked for Council support in their efforts.

PETITIONS & DEPUTATIONS: Cont'd

Dale D. Scott, Vice Chairperson of the Amherstburg Recreation Committee addressed Council on the need to a proposal for a second ice surface at the Arena. The present single surface cannot accommodate any more users. The feeling is that the second ice surface would put the Arena in a position of balancing the budget. He requested that Council authorize the Recreation Committee to hire a consultant to do a feasibility study. There was no estimate on the cost of the study. Mayor Hurst indicated that private enterprise may be what needs to be investigated for this project. The Mayor further spoke on people being taxed to the limit and could not see expansion financed by taxes. Deputy Mayor T. DiBartolomeo stated some arenas with a 2nd ice surface are actually making money. Council thanked Mr. Scott for attending and suggested that the matter be referred to Public Services Committee.

Bob Coulson, Team Manager and President of the Amherstburg Senior "A" Hockey Club, addressed Council on his inability to obtain ice time at the Arena for the Senior A Team. Mr. Coulson explained that he had 102 players to date and felt the Senior A Team would be entertainment for the Town and there would also be spin-off benefits. They need 2 1/2 to 3 hours of ice time per week. Mayor Hurst indicated that Council must take the information that was provided and further discuss the issue. The Mayor thanked Mr. Coulson for attending.

Santino D'Alimonte, along with Mrs. D'Alimonte, gave a presentation to Council on the negative impact that Envirotech has on their neighbourhood. There are odours, flies, noise and visual concerns, which all add to the annoyance of the business to the neighbours. Property values are decreasing because of the operation. Discussion took place on the zoning that allowed the business to operate. Mayor Hurst indicated that the By-law Enforcement Officer is monitoring the property for violations and the Town is doing its best to keep problems to a minimum. Council thanked Mr. & Mrs. D'Alimonte for attending.
