Councillor Anthony Leardi declared a conflict of interest with regard to the minutes of a Committee of Adjustment meeting held April 24, 2001.

PETITIONS & DEPUTATIONS:

There was no one present to comment on the proposed closure of Harbour View Court (an unopened Road Allowance on Bob-lo Island).

Senator Eugene Whelan addressed Council with regard to fencing at Wigle Park. Two weeks have passed since he wrote a letter in opposition to the fence. He questioned whether any other options had been proposed to Council. He pointed out that there are many diamonds available in the amalgamated area. He emphasized that communication to the residents is necessary. He also stated that in his investigation of baseball rules he could not find any rule requiring fencing. The students of General Amherst High should have been consulted on the matter.

After a length discussion on the matter Council thanked Senator Whelan for attending.

Sherry Hill and Kathy Parks, Co Chairs of the G.A.H.S., School Council, expressed their concern over the children=s safety issue created by the fence that runs east and west parallel to the high school. Ms. Hill read a prepared presentation outlining a number of concerns and questions on the fencing issue. Mayor DiBartolomeo answered a number of the questions posed in the presentation. He emphasized that student access to the park is still there and will be. Emergency evacuation is a

great concern for the School Council. Mayor DiBartolomeo stated that the Town=s Fire Chief/Emergency Coordinator had meetings regarding the safety issue and was able to work things out to alleviate any emergency evacuation concerns. However, Mayor DiBartolomeo advised that the Fire Chief/Emergency Coordinator will review the matter and prepare a report which will be made available to the School Council. He also advised that many sites were looked at and Wigle Park was most suitable. Further discussion followed. The School Council representatives stated that the fence running on the north side of the park is a problem from their perspective. Council thanked Sherry and Kathy for attending.

Amherstburg Food and Fellowship representatives Andy Gervais and Karen Rosati distributed financial statements to Council. They requested that fees charged by the Town for the new mission be waived. Mr. Gervais asked that a few people be given the opportunity to state what the Food and Fellowship contributed to their personal lives. Pat Gervais explained some of the statistical work that was done by the Food & Fellowship Mission. They explained that the project (new building) was estimated at \$325,000.00 and that \$115,000 was still required to finish the project. Mr. & Mrs. Gervais plan to loan \$70,000 to the mission. Those people using the mission are begging for help through the waiver of fees and the reimbursement of easement costs.

After further discussion on the matter Council thanked the delegation for attending.

Peter Dunn, owner of property on the 3rd Concession South, discussed the feasibility of extending sanitary sewers to serve his proposed new residence. The matter was discussed at length. Jack Herceg, who represents other property owners in this area, discussed the benefits of proceeding with the extension of the sewer to County Road 20.

Deputy Mayor Pillon offered to bring the matter to an on site meeting that was scheduled with the contractor and engineer for the sewage project now being done in the area..

Moved by R. Pillon, seconded by M. Bezaire that we hear delegations with regard to the following two matters:

- 1. noise complaint vineyard on Walker Rd.
- 2. Proposal to move original fire hall from Malden Centre to Malden Community Centre property.

In regards to the following matter a memo from Chief Bird dated November 13, 2000 and a letter from the Town of Essex dated June 11, 2001 was distributed to Council.

Carol Charrette, resident of the Town of Essex on the east side of Walker Road, explained to Council the problem that they are experiencing with the use of Apoppers@ to scare birds at the vineyard across the road from her home. She feels that there are other methods available to protect the crops. A question and answer session took place. Council thanked Ms. Charette for attending.

In regards to the following matter a memo from Steve Mickle was provided by administration and an updated version of that memo was distributed by Steve Mickle to Council members at the meeting.

Steve Mickle and Randy Ure explained the proposal to move the former Fire Hall from Malden Centre to the Malden Community Centre. Mr. Ure is purchasing property on which the hall sits and as a condition of severance the hall must be removed or demolished. Mr. Mickle would like to save the building because of its historical value. He is not asking the Town for financial assistance in the relocation, however he is asking the Town approve the moving of the building onto the Town owned property at the Malden Community Centre. A discussion took place on future costs. Moved by L. Fox, seconded by F. Gorham that Council resume.
