The areas of infestation and quarantine are parts of Essex County and Michigan. The problem is still being studied. The representatives asked that any contractors etc. who are from out of the area be notified of the quarantine. Council Thanked the representatives for attending.

Peter Thompson and Bill Market - property assessors with the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) addressed Council on the eroding of service to the local property owners caused by policies and initiatives of the MPAC. They requested that Council pass a resolution to restore local assessment expertise and good working relationships with municipalities at the local level. Mayor DiBartolomeo thanked the representatives for attending.
