## **PETITIONS & DEPUTATIONS**

Mayor Hurst presented a plaque from the Town of Amherstburg to Jessica McDonald of the 202 Fort Malden Cadet Corp in recognition of her receiving the Major General W.A. Howard Award.

Opportunity for Public Comment on the change of name of the Malden Colchester North Town Line Road and the Malden Colchester South Town Line Road to Smith Road.

The Clerk explained that the Town of Essex and the Town of Amherstburg have decided that to avoid confusion it would be desirous to change Malden Colchester North Town Line and Malden Colchester South Town Line to Smith Road. There has been a notice in the local papers for three weeks stating that a By-law for the change would be considered on June 27, 2005 by the Town of Essex Council and the Town of Amherstburg Council. Also indicated in the notice that presentations to Council could be made on June 27, 2005.

No one came forward to comment for or against the proposed change.

Bill Docherty, developer of Kingsbridge Subdivision and a group of residents were present to review the location of the proposed Town homes. A meeting was held at the Verdi Club where Mr. Docherty and the residents came to an agreement on the location of Town homes and other issues regarding traffic, sidewalks, roads and parkland.

Lory Bratt, Planning Coordinator explained that a further Public Meeting is required because of the new proposed location. On tonight's agenda there is a By-law which addresses housekeeping issues.

Lisa Varicelli of 3 Whelan Drive confirmed from Mr. Docherty that there would be a sidewalk from County Road 20 to the park. On Whelan it would be a permanent concrete sidewalk however on Knobb Hill Drive it would be a temporary gravel sidewalk because of impending construction activity.

A resident stated that they wanted to ensure that the present agreement is permanent.

Stuart Bertram has density concerns – increase in number of units increases the volume of vehicles. Still has concerns that were voiced at the previous public meeting.

Doug Duff of 73 Whelan stated that everyone got a flyer for the meeting at the Verdi Club. We need to get moving now that an agreement with the developer has been reached.

Sandra Agostino is in support of new proposal.

Jean Monteith confirmed that it is necessary to complete a circulation for the new proposal.

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Dr. John Spellman addressed Council in regard to issues relating to the draining of the Big Creek Marsh.

There was a permit issued by MOE on July 13, 2003 to Mr. Ed Faucher, manager of the Big Creek Hunt Club. There was a 30 day period for public comment plus a 15 day window to allow for appeals. There were no appeals received. Mr. Faucher proceeded with what was called Marsh rehabilitation.

Dr. Spellman further explained that actually there was no valid permit for what was taking place. The permit was to take water from Lake Erie. ERCA is wrong in saying that there is a valid permit. Dr. Spellman stated that what he found is largely his own research – the research has been quite exhaustive. The idea of not needing a permit on your own property - MOE says is incorrect. Dr. Spellman agrees with comments made by ERCA on the ownership of land. The referred to a letter from 1993 to Carl Gibb of Malden Township. Dr. Spellman referred to the new Provincial Policy Statement with which we must conform. He feels that draining of the Creek has a negative impact. The Essex County Field Naturalists felt that the area has been immediately affected. Various species of birds have been affected. There is loss of habitat for fish. The creek has drained at the time for spawning. The manager and owner have proceeded without a valid permit - contrary to Provincial Policy - has had a negative impact on the environment. Dr. Spellman advised that the response from the owner has been that they had no desire to do damage. They are willing to spend money to bring the marsh to the highest standard. Mr. Faucher knows that he has much to learn and is willing to learn. Under new regulations the Town must be notified before a permit is issued. Dr. Spellman stated that he believes Mr. Faucher made an honest mistake. The situation would be the same if he had a valid permit. The owners are willing to work with the ACE Committee. In this light Dr. Spellman suggested that a special sub-committee could be formed. Funding may even be available through the Ministry.

Tim Byrne of ERCA gave a brief background on the marsh. In 1908 the dam structure was built. The operation of the dam is unregulated by either ERCA or the MNR. ERCA

has had no reason to object. The MOE stated that permits were in place. The desire of the owner is to create a cattail marsh. Former owners desired to create an inland lake. There would need to be multi owner agreement to manage the area. In the past the area was a cattail marsh.

Discussion took place regarding the draining of the marsh and whether or not that would be considered site alteration under the Provincial Policy Statement.

Mr. Ed Faucher went on record as stating that he did not drain Big Creek. Dr. Spellman is wrong with his accusations.

John Wortley stated that since 1982 when the Leo Beaudoin Pump was initiated he has been asking the various Councils to remedy the environmental problems that existed.

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Anne Deluca requested that Council approve the encroachment that is being requested for 235 Dalhousie Street (Don Luciano's) (Report #1).

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Lawrence Mailloux, Solicitor for Mr. Fred Brant requested that Council consider further the Zoning By-law Amendment for 7826 Howard Avenue (Report #19). Mr. Mailloux advised that they are prepared to abide by the conditions that were stipulated in the amendment. He also referred to other Zoning By-law Amendment that were approved in the area. Lory Bratt read a letter from Lawrence and Pat Lucier dated June 27, 2005.

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Mr. Bart Palumbo was not able to attend however he asked to be included in the July 18, 2005 agenda.

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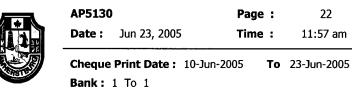

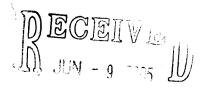

# THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS (HUNTING) BY-LAW

## **REGULATING THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE TOWN OF AMHERSTBURG**

The Town of Amherstburg is proposing a by-law that will affect every sportsman who discharges a firearm within the town limits. This would include the former Malden and Anderdon Townships. If you are a sportsman or hunter and discharge a shotgun, rifle, compound bow, crossbow, long bow, muzzle loader, air gun or pellet gun for hunting or sporting purposes, this by-law will have severe implications and restrictions on your activities if passed by the Amherstburg council.

The following is a list of regulations proposed within the discharge of firearms by-

1. The Town of Amherstburg has indicated it intends to create many areas where the discharge of firearms will be prohibited. This includes prohibiting the discharge of all archery equipment, shotguns, rifles and muzzleloaders. Some of these prohibited areas would include portions of Big Creek, River Canard and several areas of farmland. These restricted areas may include your own property, property you lease or areas you have traditionally hunted for years. If you hunt, shoot skeet, trap, or take target practice with your bow in the restricted area, you will now be prohibited from taking part in these activities.

PROVINCIAL Legislation see #6

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- CONFLICTS WITH 2. You will be prohibited from discharging a firearm including a bow within 656' (200m) of any habitable or commercial building or structure.
  - 3. You will be prohibited from discharging a firearm including a bow within 164' (50m) from any agricultural building or structure.

4. You will be prohibited from discharging any rifle greater than a .22.

Provincial legislation already states that a rifle with a caliber of .275 or greater is prohibited from being discharged in Essex County.

Note: A .22 caliber rifle is far more dangerous than a rifle with a greater caliber because the bullet has a tendency to ricochet as compared to the projectile of a larger caliber rifle which will explode and disincarnate upon any impact.

5. The Town of Amherstburg has provided its definition of a "permitted firearm". This is a firearm that can be discharged in the permitted area and includes a shotgun, cross-bow, long bow or rifle no greater than a .22 caliber.

# The towns definition of a "permitted firearm" is so specific that it doesn't include a compound bow, muzzle loader, pellet gun or air gun.

6. The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act which is Provincial legislation that is enforced by Ministry of Natural Resources Conservation Officers and may be enforced by any Police Officer states that if a hunter kills any game, the hunter must not abandon the game and permit it to be unsuitable for human consumption.

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Sometimes as unfortunate as it is, a hunter may injure an animal and it may escape to another location. What is a hunter suppose to do when his injured game comes within 656' (200m) of a farmhouse or 164' (50m) of a farmers barn? Even if you own the property or have permission from the owner to be hunting on the property, you can't dispatch the game to ensure a quick humane kill because you are not permitted to discharge a firearm. Remember that provincial legislation states you must retrieve the game. Discharging firearms and hunting is a highly regulated and very safe activity. It is regulated by Provincial and Federal legislation and enforced by Ministry of Natural Resources Conservation Officers and can be enforced by any Police Officer.

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The Provincial Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act contains sufficient legislation in it to prevent and severely punish individuals who handle a firearm carelessly. Some of the safety related legislation contained in the Act includes:

- A person shall not discharge or handle a firearm, or cause it to be discharged or handled, without due care and attention or without reasonable consideration for people or property.
- You may not have a loaded firearm on a roadway, discharge a firearm from on or across a roadway, and you must be 26'(8m) from any roadway when a firearm is discharged.
- An individual convicted of an offence under this Act may be ordered to re-take the hunters safety course before a hunting licence is issued.
- A hunting licence may be suspended for a period of time.
- A person convicted of a careless hunting offence is liable to a fine of not more than \$25,000, imprisonment for a term of not more than two years, or to both.
- The penalty for committing an offence under this by-law would be a maximum fine of \$500. Why would any law enforcement officer charge an individual under the by-law when provincial legislation contains higher fines, jail time, court orders and specifically deals with careless hunting and firearm infractions.

The by-law should include provincially licensed and insured professional private animal control individuals. There is no restriction under the Criminal Code for the discharge of my dart gun. This dart gun is a tool of my trade. In reality a carpenters nail gun and a cement layers nail driver which eject projectiles should also be banned but they are tools of their trade. I have confidence that the council will understand the legitimate needs to operate my local business without restraint.

If more information is required please contact me at anytime. As a trained, provincially licensed and insured pest and animal control operator I ask that the opportunities to use all of my options in keeping public safety a number one priority be exercised in my home town as it is in the rest of the province.

### **REFERENCE:**

Pending Amherstburg By Law 2005-23 to prohibit or regulate the discharge of firearms with in the proposed "Restricted Areas" as called out in Schedule "A" district map and supplied to me on June 9, 2005, hereby referred to as the "By Law". And also the proposed new bylaws regarding non-restricted areas, and changes to By Law 1344 currently in affect for all of Essex county.

Part Lots 16, 17, 18, and 19, Concession 1, Town of Amherstburg (formerly Township of Malden) containing approximately 290 acres.

Part lot 18, Concession 1, being more particularly described as Part 1 on Reference Plan 12R-11250 Town of Amherstburg (formerly Township of Malden) containing approximately 1 acre.

Part lots 15 and 16 bordered by Front Road South and Hwy # 20, consisting of approximately 122 acres.

The above property being currently addressed as 252 McLeod, Amherstburg, Ontario N9V 2Y9.

### ISSUES

1. Under the proposed "By Law" 2005-23 by Amherstburg Township, and with reference to Schedule "A", Malden Marsh Inc. not only disagrees, but takes exception to the apparent singling out of the west end of their property as being a proposed "Restricted Area". As proposed in Schedule "A" to date, approximately 700 to 800 meters are in question, (township could not supply the exact meters upon my personal request at Town Hall on June 10, 2005). The west end of the above "property" starting at the back side (or east property lines) of homes along the east side of Front Road South and reaching the approximate 700 to 800 meters east into the "property" are being proposed as a "Restricted Area".

Without malice, it appears that the "property" is being unjustly discriminated against based on the following facts. The "restricted area" north of the "property" all along the east side of the Detroit River to the Amherstburg town limits is limited to the property and homes, and only to the depth of the individual homeowner's property lines. The same is true for the "restricted area" on the homes south of McLeod along the east shoreline. Once again, restricted border lines aren't imposed beyond homes and property.

This "property" has been used for decades as a migratory bird "hunt farm" and was purchased in March of 1998 from Malden Ponds Ltd by Malden Marsh Inc. for this very reason. It wasn't purchased for the farm land, nor was it purchased for the potential of development.....it was purchased for the main reason of legally hunting migratory birds in the wet lands during the proper Migratory hunting season. The Amherstburg Township has just drawn a line right through the middle of main waterways that are the heart of this hunt club, and unfairly proposed it as a "Restricted Area". If necessary, Malden Marsh Inc. will take any and all legal actions that may be required to defend itself from the proposed By Law 2005-23 as Schedule "A" is currently spelled out, to date.

2. PERMITTED FIREARM under Section 1, Item F would require repealing By Law 1344 originally passed in October 1973 and replacing it with the new proposed By Law which would limit the caliber of non-restricted firearms to be used to hunt small fur bearing animals in the "allowable" areas to a .22 caliber. This appears to be an obvious attempt to eliminate the common and widely known varmint rifle, meaning any non-restricted firearm under .273 caliber, which is currently legal under the By Law 1344 of Oct, 1973 to be used to hunt and control small fur bearing animals in all of Essex County. Several issues come to mind regarding this proposed section of the new "By Law".

- A. It is commonly know that a .22 caliber shell has a relatively slow muzzle velocity, which makes it a far more dangerous than a conventional rifle with a greater caliber because the .22 bullet has a tendency to ricochet as compared to the bullet of a large caliber, and higher velocity rifle which will explode and disintegrate upon any impact. It states in the Canadian Firearms Safety Course, Student Handbook issued by the Federal Dept of Justice in October 1998 under Section 3, page 31, and I quote, "Responsible shooters will shoot only at targets within the effective range. Will consider how much farther the shot or bullet may travel beyond the target. And will be prepared to be held responsible for where the bullet they shoot stops." Understanding the common ricochet problem with .22 caliber, and its limited clean kill factor, a responsible shooter would never want to use a .22 caliber specifically because of these reasons. A responsible hunter would use a larger caliber weapon that would not normally pose the same ricochet problems, and would complete the hunting mission by providing a clean, instant kill. Knowing this, I would like to pose the question of responsibility should a proven ricochet mishap occur causing personal injury or property damage due to a By Law the Amherstburg Township enacted limiting the allowable caliber, in an allowable area to a .22 rifle.....with a known ricochet problem and not a caliber that a responsible hunter would prefer to use? My question here ....would not the Township be partially liable for this damage, as well as the unfortunate hunter?
- **B.** Even today, with the use of larger caliber varmint rifles, small fur bearing animals thrive in the Township of Amherstburg. Every winter, coyote drives are organized by the Conservation Authority through Malden Marsh Inc. property, as well as the Mans farm. They do not, and would not use a .22 caliber rifle for these "drives", and I would assume that these annual "drives" in our Township would cease to happen, should this proposed .22 caliber By Law actually comes into affect. These current drives are done to keep a very adaptive predator from becoming overabundant. If you restrict hunting small fur bearing animals to a .22 caliber rifle, populations of the larger predator (coyote and foxes) animals will grow exponentially to the point where it would become unsafe to leave your small pets outside un-attended. Also as the populations of small fur bearing animals grow, the scenario for rabbis also increases, thus making these animals unpredictable and very dangerous. No responsible hunter in his right mind would hunt coyote's with a .22 rifle.
- C. Then there is the moral obligation of the hunter not to let any animal suffer needlessly. A larger caliber varmint rifle has a much better clean kill factor than say a .22 rifle simply by design. This is why it is the weapon of choice by responsible hunters (Conservation Officers included). If you restrict hunting small fur bearing animals to a .22 caliber rifle, that has little stopping power, again by design, my estimated clean kill factor would be less than 50% over the higher caliber weapons of .273 and

down. Now every animal that is shot has a 50% chance of suffering for the last hours, or days of its life. Then there is the possibility or not, that the animal may survive the initial shot, but cannot function properly to feed itself, so it now dies of starvation. Either way, it is a cruel and unnecessary way for any animal to die. If enacted, this proposed .22 caliber By Law would challenge common sense, and furthermore, raise moral hunting issues for hunters and non-hunters alike.

- 3. Reference to the Item 3, section "C" & "D" regarding the new proposed allowable meters from various style of buildings, that a legal hunter would not be able to discharge his weapon within, assuming that he is in an "Allowable Area" to be hunting at all. Once again, I have several issues with the section of the proposed By-Law 2005-23
  - A. What happens to the bow hunter who has obtained permission from a farmer to bow hunt deer on his property and in doing so, wounds a deer, and tracks it to within 100 meters of the farmer's house collapsed, but not dead? By the proposed By Law, he could not put it out of its misery with a second arrow, and Provincial Legislation states you must retrieve the game. So his options would be to find an implement that he could bludgeon the animal to death, or he could possibly attempt to drag the wounded, frightened 200 lb+ animal 101 meters or more away from the farm house, only to finish the animal off at that point with a second arrow. Either one of the two scenarios would not be a pretty picture and now could include putting the hunter at risk of personal injury in his attempt at trying to dispatch of the wounded deer.
  - **B.** How does a farmer protect his property and or livestock (pets included) from small fur bearing wild animals within the proposed new By Law metered limits? Under the proposed By Law, he cannot dispatch, say raccoons from his corn bins or chicken coops, until the animal or animals are 50 meters from the outbuildings, and only if this is also 200 meters away from his home. The farmer would have no possible chance of legally dispatching or defending his home or property from these animals after they have fled the scene of the crime. The farmer could put out a "live" trap, which may catch one of the six raccoons that have dissented on his corn wagons or bins. But this would be a slow and never ending process, while the loss of property and the protection of his livestock would still be uncertain.
  - C. The same would be true about the homeowner living in or near a farmer's field or woods. How is he supposed to protect his property or livestock under the new proposed By Law? The family pets could be killed and eaten or dragged off, by say a coyote right in front of the entire family and until the coyote is at least 200 meters away from the house, could you

make an attempt to stop this animal from destroying any more pets or property.

**D.** The last scenario would be any one of many local hunt farms, which legally have pheasant pens attached to outbuildings for the purpose of legally controlled pheasant hunting within their property limits. Does the Township under its proposed By Law, honestly expect the caretaker/agent/owner of the hunt farm to stand by and watch his complete stock killed by a weasel, raccoon, fox, or coyote that has somehow entered the pen, and do nothing about it. Or is he expected to enter the pen and engage the predator in hand to paw combat on a one to one basis?

#### SUMMARY

I disagree with the proposed "Restricted" and "Non Restricted" zones that the Amherstburg Township has proposed under By Law 2005-23. The Ontario Provincial Government has no hunting laws that state any such restrictions as proposed by By Law 2005-23. The Ministry of Natural Resources also has no "restricted" and "non-restricted" zones, with the exception of the shoreline of Lake St. Clair, where a bill was passed recently stating that a 200 meter zone from the shoreline out as a "restricted" zone due to it being one of the worlds best migratory bird hunting area and draws people world wide for the opportunity to hunt the shoreline of Lake St. Clair. And in this case, I agree with the "restriction" imposed on the shoreline to control the heavy traffic seen there.

Responsible hunters would naturally stay away from most of the proposed "Restricted" zones simply by common sense. No one would go hunting in downtown Amherstburg even though I am sure they have problems with certain small fur bearing animals. This is a case where Live Traps actually control the problem with in the town limits.

From information that I have recently obtained, it is my understanding that never has there been an offense committed and a conviction obtained whereas a person was charged and convicted with the improper discharging, or unsafe use of a firearm with respect to endangerment to persons or property within the Township of Amherstburg, and including Anderdon, and Malden Townships. My question to the Council is, why are you trying to fix something that has never been broken, or why are you trying to pass a By Law where no previous laws have been broken?

The proposed amendment to change and repeal the current Bill 1344 passed in October 1973 with the intention to restrict the hunting of small fur bearing animals to a .22 caliber is absurd for all the reasons listed above in Section 2, Items "A", "B", & "C". And again I would ask the Council where the liability would be, should a mishap occur due to a proven ricochet from a .22 caliber rifle having a known problem in this regard and sanctioned by the Council under the proposed By Law 2005-23.

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The recommended "metering" restrictions proposed in the By Law is incredibly impractical as discussed in Section 3, Items "A", "B", "C" & "D" listed above. Common sense and safe practices will, as always, prevail for sport shooting and/or hunting with regards to neighboring properties. And, as above, there has never been a conviction regarding unsafe use of a firearm with due respect to persons or property within the Amherstburg Township. I also believe that honest, law abiding citizens may be forced to "bend" the new proposed By Law regarding the metering issue, should the proposed By Law be passed, in order to protect their property and/or possessions from small fur bearing animals. My thought on this again, is why is the Council trying to fix something that has never been broken?

### **CONCLUSION**

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In closing, I see no elements of the proposed By Law 2005-23 that serve, or would be of any benefit to the people within the Township of Amherstburg. In retrospect, it seems odd to me that a town that proudly displays large caliber cannons at both ends of the main thoroughfare, would attempt to enact a By Law so frivolous and restrictive in nature. It is my opinion that this proposed By Law 2005-23 should be scrapped in its entirety.

Subject: The Discharge of Firearms (Hunting) By-Law 2005-23 regulating the discharge of firearms within the Town of Amherstburg.

**Please place Kevin Sprague on the agenda** for the June 20<sup>th</sup> town meeting, to give verbal representation regarding the proposed by-law. The following concerns will be addressed and discussed in more detail.

- The Town of Amherstburg has no legal authority to regulate hunting. The Municipal Act allows municipalities to only regulate the discharge of firearms for public safety. Therefore the town must be able to justify in the interest of public safety all the legislation contained in the proposed by-law.
- There is no rational for the majority of this by-law. Why is it necessary? Federal and Provincial legislation exists to affectively deal with the careless use of a firearm.
- The penalty for committing an offence under this by-law could be a maximum fine of \$500. This minimal fine would not act as a deterrent to people who commit an offence. Federal and Provincial legislation contain much higher penalties to persons convicted of committing a firearms offence.
- Many traditional hunting areas and large tracts of land are proposed to be included in the firearm discharge prohibited area. This is unacceptable as there is no safety concern in these areas.
- The requirement for people to be 200m from any habitable or commercial building or structure and 50m from any agricultural building or structure before being able to discharge a firearm is unreasonable, not necessary and does not increase public safety.
- Presumably people who are discharging firearms in the vicinity of buildings or structures would either own the property or have permission to be discharging firearms on the property.
- Many rural residents will now be prohibited from discharging a firearm on all or much of their own property, based on the location of their home and or barns.

- There is no rational for limiting the rifle caliber to only .22. Provincial legislation is currently in place which limits the maximum rifle caliber to a .275 in Essex County. Not to mention that a .22 caliber rifle is more dangerous to discharge than a larger caliber rifle. This restriction does completely the opposite of increasing safety.
- The proposed by-law will prevent a hunter from dispatching and retrieving wounded game that comes within the minimum distances one must be from buildings and structures to discharge a firearm. What does a hunter do when wildlife is injured and is within the non permitted discharge distances to a building or structure? Federal and Provincial legislation state a hunter must immediately kill and retrieve the game.
- The definition of a "permitted firearm" is so specific that it does not allow for many of the more commonly types of firearms used by hunters in Southwestern Ontario.
- The by-law will prohibit many people from dispatching sick or injured animals.
- The by-law is preventing a veterinarian or farmer from recapturing large escaped animals and any other person authorized to use a tranquilizer gun besides the animal control officer.
- Their seems to be no provision in the by-law for historical re-enactments utilizing firearms.
- A farmer can discharge a firearm for the protection of crops or livestock. Why can't a farmer use an agent or family member to dispatch an animal if the farmer is unable or too busy to do it himself?
- The definition of a "farmer" in the by-law doesn't appear to include persons who raise livestock, turkeys, chickens or grow perennial crops such as grapes, apples, etc.
- The by-law states that a person must first obtain the appropriate federal, provincial and/or municipal licences before discharging a firearm. A licence is not required to target shoot. Is the intention of the town to prohibit all target shooting?
- Hunting is one of the most commonly used and most effective means of wildlife management to Amherstburg farmers. Wildlife damages cost Ontario farmers over \$41 million dollars in 1998. The Ministry of Natural Resources has recently increased deer hunting opportunities in Amherstburg because deer are becoming a

nuisance to farmers and a threat to public safety because of collisions involving vehicles and deer. The proposed by-law will prevent many hunters from deer hunting in Amherstburg.

- Why is the Town of Amherstburg going to be spending tax payer's money for its police officers to start conducting hunting checks and enforcing hunting relating legislation? Ministry of Natural Resources Conservation Officers are responsible for enforcing all hunting relating legislation, and have the specialized training, equipment and experience required to enforce hunting legislation and investigate safety related infractions.
- This by-law is indicating that hunting is a dangerous recreational activity, thus creating the by-law. According to the National Safety Council, hunting is much safer than many other sports such as golf, tennis, football and ping pong to name a few. There are more injuries to participants of these sports than there is with sport hunting.

RE: "Disabled Parking By-Law 2005-22" and Community Safety Zones By-Law

Due to a previous commitment, I am unable to attend in person. However, I submit the following input and questions for your consideration.

On September 22, 2003, one of my recommendations to council in response to the town's first Accessibility Plan was "The model parking by-law is available at the Ministry of Citizenship Accessibility Ontario website--it would control parking in public and private areas, signage and enforcement."

On January 19, 2005, I re-submitted my input and requested that council adopt the model parking bylaw, supported by the Ontario Traffic Conference, available at the Accessibility Ontario web site. I stated, "the proper signage for designated parking spaces for people with disabilities needs to be installed and maintained in new and existing parking lots. Furthermore, it needs to be enforced." Although I also requested that I be informed of the result, council did not respond.

I welcome this opportunity to provide input again, this time in response to the "Notice of Disabled Parking ByLaw 2005-22" in the May 6 River Town Times.

The model parking by-law contains appropriate language, whereas the advertisement and draft by-law contain outdated terminology, eg., disabled parking.

The preamble of the town's by-law includes a reference to the designation of parking spaces on highways and/or municipal or private property. In addition, section 3.(a) states, "every owner and operator of a parking lot or other parking facility having parking spaces to which the public has access shall provide designated disabled parking spaces therein in accordance with the Town of Amherstburg Zoning By-Law, as amended." However, the Notice states, "to clarify the above, the by-law does not require any existing parking lots to create disabled parking spaces that have not previously been designated as such." When does council intend to require existing parking lots to create accessible parking spaces with proper signage? Does the new Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act extend the obligation to provide accessible service and facilities to the private sector, which would include parking lots? Has council created its annual accessibility plan? Has council identified barriers in by-laws, policies, programs, practices and services that affect people with disabilities?

The preamble also states that the by-law will provide for the enforcement. However, the Notice states, "please note that no parking spaces are deemed enforceable under the new by-law unless a request to enforce such spaces has been submitted to the Town of Amherstburg on the appropriate form." Has council ensured that the form is available in alternate formats? Is it council's intent to convey that enforcement is unnecessary, unless requested? Has council conducted any studies regarding past enforcement?

The Notice further states that "all disabled parking space submissions shall be delivered to the Clerk's office no later than May 27, 2005." What is council's intention regarding requests for spaces after that date? Has council established a policy for requiring the town to create accessible parking spaces?

Since the Zoning By-law is not posted on the town's web site, I was unable to review it and comment on it. Will all items related to traffic be included in the traffic by-law? Is council working toward providing increased access to information in alternate formats?

Regarding the Community Safety Zones By-Law, the designation and signage of numerous community safety zones may create a false sense of security.

Studies show that simply reducing posted speed limits may do little to reduce actual traffic speeds. Effective speed reduction generally requires changing roadway design, or significantly increasing enforcement. Has council conducted a study to determine the enforcement and prosecution rates and effectiveness of community safety zones in our community? Are future studies planned if none have been undertaken to date?

Other municipalities in the province are reducing the number of CSZs in their communities and/or are developing strict criteria for the limited use of CSZs. I refer you to the Ontario Traffic Conference web site for further details at http://www.otc.org/otcweb2/news\_safety zones.html
