Mayor Hurst welcomed everyone to the 1st 2006 Budget Session.

Mayor Hurst stated that Deputy Mayor Leardi would report on a meeting that was held with the French Catholic School Board and the Town of Essex regarding the library in McGregor.

Deputy Mayor Leardi reported that the County Library Board is contemplating closing smaller libraries of which McGregor could be one.

At the meeting with the School Board and the town of Essex the possibility of having a library on the St. Ursula School Site was discussed. Two options would be to have a library in the existing building or adding on to the school to create a library. The Town of Essex will pursue. The Town of Essex Clerk is the contact person. We will be receiving correspondence from Essex.

CAO Frank Pizzuto explained that this session is a Council – Staff session hopefully informal. It is a preliminary meeting – hopes that Council will let staff know its priorities. The CAO further explained that we are dealing with aging assets that require major dollars to bring them up to standard. Financial issues are a very real concern. We need Economic Development and an increase in the Tax Base to get us back to a positive situation.
