Dear Mayor DiCarlo and Amherstburg Town Council,

We are writing to request an immediate review of the bylaws pertaining to animal rights and kenneling in the municipality of Windsor. Currently, these bylaws are lax in addressing numerous conditions when it comes to animal safety.

In light of the situation occurring at 138 Lions Club Drive in the town of Belle River, and the condition with which the domestic dogs are being kept within municipal limits, a discussion was had about the limitations in the bylaws which allowed for the inhumane treatment of animals and has sparked outrage and initiated discussion about town bylaws that need to be updated. Unfortunately, not all citizens have the same moral compass when it comes to doing what is in the best interest of animals and it is up to us as a municipality to protect the voiceless.

We would ask that at a minimum, the animals set-out by the municipality of Essex be adopted: <u>https://www.essex.ca/en/town-hall/resources/BY-LAW-1606---Animal-Care-Control-BL-May-2017.pdf</u>

In addition to the current bylaws in place in the town of Essex, we ask that the following be added:

### The Hiring/Tendering of Animal Control Workers:

- Institute a more thorough background check when it comes to the hiring process including animal control officers whereby if the candidate has been terminated from other local municipality due to conduct concerns, they would not be offered the position.
- If it was determined that the conduct of the current animal control officer was in question or if they had been removed from a position in another municipality due to conduct concerns that their position be terminated immediately.

### **Crates and Kennels:**

Every person who owns and operates a kennel shall:

- 1) Ensure that a shelter for one dog must be a min size such as 5 x 5 with a 3ft ceiling depending on the height of the dog. If the dog is 4ft then accommodate an extra 3 feet so the dog can stand and move.
- 2) Comply with the guidelines set out in "A Code of Practice for Canadian Kennel Operations", (Canadian Veterinary Medical Association).
- 3) Have adequate light, including natural and electric lighting
- 4) Have windows that can be opened for proper ventilation
- 5) Have an operational heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system with a working thermostat
- 6) Have access to hot and cold running water on site
- 7) Ensure the shelters are covered for all season weather.
- 8) Ensure that the floor of the kennels be solid as opposed to wiring and that the ceiling above is solid to ensure they are not soaked when it rains.

- 9) Domestic animal kennels will be kept on properties whereby the owner resides or where their business operations is located.
- 10) Ensure that animals that are crated or penned both on residential properties and in kennel situations outdoors will be crated for no longer than a stipulated number of hours at a time at which point they will be provided access to a large area where they can roam.
- 11) Ensure that animals being kept in crates of kennels outdoors will be entitled the opportunity for periodic exercise sufficient to maintain good health including the opportunity to be unfettered from a fixed area and exercised regularly under appropriate control
- 12) Ensure access to a fenced area to the outside that permits the animal to access the outside area and return to the inside area on its own accord.
- 13) Maintain every run or pen area in a clean and sanitary condition at all times which shall include the removal and proper disposal of excrement, refuse and debris a minimum of twice daily or as often as required.
- 14) Ensure that every person who owns or operates a kennel shall ensure every run, pen, or exercise yard shall be surrounded by a sturdy fence with a minimum height of 1.52 meters (five feet).

### **Tethering:**

- 15) Residential and kenneled domestic animals will not be tethered for longer than a set time of three hours per day.
- 16) No person shall keep any animal in the City tethered on a chain, rope or similar restraining device of less than three meters in length.
- 17) Every person who has tethered an animal shall ensure, at all times, that the animal has unrestricted movement within the range of the tether, and that the animal cannot suffer injury resulting from the tether.
- 18) A person who has tethered an animal shall ensure that the animal is tethered in a manner that constrains the animal to the property to which the animal is tethered.
- 19) No person shall keep an animal tethered where a choke collar, choke chain, pronged collar or any similar device forms part of the tether.
- 20) No animal will be kept outdoors during extreme weather conditions.
- 21) During extreme heat and cold, residential, and kenneled domestic animals will have access to relief in indoor temperature-controlled areas.
- 22) It will not be permitted to keep domestic kenneled animals in standalone structures that do not have access to interior temperature-controlled facilities on the premises.

### Animals in Vehicles:

- 1) No person shall allow an animal to be outside of the passenger cab of a motor vehicle on a roadway, regardless of whether the motor vehicle is moving or parked;
- 2) A person may allow an animal to be outside the passenger cab of a motor vehicle, including riding in the back of a pick up truck or flat bed truck if the animal is:
  - a. a) In a fully enclosed trailer;
  - b. b) In a topper enclosing the bed area of a truck;
  - c. c) Contained in a ventilated kennel or similar device securely fastened to the bed of the truck; or
  - d. d) Securely tethered in such a manner that it is not standing on bare metal, cannot jump or be thrown from the vehicle, is not in danger of strangulation and cannot reach beyond the outside edges of the vehicle.
- 3) The Owner of an animal shall not leave an animal unattended in a motor vehicle if the weather conditions are not suitable for containment of an animal;
- 4) A Police Officer who has reasonable grounds to believe that an animal left unattended in a motor vehicle is in imminent physical danger may take steps to remove the animal from the vehicle and shall not be held liable for any damage to the vehicle by so doing.

We hope that these suggested amendments and additions to the current bylaws can be considered and implemented as soon as possible and we look forward to working with you to help evoke positive change in our community.



# BACKGROUND & PROGRESS

- June 3<sup>rd</sup> Animal Welfare concerns arose regarding a property in Lakeshore.
- June 5<sup>th</sup> #BetterLawsForPaws was implemented.
- Petition for PAWS Act Amendment -2380 signatures
- Petition for Windsor Essex Municipal By-law amendment Animal Care and Control – 1070 signatures
- June 12<sup>th</sup> Day of Action & Awareness
- July 10<sup>th</sup> Day of Action & Awareness



### **RECOMMENDATIONS:** THE HIRING/TENDERING OF ANIMAL CONTROL WORKERS:





Institute a more thorough background check during the hiring process of Animal Control Officers. Should the candidate's contract be terminated from other local municipalities due to conduct concerns, they would not be offered the position. If it was determined that the conduct of the current Animal Control Officer was in question, or if they had been removed from a position in another municipality due to conduct concerns, that their position be terminated immediately.

# RECOMMENDATIONS CONTINUED: CRATES AND KENNELS

- Comply with the "A Code of Practice for Canadian Kennel Operations", (Canadian Veterinary Medical Association).
- Have adequate light, including natural and electric lighting.
- Ensure the shelters are equipped with sufficient heating and cool for all season weather.
- Ensure that the floor and ceiling of the kennels are solid to protect from rain and snow and to ensure the animal's comfort. No chicken wire shall be used inside the kennel as it will likely puncture and harm the animal.
- Animal kennels will be kept on properties whereby the owner resides or where their business operations is located.
- Ensure that animals that are crated or penned both on residential and agricultural properties and are in kennel / crate / shelter structures outdoors will be within the stated structures for no longer than a stipulated number of consecutive hours. All animals will be provided access to a large area where they can roam.
- Ensure that animals being kept in crates or kennels outdoors will be entitled the opportunity for periodic exercise; sufficient to maintain good health, including the opportunity to be unfettered from a fixed area, and exercise regularly under appropriate control.
- Ensure access to a fenced area outdoors that permits the animal to access the outside area and return to the inside area on its own accord.
- Maintain every run or pen area in a clean and sanitary condition at all times which shall include the removal and proper disposal of excrement, and debris a minimum of twice daily or as often as required.
- Ensure that every person who owns or operates a kennel shall ensure every run, pen, or exercise yard shall be surrounded by a sturdy fence with a minimum height of 1.52 meters (five feet).

Minimum primary enclosure space requirements<sup>3</sup>

Minimum primary enclosure space requirements apply to the keeping of one adult dog. Dams and their puppies up to eight weeks of age are provided with an additional space of 10% per puppy. If two or more adult dogs are kept in one enclosure, the minimum dimensions for the enclosure specified are increased by 1.5 m<sup>2</sup> for each dog kept in the enclosure.

### 1.2.2 Primary Outdoor Enclosure

Outdoor enclosures can be provided as a primary means of containment for breeds suitable to the outdoors that are properly acclimatized to seasonal and regional temperatures.

The general housing principles section (1.2.1) and requirements applies to primary outdoor enclosures.

# RECOMMENDATIONS CONTINUED: TETHERING

- Residential and kenneled domestic animals will not be tethered for longer than a set time of four hours per day [Amherstburg Bylaw 2012-104 (2015-123 Amended) section 3.18 currently states 10 hours].
- No person shall keep any animal in the City tethered on a chain, rope or similar restraining device of less than three meters in length and no more than 10% of the animal's body weight.
- Every person who has tethered an animal shall ensure, at all times, that the animal has unrestricted movement within the range of the tether, and that the animal cannot suffer injury resulting from the tether.
- A person who has tethered an animal shall ensure that the animal is tethered in a manner that constrains the animal to the property to which the animal is tethered.
- No person shall keep an animal tethered where a choke collar, choke chain, pronged collar or any similar device forms part of the tether.
- No animal will be kept outdoors during extreme weather conditions.
- During extreme heat and cold, residential, and kenneled domestic animals will have access to relief in indoor temperaturecontrolled areas.
- It will not be permitted to keep domestic kenneled animals in standalone structures that do not have access to interior temperature-controlled facilities on the premises
- While on a tether the animal will have access to fresh water and food that is free from the elements and free from being disturbed by the tether.

# RECOMMENDATIONS CONTINUED: ANIMALS IN VEHICLES

- The Owner of an animal shall not leave an animal unattended in a motor vehicle if the weather conditions are not suitable for containment of an animal;
- A Police Officer who has reasonable grounds to believe that an animal left unattended in a motor vehicle is in imminent physical danger may take steps to remove the animal from the vehicle and shall not be held liable for any damage to the vehicle by so doing.

# RECOMMENDATIONS CONTINUED: STANDARDS OF CARE

### (INCLUDING THE CARE OF PUPPIES AND DOGS UNDER THE AGE OF THREE

### **MONTHS)**

- Ensure all puppies are provided the same ethical and physical treatment that dogs receive
- Ensure all puppies have access to their mother and her milk until maturity
- Animals shall be provided with adequate and appropriate amounts food and clean, cool water
- Sufficient grooming shall be performed weekly, or as needed. This shall include coat brushing, trimming of nails, treatment of ear mites, frequent check of sore and infections, and ensuring proper oral hygiene.
- Ensure all animals must be on a flea and tick regime
- Be provided with adequate and appropriate medical attention and the care necessary for its general welfare
- Be transported in a manner that ensures its physical safety and general welfare
- Be provided with an adequate and appropriate resting and sleeping area
- Be provided with adequate and appropriate:
  - Space to allow the dog to exercise and move freely
  - Sanitary conditions
  - Ventilation
  - Light
  - Protection from the elements, including harmful cold and hatemperatures, snow, sleet, heavy winds, and heavy rain

# **RECOMMENDATIONS CONTINUED** LICENCING:









Kennel Licence be at a maximum of 12 tags per calendar year.

Amherstburg By-law 2012-104 (2015-123 Amended) section 4.3 currently states not limited **CKC** Registered

Kennel Inspection by Municipal By-law Inspector or Animal Control Officer and that the Kennel meet the applicable Standards of Care yearly.



### CANADIAN VETERINARIANS' RECOMMENDATIONS

### 1.1.1 Construction

### REQUIREMENTS

- Construct interior walls and partitions of materials that are appropriately treated or coated to be rendered washable, sanitizable, impervious to moisture, smooth, and durable.
- 2. The facility meets local construction requirements including fire safety standards related to relevant local legislation.
- 3. Use only nontoxic materials in places in which dogs have direct contact.
- 4. Interior walls are in good condition, free of sharp edges or other potential causes of injury.
- Walls and fences are sturdy, in good repair, and of sufficient height and small enough gaps to prevent escape.

### RECOMMENDED PRACTICES

- a. Render doors, window frames, and window sashes constructed of wood impervious to moisture and resistant to entry by insects, birds, and animals that may be harmful to the buildings or dogs. Treated wood may be toxic to dogs.
- b. Store combustible materials such as paper, wood chips, etc., in a fire-resistant area.

### 1.1.3 Roofs

### REQUIREMENTS

- Roof coverings fastened to sheathing or directly to the roof joists are laid so as to prevent the entrance of insects, birds, and animals that may be harmful to the buildings or dogs into the facility.
- The roof is covered with suitable materials in order to eliminate leakage and exposure of dogs to adverse weather conditions.

### 1.1.5 Floors

Kennelled dogs are in constant contact with the enclosure floor. It is vital for dog comfort and foot health that the surface provides good traction, safe footing, is kept clean and dry, and is free of hazardous debris or construction. Constant contact with rough surfaces can lead to foot and skin trauma. A variety of surfaces in an enclosure will allow dogs to select the areas they prefer for sleeping, elimination, and play.

### REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Ensure good foot health by constructing solid floors. Wire or slatted flooring is unacceptable. Ensure the floor supports the dog without sagging.
- 2. Construct floors of impervious materials, such as sealed concrete or other materials, which provides a smooth surface that is easy to clean and sanitize.
- 3. Floors are in good repair and with good traction to prevent slipping and injury.
- 4. Drain size is at least 10 cm.
- 5. Drain covers are used and designed to minimize the risk of dog injury.
- 6. Slope floors towards any drain(s) at a minimum pitch of 2.1 cm/m so that the dogs kept in the enclosure do not have continuous or extended contact with any part of the floor which is wet.

### 1.1.2 Temperature

Environmental temperature is managed by ventilation, sunlight, shade, appropriate insulation, and supplementary heating or cooling. Many breeds of dogs tolerate a range of ambient temperatures as long as they are dry, away from harmful drafts, have adequate bedding material, and have had time to adjust to the temperature. Consideration should be given to factors such as breed conformation, age, and overall health.

### REQUIREMENTS

1. Maintain a temperature in the kennel that optimizes dog comfort.

10c to 25c depending on the breed and age of the dog

### 1.1.4 Ceilings

### REQUIREMENTS

- Ceilings are constructed of impervious materials and subject to finishing comparable to those of the walls and partitions.
- Ceilings, walls, and partitions abut tightly, preventing gaps which can lead to entry by insects, birds, and animals that may be harmful to the buildings or dogs.
- Seal and treat corners of ceilings, walls, and partitions to render them completely washable and sanitizable.

### 1.1.7 Humidity

Adequate ventilation including use of air exchangers, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, and fans as appropriate will help control humidity.

Relative humidity levels less than 25% are associated with increased discomfort and drying of the mucous membranes and skin, which can lead to chapping and irritation. High humidity levels can result in condensation within the building structure and on interior or exterior surfaces with the subsequent development of moulds and fungi.<sup>2</sup> When combined with high temperature, high humidity can also increase the risk of heat distress.

### REQUIREMENTS

 Control indoor humidity levels to maintain animal comfort, minimize the risk of transmission of animal disease, prevent damage to the structural integrity of the building and its contents, and prevent Page28nulation of excess moisture that can promote growth of mould.

#### REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Potable unfrozen drinking water is readily accessible indoors and outdoors.
- 2. Water is always kept in clean containers.
- 3. Snow is not a primary source of water.

Dogs benefit from a space of their own where they can feel secure. Dogs can vary in their selection of this space, which will allow a dog to self soothe when stressed and provide a safe place to take a rest after a training or exercise session. At times, a confined structure is best for the safety of the dog and humans. Puppies benefit through separation from their litter for short periods of time to help cope with the eventual separation when they are sold. Providing a high-reward treat in a secure space is one way to encourage this

separation. The length of time they are alone may be gradually increased over time.

#### 3.3.4 Enrichment

Studies have shown that animals raised in an enriched environment are able to learn and retain more information. These animals are also more stable and cope with and recover from frightening or stimulating situations more effectively. The results of positive and varying stimuli in the environment are smarter, and more interactive and trainable dogs.

I am here tonight on behalf of the members of SunParlor R/C Flyers in support of the recommendation that your Manager of Licensing and Enforcement has prepared for you tonight. Although we do support Option #1. We find that this is the best option that will allow our members to fully utilize the hobby experience and not create any unsafe conditions at the field. We usually have members that range from 8 to over 90 years of age, creating a differential utilization of time throughout the day, week and the weekend for retirees, students and for working members. This also falls inline with the other municipalities in the addition of selecting the earliest prohibited no usage time of 8:00PM through 9:00AM, we support this.

As stated in the backgrounder that was read to you today, we have been at this location since 1975, During this time, this site has provided a safe, open location for the enjoyment of flying radio-controlled model airplanes with combustion engines. SPRCF has maintained a perfect safety record and has always been respectful of the Town and its residents. As we had presented back in Jan 2020 to the council, we had created a note for a "No Fly Zone" which has been sent to all members and part of the annual membership package for new and renewing members.

We have a short aerial video that outlines our "Tower field" in relation to any existing neighbors. Here you will see how we have our layout so as to not impede anyone as we are at a far distance from the road and all. Just some facts about the club;

Our member's age range from 8 to 90 years old.

Radio controlled airplanes are a popular activity for retirees, many relocate to the Amherstburg area.

Average number of members in the club is approximately 80 at any given time (86 members for 2019)

Open to everyone and provide free flight training to any member, also provide assisted flights with a buddy box (training radio) to anyone that wishes to enter the hobby without actually purchasing any equipment.

We have a free yearly Open House/Air Show for the Public with Kids gliders "they build and fly" and also a candy drop.

With the recent focus on STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) in our schools. SPRCF provides an option for students to practice these skills in a safe, challenging environment. Good evening, my name is Tom Bateman and I am speaking tonight on behalf of the residents on the 4700 block of the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession North in opposition to the proposed amendments as detailed in the Council report dated February 28 2022.

As Council is aware the residents have significant concerns with the operation of the model airplanes at this site. We are vehemently opposed to the granting of any form of exemption or revision to the existing prohibition as contained in the current By-Law.

The By-Law and its prohibition of the operation of combustible engines was designed and intended to protect residents by allowing them to enjoy their properties free from the noise and nuisance created by the operation of these model airplanes.

The existence of the current prohibition reflects the recognition of these significant negative impacts created by such operations on the residents and provides the appropriate protections.

Residents have the right to enjoy their properties free from the noise and nuisance generated by the operation of these model airplanes. Council has an obligation to protect these rights and to ensure its residents have the ability to live without the significant negative impacts imposed upon them by these model airplanes. Council can best meet its obligations by maintaining the existing prohibition of combustible engines as codified within the existing By-Law.

Any option other than maintaining the full prohibition will deprive the residents of their rights of full enjoyment of their properties.

The options presented to amend the By-Law are not acceptable to the residents as they do not provide the protection of the current prohibition and would be impossible for the Town to appropriately monitor and enforce.

Operations at the site have a poor track record of adherence to the Club's own rules as to hours of operation, noise levels and violations of the "no fly" zones. The residents have no faith whatsoever that any restrictions introduced in an amendment would be followed on site.

The noise and nuisances created by these operations have been tolerated for many years with multiple requests made to the Club to reduce the noise levels and eliminate the operation of the model airplanes off the designated flying field and over adjacent fields, homes and public roads. These requests have not been successful in changing the negative conditions or behaviour of the Club's members.

In recent years the noise levels have increased significantly due to suspected increases in the size and power of the airplanes as well as more frequent and longer distance flights beyond the limits of their field. In addition jet powered units have now been introduced creating incredible levels of noise.

The residents of the 4700 Block of the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession North beseech Council to not approve any amendments to the existing Noise By-Law. Should Council proceed with an amendment the residents are prepared to commence legal proceedings against the Town, property owner and Club based on the nuisance impact they would be subjected to.

RE: Noise By-Law Exemption Request by Sun Parlour RC Flyers

The residents of the 4700 Block of the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession North are vehemently opposed to the granting of any form of exemption to the Town's Noise By-Law in favour of the Sun Parlour RC Flyers model airplane club.

The intended purpose of the bylaw is to protect the Town's residents and landowners from the noise and nuisances created by activities that are prohibited under the bylaw. The operation of these model airplanes are specifically identified under the listing of prohibited sound generating activities in Table 3-1. The operation of these prohibited model airplanes create numerous negative impacts from the constant noise and nuisances that significantly prohibit the residents use and enjoyment of their properties.

The noise and nuisances created by these operations have been tolerated for many years with multiple request made by residents to the Club to reduce the noise levels and eliminate the operation of the model airplanes off the designated flying field and over adjacent fields, homes and public roads. These requests have not been successful in changing the negative conditions or behaviour of the Club's members.

In recent years the noise levels have increased significantly due to suspected increases in the size and power of the airplanes as well as more frequent and longer distant flights beyond the limits of their field. In addition jet powered units are now being flown at the site creating incredible levels of noise. The operation of the planes off their field over adjacent properties created additional safety concerns for the residents.

Throughout the Summer of 2019 multiple requests and discussions took place with representatives of the Club's Executive to attempt to gain compliance with their own internal set of rules, decrease the noise levels generated and eliminate the flights beyond the limits of their field over other people's property for which they do not have permission. These efforts were not successful and did not result in any changes to the conditions that the residents are having to endure.

A formal complaint was made to the Town's By-Law Enforcement Department which upon investigation found the Club's activities to be in direct violation of By-Law 2001-43 as the operation of combustion engine powered model airplanes are specifically prohibited within the Amherstburg Town Limits. The Club was instructed by the By-Law Enforcement Officer to cease the operation of these units immediately. These orders to date have not been fully complied with as airplanes are still periodically being operated at the site. Compliance with the Town's regulations and the Club's own rules regarding issues such as hours of operation and no fly zones has been poor as members appear to not consider these to be binding.

The current operations of the Club have become unbearable for the residents, with noise levels being created so loud that the planes can be heard inside the house with the windows closed. Sound levels of 92 decibels have been recorded two properties away from the field. The noise is generated from early morning ( outside the Club's own approved operating hours ) till dusk seven days a week and can be likened to a gas powered weed whipper or chainsaw running next door all day long. This makes it difficult to enjoy an evening coffee in one's backyard or host a weekend family barbeque while dealing with the constant drone of the plane's engines and flights over the properties.

The residents of the 4700 Block of the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession have indicated their opposition to an exemption by signing the attached petition. Exemptions to a bylaw such as this should only be considered for non-recurring or onetime special events. It is suggested that it would be inappropriate to consider granting an exemption for a continuous activity that is specifically prohibited under the By-Law.

On a final note, the SunParlour RC Flyer Club cannot be considered value added to the Town of Amherstburg as they as an organization do not contribute to the Town's tax base and it is further suspected that the majority of its members are not residents of Amherstburg. The residents have endured the negative impacts created by these model airplanes and are looking for the Town to support them in seeking the ability to enjoy their properties without the noise and nuisances through the enforcement of the existing By-Law.

The residents of the 4700 Block of the 4<sup>th</sup> Concession implore Council to provide its residents with protection from the noise and nuisance created by the operation of these model airplanes as prohibited under By-Law 2002-43 by not granting any form of exemption to the Sun Parlour RC Flyers.

Dear Sir;

We are providing this correspondence as a follow up to our discussions and emails. We understand that upon investigation it was found that the model airplane operation located at 4819 4<sup>th</sup> Concession North is in violation of the Town's noise By-Law and as such they have been instructed that the cease flying combustion engine units at the site. It has been suggested that the Club may wish to request an exemption to the By-Law from Council.

We are formally requesting that we receive prior notice that an application for an exemption has been requested for Council's consideration as it is intended to appear before Council representing the neighbourhood in opposition to the granting of an exemption. Attached to this correspondence you will find a memo of "opposition" signed by the residents in the neighbourhood.

We would additionally request that if an application for exemption is made that it not be scheduled during the period of October 11 to October 22 as we will be out of the Country and unable to attend the Council meeting. This issue as you can appreciate is of paramount importance to ourselves and the neighbourhood and it is imperative that we be allowed to share our concerns with Council so they may understand the magnitude of the issues and the inappropriateness of granting an exemption.

The following background information will highlight the neighborhood concerns related to the violation of the Noise By-Law created by the operation of the model airplanes.

The purpose of the By-Law 2001-43 is to protect residents from noise in order to allow the use and enjoyment of their property without the negative impacts from the constant noise and nuisance created by the model airplane operations. The noise and nuisance has been tolerated for many years with several past requests of the Club to limit the flying of units off their field. In recent years the noise levels have increased significantly due to suspected increasing in size and power of the planes as well as more

frequent and distant flights beyond the limits of their field. Jet powered units are also now being flown at the site creating incredible levels of noise.

Throughout the summer of 2019 multiple requests and discussions took place with representatives of the Club's executives to again gain compliance with their own rules, decrease the noise generated by the planes and eliminate the flights beyond the field limits. We were not successful in gaining resolution to our concerns. The current operation has become unbearable for ourselves and the neighbours prompting the contact with the By-Law Enforcement Office. For example on several occasions units have been operating that generate such significant levels of noise that they can be heard inside the house with the windows closed and sound levels on our property of 92db have been recorded. The noise is generated from early morning till dusk seven days a week and can be likened to a gas powered weed whipper or chainsaw running next door all day long. It makes it difficult to enjoy an evening coffee in the backyard or host a weekend family barbeque while dealing with the constant drone of the plane's engines. Since the order to cease combustion engine operations was issued there has continued to be several instances where those units have been operating.

The residents of the neighbourhood are vehemently opposed to the granting of an exemption to the By-Law and are looking to Council to protect its residents from the noise and nuisance created by the model airplane operations as specifically identified in the By-Law's prohibition.
